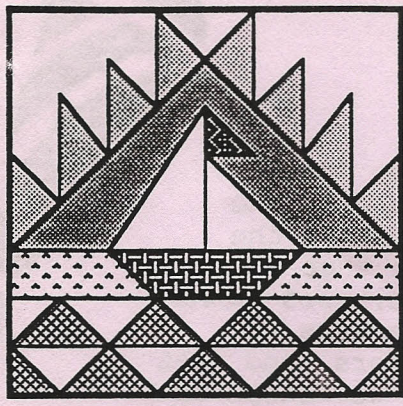

Next Month -- Judy Mathieson and Patchwork Pictures

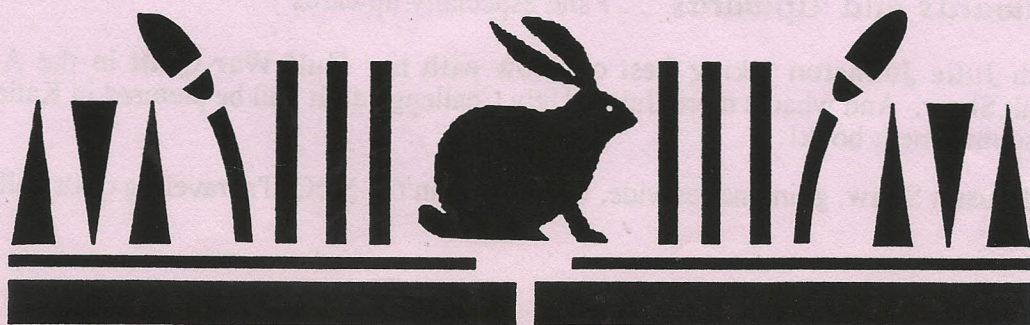
Our speaker for May will be Judy Mathieson, who is making her second visit to our Guild. This popular quilter, teacher and author is from Woodland Hills, but her name and her quilts are known far and wide. Her quilts were part of the Quilt National shows of 1979, 1981, and 1987. She appears in an interview on Georgia Bonesteel's Public Television series "Lap Quilting." Her work appears regularly in Quilter's Newsletter Magazine and twice has appeared on the cover. She lectures and conducts workshops throughout the U.S. and in Canada and Japan.

On Wednesday, May 13, Judy will share with us her technique of combining squares and triangles in a grid to make patchwork pictures of almost any "close-up" subject such as animals, flowers, still lifes, and even people. With this method, all quilts can be unique personal statements.

Judy's workshop will follow on Thursday, when Guild members will have the opportunity to learn Judy's technique and put it into practice while she is on hand to offer tips and advice. The Patchwork Pictures workshop promises to be as popular as the Friendship Fans workshop Judy presented here in 1990. Dear Quilter,


The \$15 annual dues paid by each member of our Guild actually covers very little of the cost of running the group. In fact, if you will look at our budget in the January issue of the newsletter, you will see that the cost of photocopying the newsletter and mailing it, uses up ALL the \$15 dues. In order to hire speakers, teachers for workshops, rent a post office box, print rosters, and meet other expenses we must raise money. So far, workshops are self-supporting, but do not make a great deal of money. That is why it is so important for all of us to support those efforts that generate income for the Guild -- such as tonight's silent auction, the making of the opportunity quilt and the selling of tickets for it, and the donations we make for door prize tickets at each meeting.

It costs about \$4 per person present at the meeting to pay an outside speaker. We all know how much our knowledge and appreciation of quilting is enhanced by these exciting events. We need to raise about \$250 per month to keep this Guild healthy and active. If you have any ideas and suggestions about how to do this, they are most welcome.

In these difficult economic times, we will be careful to spend the Guild's money wisely, but we need your help in presenting informative, entertaining programs that are inexpensive. That probably means we will be asking you to pitch in some time during the year to help with Stow House or Brinkerhoff on the 4th of July, Goleta Valley Days, or another Round Robin. Our goal is to keep the Guild active, accessible, and affordable for all our members. But the realities are that we all have to help in the effort.

