- Welcome and Reminder to mute phones and devices.
- Road to California bus trip – we committed to the bus and have sent the deposit. We have 20 people signed up, it holds 47 and need 43 people to break even. Sat, Jan 20<sup>th</sup>. The first stop will be at the old Sears building, you can park your car there all day.
