#### Organizing Tip of the Month:

from Juli Shulem, Professional Organizer

You ever find you have 'little bits' of fabrics you could possibly use again for something, but don't know how to store them? Of course you do! We all do. Tip: Try using gallon size zip-lock plastic bags and group your 'bits' by color (one bag with all the greens, etc.). Use this for any size smaller than a quarter yard or fat quarter. I then keep all these baggies in a decent size plastic container with lid entitled "Bits of Scraps" and whenever I need a little bit of a particular color –it takes seconds to go through that one bag and find what I need. It is also very easy to put pieces away using this method, because isn't putting those bits away the hardest part of all?


## **Block of the Month**

#### **Shape for August: Triangles!**

The theme for this year's blocks is Geometrics. Each month will feature a different geometric shape. There are simple and consistent guidelines for the entire year, so you can stock up on fabric and use your creativity in the pattern, design and size you choose. You could make two blocks each month, and submit one, and by the end of the year, you will have your own geometric beauty, not to mention all the ones you won during the year!

The shape for AUGUST is TRIANGLES: This can be one large triangle, triangles in patterns (think flying GEESE), or triangles in stars, or pinwheels. Use your imagination. You can do a simple design, use a known pattern, or create a triangle square that will make all of us go OOOH and AAAAH! It's up to you. As of this writing, we haven't seen your squares yet, so we're really holding our breath and waiting to see what you come up with. Above all, HAVE FUN!

#### WEARABLES

So your quilt is finished, and you have three months remaining until the quilt show. How about making a wearable to display this year?!? What-----you don't have a guilt made and there's not enough time to make one? Well, there's plenty of time to make a wearable. Try it! You might like it!

There will be entry forms available on the table at the rear of the room on Guild night. Any questions--call Joann Conklin.

#### **Guidelines:**

1. You may choose *any size block* as small as 4 inches square (finished), up to 16 inches square (finished) as long as the finished size is divisible by two (4x4, 6x6, 8x8, etc.). Don't forget to build in your seam allowances-the working block would be one-half inch bigger than the finished block. Right? The fun of this guideline will be for you to figure out how to put together different-sized blocks into an interesting and cohesive design. It's a challenge!

2. All blocks must have black borders - preferably at least one inch wide. If you use a pattern with a background, make that background color black as well. The border and background can be pure black, or black-on-black fabric.

3. No large or busy prints - think Batiks, Bali prints, brights, tone-on-tone, jewel tones, primary colors, whatever you think will look great.

4. While there will be **no specific pattern**, we will supply you with tips, samples, and ideas of what you can do for the SHAPE of the month.


5. No other SHAPE can be in the block for the month. So if the block is "squares" be sure you don't make triangles or rectangles somehow, too. Of course, we will not drum you out of the corps if somehow, in your unique and completely creative design, there just happens to be another geometric shape-if you look at it sideways. On alternate Tuesdays. In a mirror. Upside down. Got it?
