## JUNE 2008 CHALLENGE—THE FOUR SEASONS

1. Use the phrase "The Four Seasons" as your inspiration and take off from there.
2. Your creation must be a quilt: two layers of cloth enclosing a third layer, held together by a stitched design. Embellish it any way you like.
3. You must use at least three different colors in your piece, using lights and darks so that there will be at least seven gradations in the final project. If you want to use additional colors, that's great.
4. Your quilt may be as small as you wish. It should not exceed 72 inches along any one side, and its total outside measurement must be 144 inches or less. The finished piece may be any shape.
5. Submit one entry per person or group .
6. Label your quilt. Include your name, the name of the quilt (if you give it one), and perhaps something about your inspiration and/or the techniques you used.
7. Attach a four-inch hanging sleeve.

Remember, this year the Challenge is in June.

## March Block of the Month: Collection Jar

This is a fun block that uses novelty print fabric.
Select your favorite "collection" fabric of bugs, food, toys, etc.

It will be hard to make just one!
All seams $1 / 4$ "
Novelty print fabric: (jar body)
$8^{1 / 2 "} \times 5^{1 / 2 "}$ rectangle
Background fabric: white or med/light green. Make sure this is not a busy print or it will conflict with the jar contents.

6-1 $1 / 2$ " squares
2-1 $1 / 2$ " $\times 71 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips
2-1 $1 / 2 " \times 91 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips
Jar lid: gold, silver, or brown fabric
$1^{1 / 2 "} \times 31 / 2 "$ strip

## Instructions:



1. Draw a diagonal line on 4 of the $11 / 2$ " background squares
2. Place squares on corners of jar body right sides together as shown. Stitch along drawn line and press. You may trim seam if desired.
3. Sew remaining $11 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares to either end of the jar lid strip. Press
4. Sew jar lid to jar body
5. Sew $91 / 2$ " background strips to sides of jar, press
6. Sew $71 / 2$ " background strips to top and bottom, press
