Our special December speaker is Joe Cunningham, quilter and musician extraordinaire. Joe began making quilts professionally in 1979, after a ten-year career as a musician in Michigan. His early mentors were steeped in the history and traditions of quilts, leading Cunningham to a life of study in quilt history and a love of traditional technique. Over the years his work has evolved into a unique personal style both original and shaped by the tradition. Cunningham travels throughout the country to give lectures and workshops on quilt making. He has two new books coming out with AQS in 2010, one on men who make quilts and one on his own life and work. He has been seen on the HGTV series "Simply Quilts with Alex Anderson," as well as "The Quilt Show" with Ricky Tims and Alex Anderson. Joe will perform his original show, "Joe the Quilter," a musical tribute to a real-life quilter from England.

Plus we'll have the regular activities; Treasure Table; Door Prizes; Workshop/Bus Trip sign-ups; Community Quilts; Block-of-the-Month; Library; and Show & Tell.

The big finale to the evening... (drum roll please).... is the drawing of the Opportunity Quilt winning ticket!

## **Holiday Donation**

Please join other Guild members in donating a new pair or package of socks and/or underwear to the Women's Free Health Clinic at our December Guild meeting. The WFHC is for homeless women who sleep at one of the shelters in town or live on the streets. The clinic meets at Transition House every other Friday morning from 9am to 1pm and provides services performed by doctors, nurses, social workers, and Planned Parenthood. The women can take showers, wash their clothes, receive a donation of new socks and underwear, toiletries, a warm meal, and have a safe, warm place to relax for the morning. About 20 women ranging in age from about 18 to mid-60's attend each clinic, and there are some regulars who have attended since the clinic opened last December. The WFHC very much needs new underwear and socks of all sizes, so please remember this as you do your holiday shopping. ## **Handy Tip is Tried and True!**

Have you been frustrated when your washer's agitator turns YOUR new fabric into a tangled wet mess, only to have the tangle repeated in your dryer – making ironing a chore? Well, RELAX! Barb Postma shared this great tip with us at November's Guild meeting – I gave it a try and was amazed at the results:

Match up the fabric's "selvage" edges, just like you would do when adjusting the fabric for strip cutting with a rotary blade. Using safety pins (the large number 2 size works great), pin the selvages together about every 10 to 12 inches. Wash and dry your fabric as usual. When you pull it out of the dryer the fabric will NOT be tangled up, and contain a lot fewer wrinkles, too. You'll still need to iron the fabric smooth, but it will be SO much easier and faster!

Thanks, Barb, for this fantastic tip -- I'll remember you every time I wash fabric from now on!

## **Sharing Good Tidings with Our Community**

Throughout the year Coastal Quilters Guild receives a wide variety of inquiries from local groups and agencies, soliciting our help with special projects to benefit people in need in our community. Many times we can answer this call by donating goods, such as our ongoing canned and boxed food collection to benefit the local Food Bank, or through the expression of our own creativity, as evidenced in our annual "Community Quilts" projects like this year's Hospice and Fostering Friends programs. We also make annual monetary donations of \$250.00 to the Marie Webster Quilters Hall of Fame in Marion, Indiana and \$500.00 to the Children's Creative Project, by sponsoring a square at the I Madonnari event held at the Old Mission in Santa Barbara every Memorial Day weekend.

The nation's economy has been hard-hit this past year and nearly everyone has found the need to adjust their spending habits to cope with these changes. Even in our somewhat affluent local community, many more individuals and families have found themselves struggling with their financial limitations and their resulting despair, realizing that they may never be able to improve their living conditions.

Over the last several months the Board has seriously discussed how we as a Guild can further make a difference in our community. As a result, several worthy agencies and local non-profits have been considered. At November's meeting the Board unanimously resolved to make the following monetary donations:

**\$2,500.00** to *St. Andrews Presbyterian Church*, earmarked towards their capital improvement plans for the meeting hall to upgrade lighting and install fans to provide better air circulation. The church has provided a wonderful long-term solution that serves the Guild's meeting and storage needs at an extremely reasonable monthly rate. With this "Thank You" gift earmarked for specific purposes, the Guild will also benefit from these long-term improvements.

