COASTAL QUILTERS MEETING MINUTES

JANUARY 10, 1990

Carol Boyce opened the meeting in the Goleta Library at 7:30 p.m. There were (42) people present.

Carol, as our new president, welcomed everyone to a new year of Coastal Quilters. She made some announcements:

- Our Childhood Memories Challenge quilts will remain on display in the library through the end of January. Those who haven't seen the display were urged to do so and to tell others.
- Carol Ludwick's son, Kevin, was introduced as our new chair-setter.
- Carol called our attention to the new bulletin board, which will be set up every month with fliers of future quilt shows and other items of interest.
- She reminded us to pick up a copy of Coastlines, available at the door.
- We were told that certain committees still need people, and we were urged to help wherever we could.

Committee announcements were made;

- Mary Bursek of the Welcoming committee introduced our guests for the evening: Joan Black, Barbara Ortiz, Phyllis Peterson, and Doris Floyd.
- Our new treasurer, Sandi Globus, reminded us to be sure and pay our 1990 dues at this meeting or the next to ensure being included in the new roster.
- Rebecca Mealey, now handling our newsletter, explained the new format: there will be a monthly single-page bulletin with several longer newsletters throughout the year. This monthly flier will not be mailed unless a person sends Rebecca a SASE.
- Jan Inouye, our Program chairman, told us of upcoming events: February's meeting will be a Silent Auction hosted by Harriet Berk; in March we will have the second set of Hoffman Challenge quilts; Doris Floyd will speak for us in April. She passed fliers explaining our 1990 Challenge which will have a Natural History theme; these quilts will hang in the Goleta Library as they have in years before and will also hang at the Natural History Museum in conjunction with the commemorative quilt and show scheduled for 1991. Quilt California will be a showing of quilts at the UCSB Women's Center from February 5 - March 17.
- Our new refreshment committee is Colby Kline and Cathy Rampton. They thanked tonight's contributors and said they'd be sure to see that we all had a chance to contribute, also.
- Mary Ellen Hopkins' Challenge was explained: She has asked just our guild to participate in this challenge, in which she wants us to use a recognizable amount of her new exclusive fabric in making an arrangement from her It's OK... book using the Log Cabin block. These quilts are due in August, when Mary Ellen will visit us and pick a quilt to be included in her new book. Judy Gorrindo reminded us that It's OK is in our guild library and Carol Boyce said that hers is available also.
- The membership was asked if we wanted to participate in Goleta Valley Days again... there were no dissenting voices. Susan Harter will be handling this as well as our Stow House July 4.

We need to get moving on this right away, so people were urged to get in touch with Susan soon.

-Marge Hall, who is handling this year's Community Project, said that she has been in touch with a Women's Shelter, HeadStart daycare, and the Children's Resource Center - all are interested in quilts from us. She asked us to search out some other good causes so that we might pick one to start work on.

-Norah McMeeking is helping to organize our involvement with the Natural History Museum Quilt and Quilt Show in 1991. She says that there will be a meeting at 7:00 p.m. on January 24 at the museum's McVey house for anyone who is interested in becoming involved with this project; she passed a sign-up sheet.

There will be a Block Design contest through April that is open to anyone; designs must be a 12-inch square suitable for applique. After the blocks are chosen, guild members will do the work.

Our door prizes, a thimble doll from Norah McMeeking and two miniature quilt racks made by Marty Frolli's father, were raffled off and won by Pat Yamada, Jane Manasse, and Marcella Vandemaele. Carol L. and Mary B. of Welcoming say that they are looking for donations and ideas for future door prizes.

Maggie Godwin conducted our Block-of-the-Month raffle; Harriet Berk won all 28 Bright Hopes blocks. She introduced the block for February, Cupid's Arrow. She said that in order to increase involvement in B-o-t-M, she'll be keeping track throughout the year of who submits blocks. Then in January of 1991, she will have a drawing for those who turned in at least 10 of the year's 12 blocks; she doesn't know what the prize will be yet, but promises something good.

We had Show & Tell.

Our evening's program was a collection of slides of the guild activities throughout last year, narrated by Jan Inouye. Thanks go to Zetta Hanna, ~~Carol Boyce~~, and Jan Inouye, who shared those slides with us.

Our next meeting will be February 14, when we will have a Silent Auction.

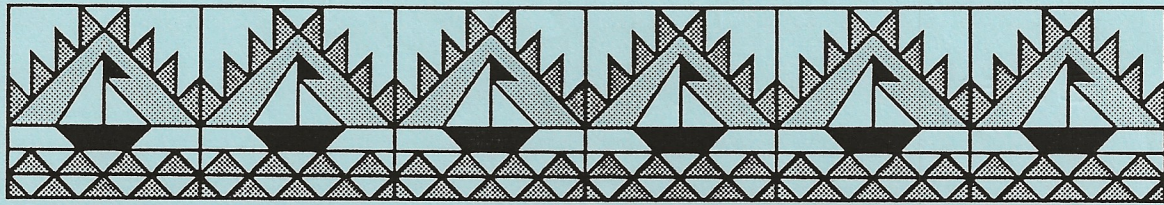
