

## COASTAL QUILTERS GUILD MEETING - JAN. 8, 1992

Barbara Maxwell called the meeting to order at 7:40 p.m. at General Research. There were 112 people present.

### Announcements:

Everyone was urged to enjoy looking at the quilts made for the Ugly Fabric Challenge. The Southern CA. Council of Quilt Guilds meets Saturday, Jan. 18, in Huntington Beach. Flyers for quilt shows are on the front table. All of the people who brought refreshments were thanked.

### Rules for the Fabric Exchange:

Norah McMeeking explained the rules for the fabric exchange. Each person who brought fabric got a number. The first to draw will also get to go last and choose what she wants. Fabric can be "stolen" only twice. You may choose a fabric from the basket or choose from a package already opened.

### Other announcements:

Norah announced that our Feb. program will be Round Robin workshops led by members. March will be Rachel Clark, who does fabric art clothing. We have lost our "chair" boy (Ludwick) and need someone for this. We pay \$20 per meeting to set up the chairs.

Maggie Godwin announced that before we break, she will pass out ballots to vote for the quilt of our choice. She reminded people that the quilts are not ugly, just the fabric is ugly!

Carol Ludwick reported the the guild collected 200 pounds of food for the Food Bank at our December meeting. Do people want to do another Gingers' order? The vote was yes, so we will do this at our March meeting. Membership packets are now available for those people who have paid their dues. Approximately 115 people are paid as of right now! To help them be more easily identified, officers will now wear name cards in a GREEN color. Birthday girls for January are: Nancy Bauerly, Jan Inouye, Jane Manasse, Gail Tinsley, and Pat Ymada.

### Block of the Month:

Doris Floyd conducted a special drawing for those people who participated the most in making the Block of the Month in 1991. Cathy Rampton was the lucky winner of a gift certificate from Betty's Fabrics.

Kathy Doughty reported that 120 blocks (named Exquisite block) had been turned in for tonight's drawing! Members voted to have just one winner instead of splitting the blocks into two quilts. The lucky winner was Carol Ludwick! February's block will be the Indiana Puzzle. Kathy gave some helpful hints on making it.