- **\$ 500.00** to *Goleta Valley Community Center*, earmarked towards facility improvements. The Guild has regularly used the Center for a variety of reasons at a very reasonable rental fee.
- **\$1,500.00** to the *Unity Shoppe* for its year-round distribution needs. Donated funds are used to purchase wholesale close-out merchandise so that better and more products can be added to their inventory. For example, this donation will sponsor clothing, gifts and groceries for SIX families of four. Their "free" store is stocked with baby items, preschool gifts, girls' and boys' toys, radios, watches, as well as children's clothing, books, art and school supplies. More than 288 non-profit organizations, social service agencies, churches, schools and hospitals refer over 19,000 people yearly for food, clothing and basic necessities, including over 8,800 children.
- **\$ 250.00** to the *Women's Free Health Clinic of Santa Barbara* to assist with their ongoing financial needs, in addition to our holiday donations of underwear and socks collected at the November and December Guild meetings.
- \$ 250.00 to Habitat for Humanity of Southern Santa Barbara County to assist in providing opportunities for low income families to buy and own simple, decent, affordable homes. For example, this donation could help buy a front door, or two windows plus three gallons of paint. Their most recently completed project on Via Lucero provided three homes for twelve deserving people, including seven children. Their newest project on San Pascual Street, still in the funding and final approval stages, will consist of three 2-bedroom, 1.5-bath homes, and one 1-bedroom, 1-bath home, together providing permanent, stable homes for four families

## **Hoover Pockets, Potholders, and Postage Stamp Maple Leaves**

Karin Cooper introduced me to the term "Hoover Pockets", a Great Depression saying that meant President Hoover had emptied your pockets and you might as well turn them inside out. A Recession/ Depression Quilt might have some possibilities for the Challenge this year. Remember the famous Depression quilt called "Prosperity is Just Around the Corner" by Fannie Shaw? It's in The Twentieth Century's Best American Quilts, and its 30 blocks show people peeking around the corner to see if Prosperity is really coming. Maybe you are the one to immortalize the troubling times we have today-with your Challenge quilt.

Marty Frolli was making some pot holders in her Friday Workshop, and of course we all had to see the pattern. For those who know how to make them, remember that they have four little pockets. Your Challenge quilt could be as large as one of these potholders, or other potholders that have pockets for your fingers.

I like small blocks, and ran across some little maple leaf blocks I had begun making some years ago--from 1" squares. Maple leaf blocks are quite pretty when they're so small. I'm wondering if

I can build a Challenge quilt around them. Many block patterns might be adaptable to the 1" size. Think about it.

Refiguring my idea of a Challenge quilt made up of six 1" blocks, I really do come out with 10" around the outside. That gives room for a tiny pocket to be sewed on.

TAKE A MONTH OFF!!

December is for families, friends, and frenzy. Let the Challenge rest for awhile and enjoy all the quirks and foibles of your friends and families, even the disapproving mother-in-law and your sister who can't cook or wash a dish either.





# Block of the Month for January





## FABRIC:



BLUE -

Cut five 3 1/2" squares (A & C)

Cut eight 2" squares (D)

Cut one 2" x 9" strip (G)

Cut one 2" x 18" strip (G)



WHITE -

Cut eight 2" squares (B)

Cut four 2" x 3 1/2" rectangles (E)

Cut two 2" x 9" strips (F)

Cut two 2" x 18" strips (F)

## SNOW CRYSTALS

## Block of the Month - January 2010

January brings snowflakes falling gently and ice crystals forming on window panes... oh, who are we kidding, in Santa Barbara?! Well, the next best thing then is to imagine what it'd be like and go to our stash to make our own. The seventh installment in our "9uilted Calendar" Block of the Month is an imaginary snowflake block. Since all snowflakes are unique, you get to choose the shade of blue - just imagine what the wall will look like at the next Guild meeting! But don't forget to make a spare for your own Quilted Calendar.

## ASSEMBLY:

With the 9" (F) & (G) strips, sew the (F-G-F) section together as indicated. Press seams inward to the blue. Subcut into four 2" units.

Repeat with the 18" strips, sewing the (F-F-G) section together as indicated. Press seams outward. Subcut into eight 2" units.

Make four of the nine patch units following the diagram.

Create the (B-C) units by drawing diagonal lines on wrong side of each (B) square. Place one (B) square on corner of one (C) square, aligning the outer edges and with diagonal line pointing in toward the edge center, sew on the line. Trim to 1/4" and press open. Repeat with second (B) square placed on adjoining corner of (C) - be sure to check placement of diagonal line (it should intersect first seam). Make four (B-C) units.

Create (D-E) units similar to the (B-C) units but drawing diagonal lines on wrong side of each (D) square. Place one (D) square on end of (E) rectangle, aligning outer edges and with diagonal line pointing in toward the edge center, sew on the line. Trim to 1/4" and press open. Repeat with second (D) square placed on opposite side of (E) checking for placement of diagonal line. Make four (D-E) units.

Join (B-C) and (D-E) units as indicated. With remaining (A) square complete the block as indicated. Block should measure 12 1/2" square.
