

Notice the double pins.
Remember to leave an opening to turn the streamer right side out. (Marked by double pins.)
Notice the double pins
Fold the streamer rightsides together matching the cut edges. Pin



1/4" seam allowance, backstitch at starts and stops. Leave about 12" opening for turning rightside out.



Trim corners and points to ensure a neat result when streamer is turned and pressed.



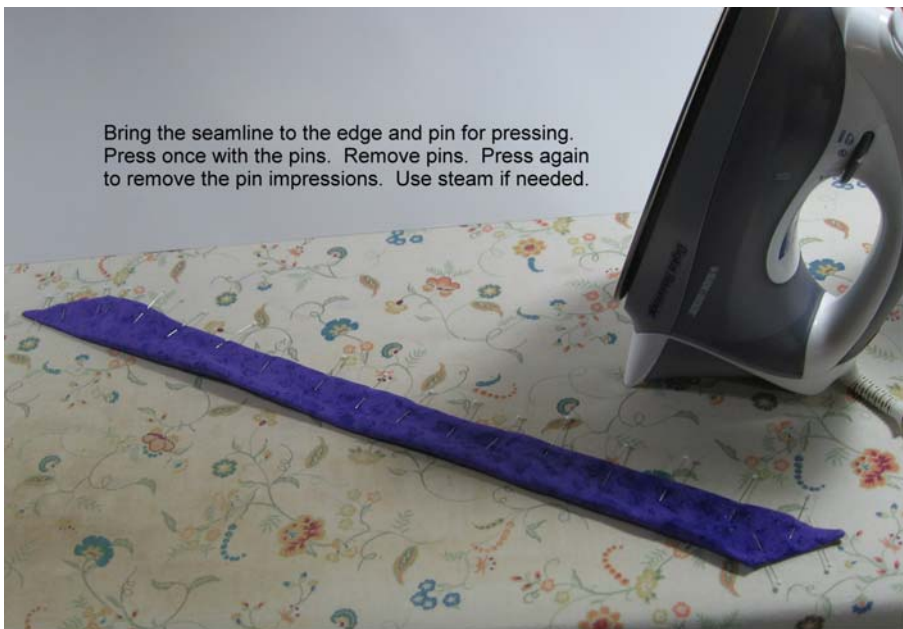
HINT for helping bring THE SEAMLINE TO THE EDGE after turning rightside out - fingerpress the seam allowance open BEFORE turning rightside out, even fingerpress the short pointed tips.



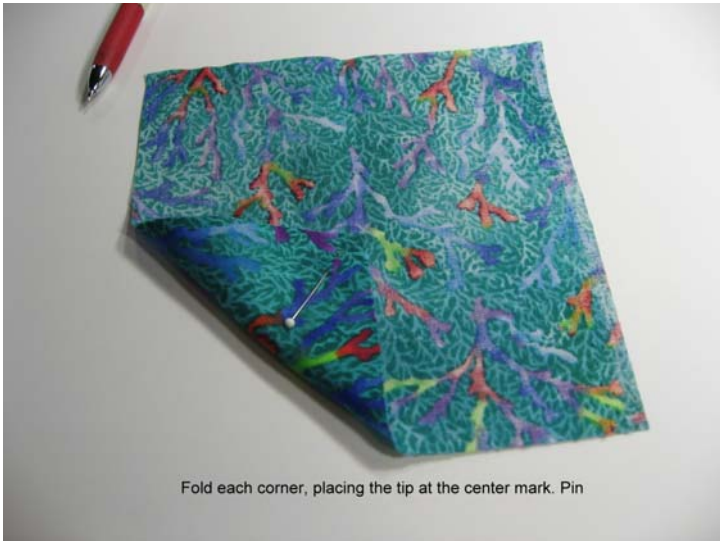
Fingerpressing the seam allowances OPEN prior to turning the streamer. Helpful for tidy attractive finished edges.



