Board Meeting

Margaret Miller will be arriving Monday and needs a carousel projector and 3 quilt stands. Those people having these items in their possession will be bringing them to the June 13th general meeting.

Judy Gorrindo will be the back up hostess for Margaret Miller for Jan, Those interested will meet at the Good Earth for dinner at 5:30 p.m. and proceed to the library. Jan took names of those who plan to attend and any change of plans is to be made through her.

For Margaret Miller's workshop Colby Kline will arrange to have some on the signees bring refreshments on the day of the workshop.

The cancellation policy for workshops was clarified and is as follows: If a person can not attend after signing up and paying money then it is their own, not the Guild's, responsibility to find a replacement and obtain the same funds from the replacement. When a name has been placed on a waiting list no money down is required and cost is paid to the Workshop Chairman only when a spot opens or to the person cancelling if funds already changed hands. No children ever at any workshop.

Supplies for the workshop can be obtained at Standard Brands and include 11 x 17 Cross Section paper in an 8 x 8 grid and Triton Tracing Paper No. 80 in the 14 x 17 size.

Carol Boyce passed a flyer with the next four upcoming speakers and asked members to take and post where applicable such as, the Cotton Gallery, Camarillo, Sally's Quilt Quarters, S.L.O. Guild and each members work place. She can provide more if necessary.

## Telephone Committee

Char Schweitzer announced that she is leaving the area and a replacement will be needed.

What to tell members during the calls this month include:

- The block of the month book is ready for sale at \$3.00 for members and \$4.00 for non-members; Sherrie Collins will handle the sale at a separate table at the general meeting.
- the Church next door to the library wants people from the Guild to park in the back of their lot not up next to the building as they have church meeting and need those spaces for their own members.
- Margaret Miller will be the featured speaker and spaces are still available for the workshop. Workshop signups go out two months ahead of time.

- Our own opportunity quilt on display at Marty's kitchen will be on display and more raffle tickets will be sold and available to all.

## Stow House

No Chairman was found. Using information provided by Laurie Ball from last year arrangements were made to have the project continue as a group effort rather than disband it since the Guild made \$100.00 last year at Stow House. Though four 8ft. tables and 12 chairs were rented through Undercover last year it was a consensus that the Guild could get by with card tables and chairs brought by members who plan to attend that day. Zetta Hanna will bring the 8ft. Guild Quilting frame. Sandi Globus suggested the Guild buy a cash box for use at these events and further use by the Hospitality group. This was agreed upon by the group and \$50 in change advanced by the treasurer.

Other items of use during the day are tent stakes, rope, hammer tape, clamps, table cover, flowers, cooler, ~~pins~~ and scissors or staple gun.
