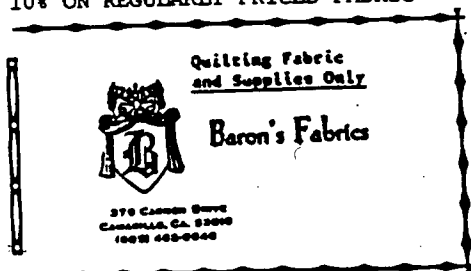

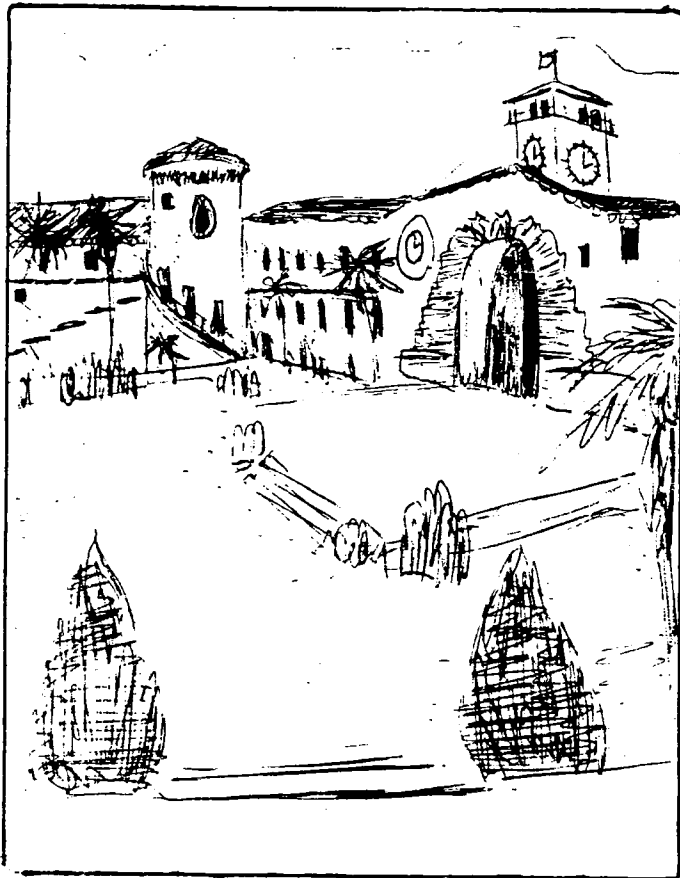

 Hoofmaker and hoof moisturizer: nail strengthener, hand softener.

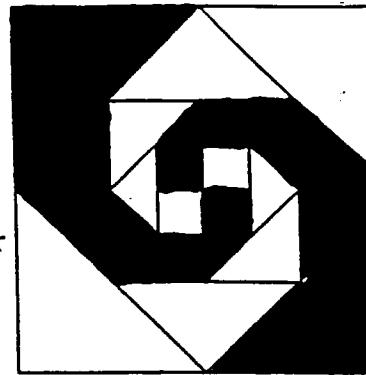

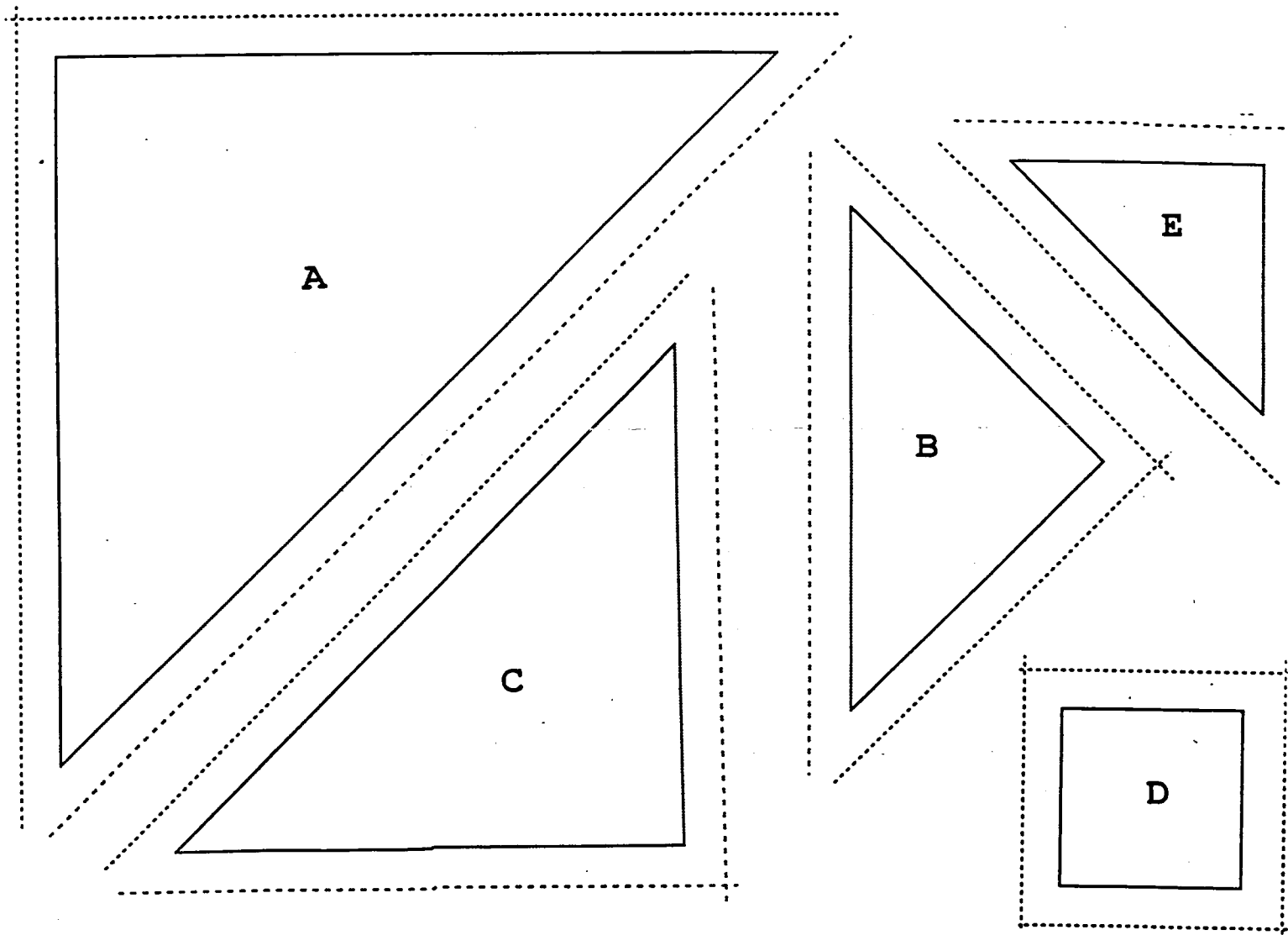
BLOCK OF THE MONTH



SNAIL'S TRAIL

From each pattern piece (A, B, C, D & E) cut two from white-on-white (or near white on near white). Use a variety of prints.

From each pattern piece (A, B, C, D & E) cut two from printed fabric that is predominately black (preferably black with white, grey or beige, not with "colors"). Use a variety of prints. Vary the scale as much as possible.



Sewing: start from the center of the block by sewing a "black" "D" to a "white" "D". Repeat with the second pair. Following the diagram, add the additional pieces, working in a clock-wise direction.