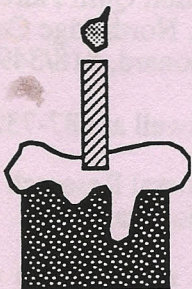

The Comfort Zone meets the last Wednesday evening of the month and is still open to new members. A great group! For information call Rebecca Mealey, 966-1429.

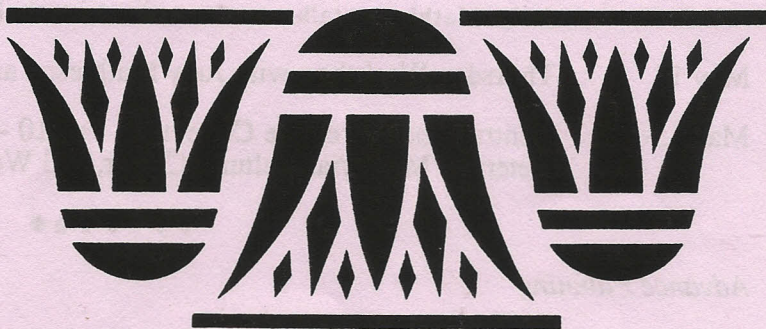

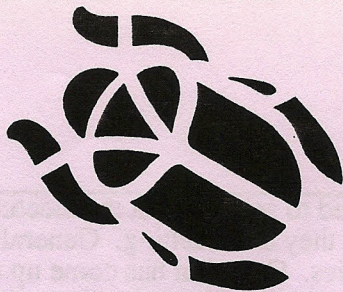

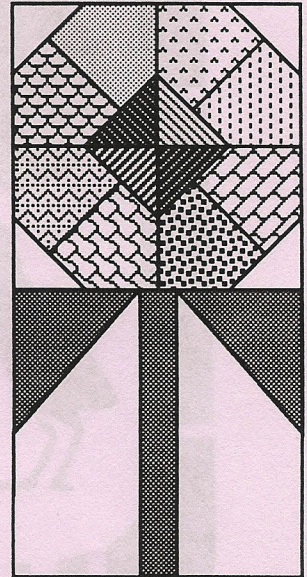
April Scraps Bring May Flowers

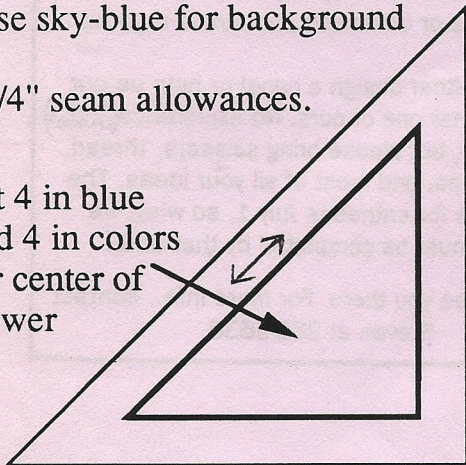


Final block is 6"x12", without seams

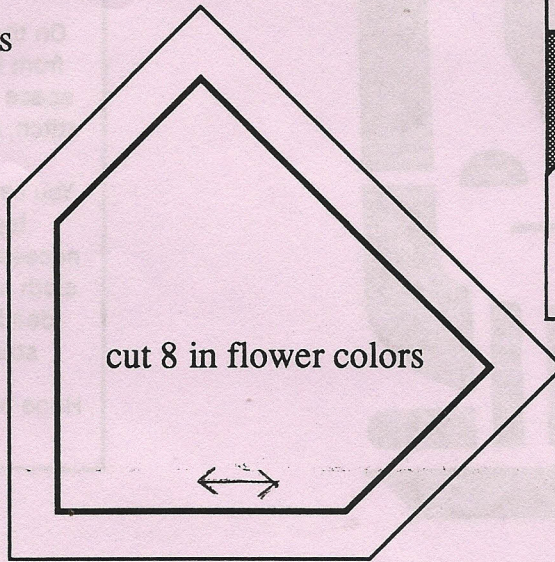
*use sky-blue for background

*1/4" seam allowances.