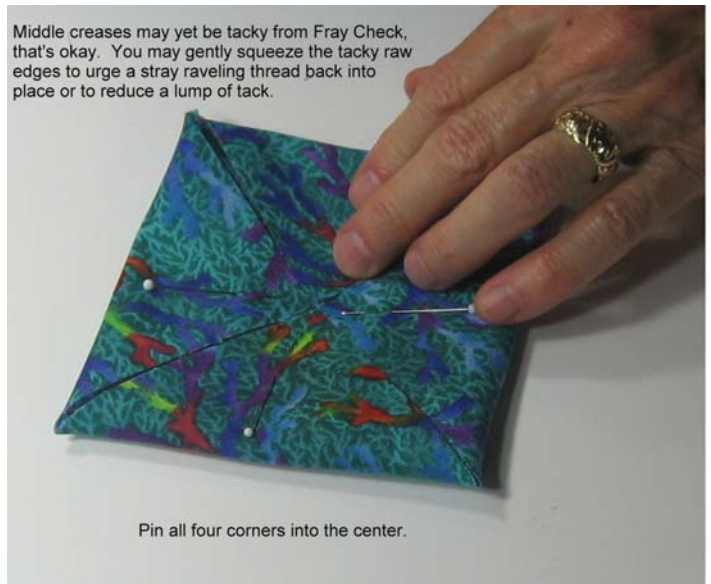
Fingerpress open the seam allowance for the turning opening also.



Now, back to the rosettes, the inner first

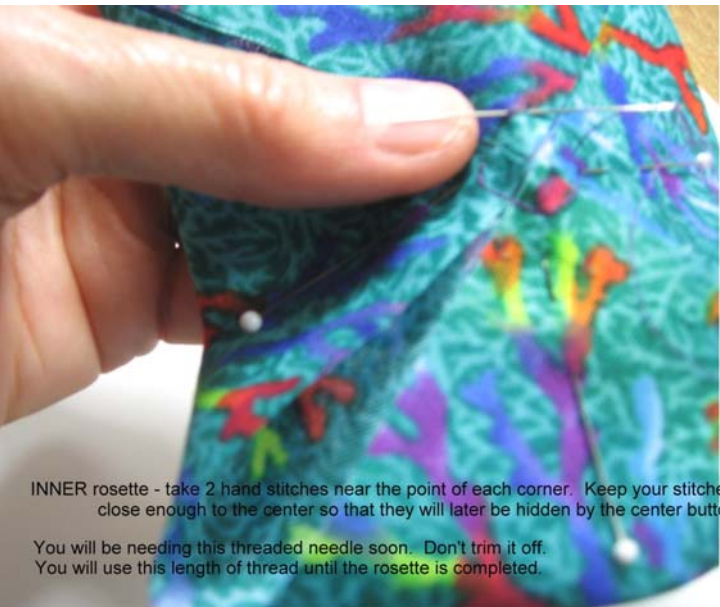


Fold each corner, placing the tip at the center mark. Pin



Middle creases may yet be tacky from Fray Check, that's okay. You may gently squeeze the tacky raw edges to urge a stray raveling thread back into place or to reduce a lump of tack.

Pin all four corners into the center.



