# Harvest of Colors 2004

Coastal Quilters Guild Members' Showcase October 9-10, 2004

Ith the last big push at the August meeting we now have many nice quilts for the October Showcase. All "first choice" quilts will be exhibited, while second and third choices will be selected by the design committee, depending on space available. At the end of September or early October, before the show. you will be contacted regarding the delivery and pickup of your quilt entry. At the time of submission, you will sign a "liability release" form and a receipt. You are responsible for providing your own insurance to cover your quilt(s). Remember that your quilt must be clean, and "show ready" in a pillowcase or cloth bag, with a 4" hanging sleeve, when you deliver it to the collector. If you are having your quilt judged, please cover the label with a piece of muslin tacked over it.

## Pacific international QUILT FESTIVAL BUS TRIP

Last chance to make reservations for the overnight bus trip to Santa Clara on Oct. 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>! We will be staying at the Hilton, across the street from the quilt show. The cost is \$166 for double occupancy and \$226 for a single.

The Pacific International Quilt Festival, as BIG, BOLD and BEAUTI-FUL as ever, is now in its 2<sup>nd</sup> decade. The Festival is the largest Quilt Festival on the West Coast. Over 700 quilts and garments will be on display throughout the Festival's four days. PIQF also features a Merchants Mall of approximately 160 vendors offering machines, quilts, textiles, quilting supplies, books, sewing related craft items, kits, clothing and much more.

With the Olympics over, it is time for me to get down to business and:


- Finish the binding on my challenge quilt

### QUILT SHOW VOLUNTEER SIGN-UPS CONTINUE!

At the August Guild meeting, members began signing up for Quilt Show jobs. There are still a number of volunteer opportunities available, so please sign up at the September meeting if you have not already done so. Experience the fun and satisfaction of being an important part of the show! Marilyn Martin will be at the door in September, ready to help you find the volunteer position perfect for you.

Acquisitions: About 7-10 days before the show, collectors are needed to collect an assigned number of quilts. They must bring those quilts to the judging session the Thursday before the show and take the quilts to Earl Warren on Friday to be hung. Volunteers also are needed to help re-distribute the quilts at the end of the show on Sunday afternoon. *Contact Kristin Otte* (683-4390).

Admission Sales: During the show, these volunteers will sit at a table at the show entrance and sell admission wristbands. *Contact Cynthia Manzer* (687-0657).

**Education**: During the show, these volunteers will assist visitors with the Education activity and answer questions. *Contact Oleta Bennett (964-2114)*.

Featured Artist: During the show, volunteers are needed to sit in the display area and sell books. Other volunteers will be "white glovers" (see below). They will need to be familiar with Velda Newman's work. *Contact Susan West (962-3650)*.

Floaters: During the show, these volunteers will assist the Show Chair and Vendor Committee and fill in where needed. They may be on their feet for approximately 2 hours. *Contact Cynthia Manzer* (687-0657).

**Information Table**: During the show, these volunteers will sit and provide information about the Guild and answer questions. *Contact Cynthia Manzer* (687-0657).


**Security**: During the show, these volunteers will sit at the side or back doors. *Contact Cynthia Manzer* (687-0657).

# Adult Ed Quilt Classes

Fall 2004

Wake Center, 300 N. Turnpike Rd, Santa Barbara

Patchwork and Quilting: Seasonal Wall Hangings Weds., Sept. 15, 6:30 pm - 9:30 pm (10 weeks)

Instructor: Karen Pickford

In this class for beginner and intermediate quilters, you will learn a variety of applique and basic machine piecing techniques. Combine these with seasonal designs and the result is several wall quilts to decorate your home or give as gifts. Use patterns inspired by fall leaves, spring flowers, etc. or create your own design for a custom quilt.

Patchwork and Quilting: Using Japanese Fabrics-

Mon., Sept. 13th, 9 am - Noon (10 weeks)

Instructor: Kristin Otte

This class will emphasize projects that make the best use of Japanese fabrics. We will survey the history and types of fabric available; present design principles that give an Asian accent to quilting; and cover unique methods of construction such as "Pine Bark," hexagons and folded techniques. Both piecing and applique projects will be presented. Whether you already have an extensive collection of fabrics, or want to see where your pieces fit in, this class will send you in a new quilting direction.

Beginning Quiltmaking

Tues., Sept. 14, 9 am - Noon (10 weeks)

Instructor: Marty Frolli

A course for those who have never quilted and those who want to sharpen their basic skills. Learn the fundamentals of quiltmaking while constructing a small sampler quilt. Covers traditional and contemporary techniques of piecing, applique, and quilting.

Quilter's Workshop

Tues., Sept. 14, 1 - 4 pm (10 weeks)

Instructor: Marty Frolli

Enjoy three hours of uninterrupted quilting bliss! Join friends in this non-structured class to complete projects from other quilting classes. Take advantage of the large tables to baste quilts or use the Bernina machines to do some machine quilting.

Intermediate Quiltmaking

Thurs., Sept. 16, 9 am - Noon (10 weeks)

Instructor: Marty Frolli

A continuing course for those who have taken Beginning Quiltmaking or the equivalent. Focus will be placed on drafting and piecing intricate traditional blocks while constructing a stunning sampler quilt. Enhance the beauty of your quilt by adding an elegant border print. Templates and instructions will be given for several classic patterns, along with various setting alternatives.
















#### October Block of the Month

#### Maple leaf Block

Finished Block Size: 12"
Unfinished Block Size: 12-1/2"

#### Fabric Selection:

Background: Solid Black

Leaf: Any autumn leaf color you wish in a solid, print, or batik?

#### Cutting:

From black fabric cut: two 5" squares and two 4-1/2" squares.

From leaf fabric cut: two 5" squares, and four 4-1/2" squares.

#### Assembly:

This block requires four 4-1/2" half-square triangles which are made by using one black and one leaf color 5" square, right sides together, line drawn from corner to corner and sewn 1/4" on either side of the drawn line and cut apart on the solid drawn line. Square half-square triangles to measure 4-1/2" square.

To make the stem unit, place template "N" on opposite corners of one of the 4-1/2" black squares and cut two triangle pieces.

Using one of the leaf color 4-1/2" squares, right side facing up, place template "M" on the square aligning with opposite corners. Use the template to draw placement lines on the 4-1/2" leaf color square. With right side of Template "N" facing the right side of the marked 4-1/2" leaf color square, align each triangle base with the drawn line. Sew 1/4" seam, Trim excess leaf color fabric, flip and press.

Please refer to the block diagram for the correct orientation of the half-square triangles and other units.

Assemble the first row of the block using the remaining black 4-1/2" square, and two half-square triangles.

Assemble row two using one half-square triangle and two 4-1/2" leaf fabric squares.

Assemble row three using a half-square triangle, one 4-1/2" leaf fabric square and the stem unit.

Sew rows 1, 2, & 3 together to complete the block

A big thank you to those who have already turned in their quilts! As of the August meeting, we have 42.


The quilts will be presented to the Unity Shoppe at the November meeting. It's time to get going! Join the fun and help the Guild in its outreach project.


