### 2008 GUILD CHALLENGE: THE FOUR SEASONS

- 1. Use the phrase "The Four Seasons" as your inspiration and take off from there.
- 2. Your creation must be a quilt: two layers of cloth enclosing a third layer, held together by a stitched design. Embellish it any way you like.
- 3. You must include at least three different colors in your piece, using multiple lights and darks so that there will be at least seven variations of those colors in the final project. If you want to add more colors, that's fine.
- 4. Your quilt may be as small as you wish. It should not exceed 72 inches along any one side, and its total outside measurement must be 144 inches or less. The finished piece may be any shape.
- 5. Submit only one entry per person or group.
- 6. Label your quilt. Include your name, the name of the quilt (if you give it one), and perhaps something about your inspiration and/or the techniques you used.
- 7. Attach a four-inch hanging sleeve.

Remember, this year the Challenge is in June.

### June Block of the Month: Friendship Star

This BOM pattern is a member favorite, most recently appearing in October 2002 while Marcia Moore was the BOM chair.

Finished Block Size: 6" x 6" Unfinished Block Size: 6.5" x 6.5"

#### **Cutting:**

Refer to Figure 1 for placement.

From the background (white) cut:

- Four 2.5" squares
- Two 3" squares

From the star fabric (color) cut:

- One 2.5" squares
- Two 3" squares

#### Piecing directions:

1. Start by making 4 half-square triangles from the 3-inch squares of the background and star fabrics. See *Figure 2*. Press towards the darker fabric. Trim these to 2.5" square.

2. Assemble the block as shown in Figure 1. Make sure that all of the "points" are facing in the same direction as you go in a circle around the center square.

## Supplies Needed:

- *Background fabric:* White, white-on-white, off-white. beige, ecru, etc.
- *Star Fabric*: solid or "reads-as-solids," i.e. marbles, patterns that look solid at a distance. Any color.