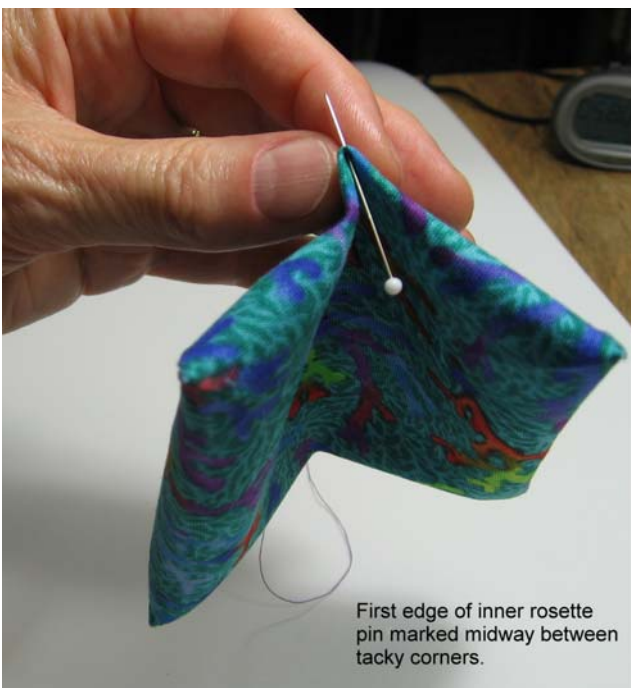
INNER rosette - take 2 hand stitches near the point of each corner. Keep your stitches close enough to the center so that they will later be hidden by the center button.

You will be needing this threaded needle soon. Don't trim it off. You will use this length of thread until the rosette is completed.

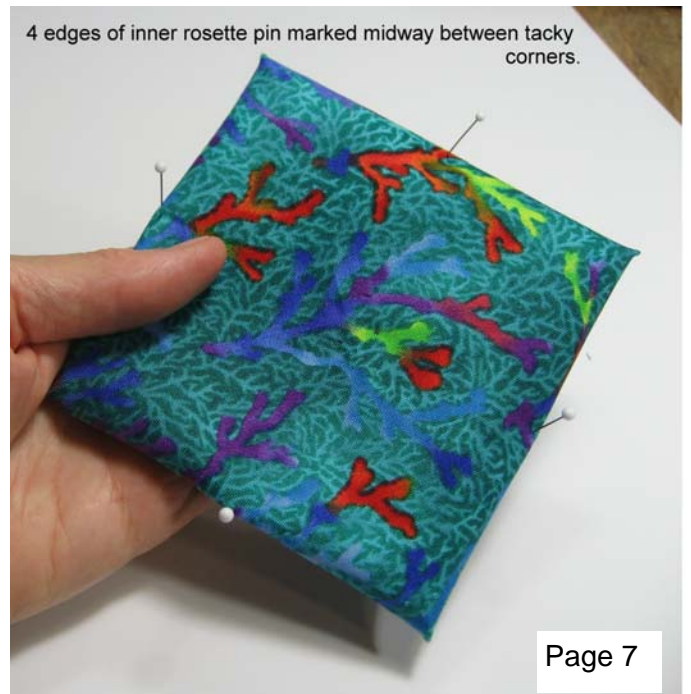


Now the petals will be formed.

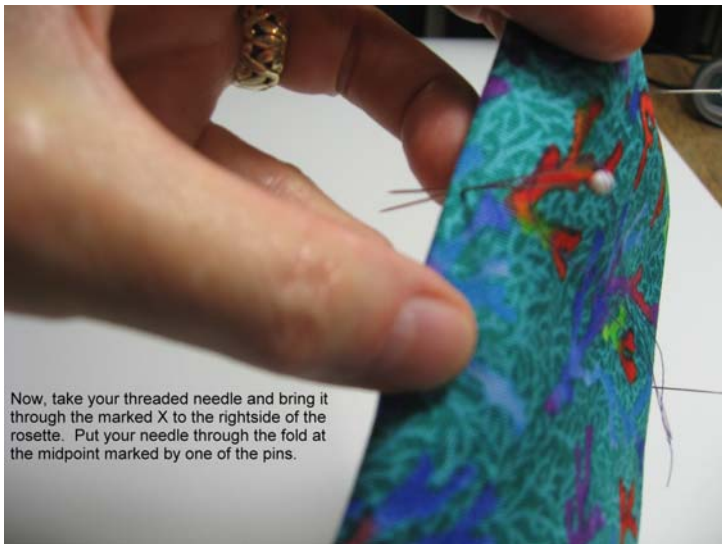
Rightsides together (The stitched down corners are in back.) bring both tacky corners from one folded edge together (close it like a book) so that you can mark the middle of this fold with a pin (at the spine of the of the book). Open up the developing rosette and repeat procedure until all 4 of the rosette's edge's have been pin marked midway from the tacky corners.



