### From Darilyn's Desk:

This month marks the end of another successful year for our Guild. I'm excited to share our accomplishments from July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2009. However, before I do so, I would like to acknowledge and thank all of you – the members – for making our Guild so strong and dynamic. I would also like to thank our incredibly talented and creative board for making our Guild a very special organization. And to all those of you who have served on our committees or volunteered in many different ways, thank you for the tireless support you have provided at all of our events and activities. By the way, you don't have to wait a year to get involved. You are encouraged to join a committee at anytime. A list of committee chairs can be found in each newsletter and the Member Directory.

#### **Budget**

A year end report would not be complete without at least a brief discussion of our financial health. I'm pleased to report that our Guild is in excellent financial shape. This year we collected a total of \$33,642 with only \$25,691 in expenditures (as of June 18th). Therefore, we will carry forward a surplus of approximately \$7,900. As many of you know this "carry forward" surplus helps us cover our expenses during non-show years. Congratulations to all for a job well done.

#### Membership

In July 2008, the board set a goal for recruiting 50 new members by the end of the year. As of this writing, the new member count is 46! I'd like to extend a heartfelt welcome to each of our new members. You are now part of a thriving organization with 283 active members. Congratulations to all who helped make our recruiting effort a success. New members are now greeted with a CQG tote bag, information on Guild history and current activities and a free door prize raffle ticket. They are invited to quarterly New Member Welcome Coffees to meet other members, ask questions about the Guild, and talk quilting.





### FABRIC:




DARK BROWN -Cut one 4 1/2" square (A)

### "A Quilted Calendar" is a summer

SUNFLOWER

sunflower. So grab your scraps and bring one made in the suggested colors to Guild but don't forget to make a spare for your own Quilted Calendar!



Block of the Month - August 2009

August brings sunflowers blowing in

warm summer breezes. The second

installment of the Block of the Month -

BEIGE -Cut four 3" squares (F) Cut eight 2 1/2" squares (G)

MEDIUM BROWN -Cut eight 3" squares (D & E) Cut four 2 1/2" squares (H)

GREEN -Cut four 2 1/2" squares (I)

#### ASSEMBLY:

Create the (A-B) center unit by drawing a diagonal line on the wrong side of the (B) squares. Place on each corner of (A) and sew across on the diagonal line of (B). Trim 1/4" away from stitching line and press.

Create the (C-D) and (E-F) half-square triangle ("HST") units by drawing a diagonal line on the wrong side of the (C) and (F) squares. With (C-D) fabrics right sides together, stitch 1/4" from both sides of diagonal line. Cut apart on drawn line. Press 4 HST units to gold and 4 to brown. Trim to 2 1/2" square. Repeat for (E-F) fabrics, but press 4 to brown and 4 to beige. Pair two (C-D) HST units and sew together following the diagram. Repeat for the (E-F) HST units. Press these seams in opposing directions. Sew a paired (C-D) HST unit to a paired (E-F) HST unit following the diagram.

Create the four patch corner units by sewing (G-I) and (H-G) squares together. Sew the paired units together following the diagram.

Sew two HST units to each side of the center unit following the diagram. Sew a four patch unit to each side of the remaining HST units following the diagram.

Complete the block as indicated. Block should measure 12 1/2" square.
