COASTAL QUILTERS GUILD BOARD MEETING: JUNE 5, 1991

A Guild board meeting to conduct current business was called to order at 7:45 p.m. at the Goleta Library. Present were Carol Boyce, Michele Lyon, Sandi Globus, Pat Yamada, Carol Ludwick, Rebecca Mealey, Zetta Hanna, Suzy Carter, Marjorie Hall, Cathy Rampton, Colby Kline and Gail Tinsley.

Colby passed around a copy of Quilt Encyclopedia, which was received by the Museum after the Quilt Show. Christina Taylor-Godwin has five copies which she will sell to Guild members for \$32. Anyone interested should contact Norah McMeeking. Carol B. will contact Pam Bury to change our meeting time in the library's schedule from 6 p.m. to 7:30, and to give her number as a phone contact. Christina Taylor-Godwin of the Museum Store sold out what she'd ordered for the Quilt Show with the exception of two Baltimore quilt books and two packs of gift wrap, and she's donated them to the Guild. One book will go to the library; the other book and the gift wrap will be used as door prizes. Michele Lyon, our new librarian, would like to purchase two Ginny Beyer videos, one on color and one on piecing. She will look into prices and report back to the Guild.

The speaker at our next meeting, Nancy Whalen, will be staying at Jan Inouye's. Sandy and Zetta will take her to dinner. Zetta will bring a slide projector, and quilt racks will be used for the garment racks Nancy requested. Our next meeting will have the speaker first, then a ten-minute break, then business, with Show and Tell last.

The Phone Committee will remind people about Nancy Whalen's presentation, the Stow House booth July 4, and the Brinkerhoff Fair July 6 and 7 (Jane Manassee has more information). They will also tell people that Rosalind Perry will be selling Quilts Indiana at a discount at the June meeting.

People making announcements at the June meeting include Jan, speaking about workshops, and Denise Clark, who should have tickets and photos for the Opportunity Quilt. Colby will thank people for refreshments, and Susan Cochran will say something about the magazine subscriptions that have gone astray. Sandi will announce the Silent Auction made almost \$250, and that there will be a ~~NO~~ financial wrap-up of the Museum Show <sup>after</sup> after all the bills are paid. Carol B. will say that Katie Pasquini will be here in July; she'll also ask when people want Mary Ellen to come back. Her book comes out in ~~August~~ <sup>June</sup>, but some Guild members will not be here then, so October might be better.

Suzy will look into the feasibility of getting post cards of the Museum Quilt made. ~~Colby~~ <sup>Suzy</sup> suggested that the Guild buy Museum Quilt cards to use for thank-you notes, etc. Suzy will make a motion at the meeting to buy 100 cards, or 10 dozen, or whatever Christina will give us a good rate on. Zetta said that Marie Jorgenson had had her baby, and Suzy will send her a card.
