

Coastal Quilters Guild August Meeting Minutes  
August 9, 2012

The meeting was called to order by Carol Fay at 7:05. She reminded members to pick up the new directory.

She then introduced Barbara MacCallum who introduced Arlene Stepputat from Visiting Nurse and Hospice Care of Santa Barbara. She told about the organization and what they do. She noted that one of our members is a Hospice nurse. They offer 24-hour support to families of patients who have less than six months to live. They are asking for quilts for those patients. Our community quilts will be for them.

Carol Hart also shared some of the baby cradle sets and said that we are about 50% of the way to our goal.

Volunteers get free admission, although they are encouraged to buy a ticket since this is a fundraiser. She also asked that everyone sell tickets to friends. The ticket is a two-day pass.

Marilyn Osgood has the information for the Boutique including the participant code. She asked that participants see her this evening.

An audience member mentioned the existence of a new shop that has some fabric. She asked that they be given a stack of postcards.

Karen asked that you check your last newsletter for the schedule of events between now and the show.

Carol Rory and Kika Hutchings announced that the next block will be all scrappy. This month's blocks were won by Mary Ballard.

The opportunity Quilt was shown to great applause.

Show and tell was followed by a 15 minute break and then Patty Six introduced the speakers, Roberta Horton and Mary Machuta.

Carol thanked the speakers and adjourned the meeting at 8:50.