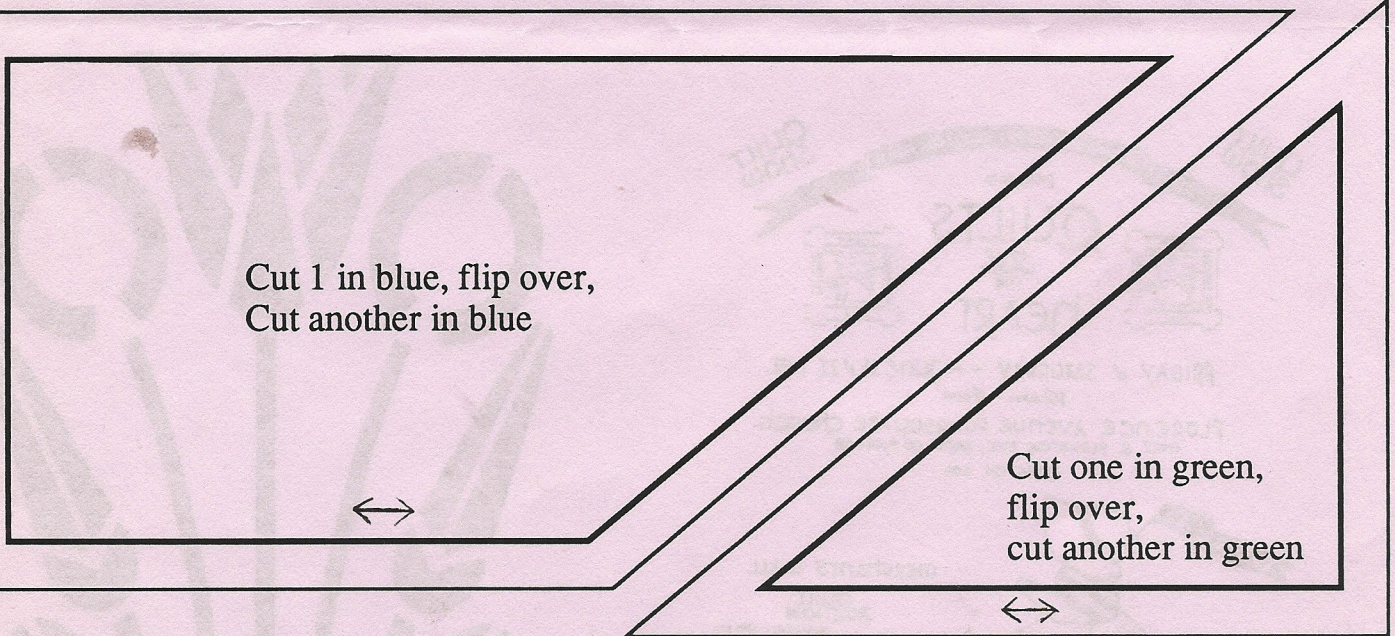
cut 4 in blue

cut 8 in flower colors

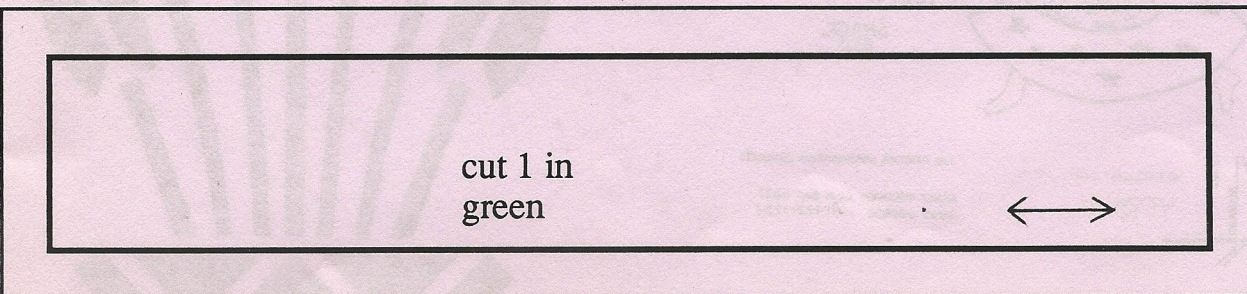


Cut 1 in blue, flip over,