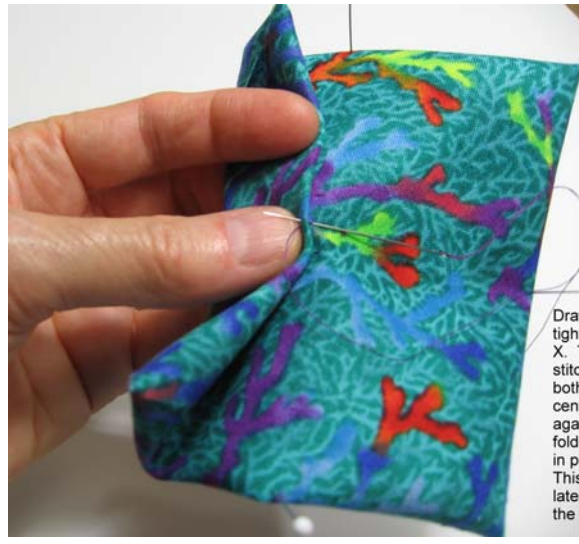
First edge of inner rosette pin marked midway between tacky corners.



4 edges of inner rosette pin marked midway between tacky corners.



Now, take your threaded needle and bring it through the marked X to the rightside of the rosette. Put your needle through the fold at the midpoint marked by one of the pins.



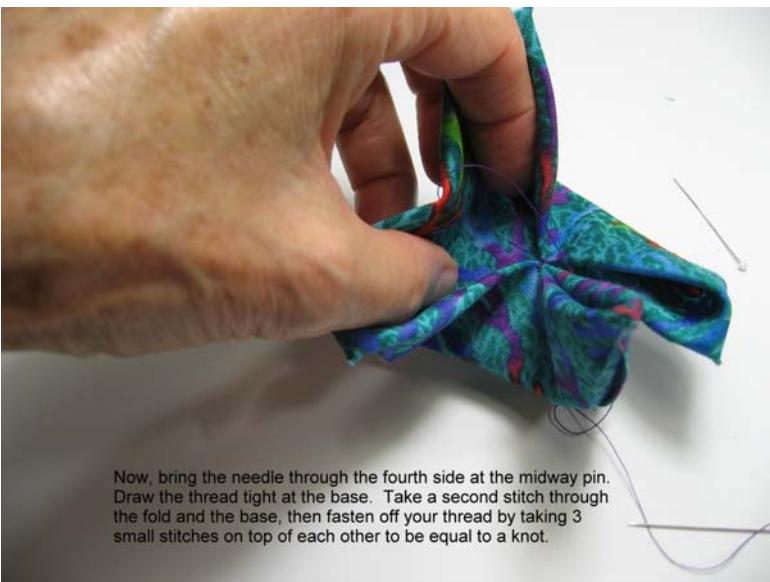
Draw this thread tight to the center X. Take a second stitch through both the rosette's center and the fold again, to hold the fold more securely in place at the center. This stitching will later be covered by the center button.



Repeat. Tack the opposite edge at the pinned midpoint to the rosette's center with 2 stitches. Be sure to catch in the fabric at the X underneath the folds.



It's getting a bit crowded, but take a stitch at the third midpoint pin, bring it to the center. Fasten with 2 stitches.



Now, bring the needle through the fourth side at the midway pin. Draw the thread tight at the base. Take a second stitch through the fold and the base, then fasten off your thread by taking 3 small stitches on top of each other to be equal to a knot.



Take each of the 4 "folded edges", one at a time, and gently fold over the outer 1/3 to form a "petal".
