

COMMUNITY QUILTS

Thank you to all who have complimented us on the new kits for Transition House. We aim to please--so, please come back and check up on (and check out) the gorgeous fabrics included in these kits.

Transition House is a community-sponsored effort toward helping FAMILIES get a new start toward self-sufficiency. Since these families come to Transition House with little worldly goods, it is our mission to provide them not only with the physical comfort of quilts, but with the caring that goes into every quilt we make. We have endeavored to include kits for all ages and both genders. For those of you who will use your own fabrics, the sky's the limit.

Each room at Transition House is furnished with only bunk beds, so the quilt size is really a large lap-size—or a small twin size (at least 60" x 78".) We will have some batting available, but if you are going to purchase your own, may we suggest batting which has a quilting range from 8" to 12." Less struggling with the quilting needed!

Some of you have requested patterns, and we will endeavor to provide some inspiration for you.

We look forward to seeing your lovely work in the months to come.

October Blocks of the Month: AVOCADOS and LEMONS

Use your favorite method of appliqué to make a lemon and/or avocado block for October's famous festivals. If you use freezer paper or fusible web paper, you will need to reverse the patterns – or you can copy them directly, with the final design going in the opposite direction (it won't really matter, as long as you know where to put your pieces).

Cut your background pieces 7 – 7 ½" and the winner

can trim them to 6 1/2".

For machine appliqué, use a satin stitch to stitch around all pieces using a thread color that matches the pieces. For the center of the lemon, you can use light yellow to go around the segments and the white background piece.



Avocado

- » Background: Light yellow print*
- » #1 & 2: dark green
- » #3: light avocado green
- » #4: brown

For background fabrics, think of a pastel colored tablecloth – perhaps a floral or check.




Page 7 September 2007

If you're not sure exactly what shade to use, just slice open a fresh lemon or avocado!

Lemon

- » Background: Light blue print*
- » #1 & 2: bright lemon yellow
- » #3: white
- » #4-7: light yellow
