## Welcome Art Quilter Yvonne Porcella



Yvonne Porcella began making unique garments, wall hangings and guilts in 1962. Her work is currently featured in major exhibitions, art galleries and museums. Her work is a lively expression of an artist who knows how to handle color with an apparently endless palette. She hand paints fabrics to achieve subtle or vibrant effects using pure color in contrasting and synchronous relationships. Yvonne's book titles are: Five Ethnic Patterns, Plus Five, Pieced Clothing, Pieced Clothing Variations, A Colorful Book, Colors Changing Hue, Six Color World, Yvonne Porcella: Art & Inspirations, and Magical 4-Patch and 9-Patch. She has taught and lectured throughout the U.S., Canada, Australia, Europe and Japan. The Smithsonian Institute has shown her quilt "Takoage" and it was also included in a national touring exhibition. In 1998 she was inducted into the Quilters Hall of Fame and was the 5th recipient of the Silver Star Award at Quilt Festival in Houston, Texas. Yvonne's personal artistic concern is to maintain balance within a unique composition while producing visually pleasurable

works. She uses traditional geometric piecing and strives for innovation and new perspectives. Her work features machine piecing in conjunction with hand applique and hand guilting.

## Around the Block: With "The Sew It Alls"

The "Sew It Alls" satellite group held its first meeting in June 2005, formed from the Guild's waiting list of members hoping to join a satellite group. They meet on the first Thursday of each month, usually in the evening, but have expanded into some daytime workshops or dinner-included gatherings. With their present membership numbering 18, they usually rotate hosting in their homes. Rarely has everyone been present for a single meeting, so space has never been a problem for the hostess.

The Sew It Alls's format has always been spontaneous. In their very first year they hosted the Guild's "Block of the Month", which gave them a purpose AND kept them busy at meetings! Often the hostess will choose a scenario for the meeting, but generally they gather simply to enjoy each other's company and work on their own projects. "Show and Tell" among the members is a popular activity, and requesting feedback, on either a question or concern regarding an ongoing project, always yields helpful advice. They learn more about each other all of the time, as well as each other's special talents and motivations.

One group member, Darilyn Kisch, related some of their other "group" activities, including: Sharing "quilting tips and tricks", a showing of their "first" quilts, game nights, a 1st Thursday outing in Santa Barbara visiting galleries and sampling food, a relaxing evening at one member's home overlooking Rincon Point and watching the moon rise – and even an overnight "pajama party!"

Satellite group members DO tend to form long and lasting friendships. Member Carol Hart says, "Speaking for myself, I knew so few guild members when I joined in 2005... the opportunity to mix and chat can be so limited at guild meetings with the variety of things to do (Block of the Month, Community Projects, Workshops, free table, library books, door prizes, and guest speaker samples) that I welcomed an opportunity to get to know more quilters on a personal level. I've found being a member of a satellite group has been a wonderful experience, and encourage other guild members to consider joining one if they haven't already."

## These Games Are A "Win-Win"

What? There are fun computer games that can actually help you improve yourself AND help others at the same time? "Impossible!" you say? Just check out the "Free Rice" games at *http://www.freerice.com* 

FreeRice was founded in 1997 by John Breen who donated his non-profit site to the United Nations World Food Program in March 2009. Their two goals are (1) to provide education to everyone for free and (2) help end world hunger by providing rice to hungry people for free.

How does it work? For every "correct" answer to various multiple choice questions, ten grains of rice are donated to their fund. Ten grains of rice may seem like a small amount to you, but while you are "playing", so are thousands of other people around the world at the same time. Collectively you all make a difference.

How do you play? It's simple: Click on the "Subjects" link near the top right of the page to view a list of all subjects available. Select from math, science, geography, art history, other languages and more. There are levels appropriate for beginners and levels that will challenge the most knowledgeable players. FreeRice automatically adjusts to your level as you play, advancing when you answer three questions correctly in a row, and reversing when you get one wrong. This one-to-three ratio keeps you at the outer range of your skills where learning takes place.

How does playing actually help you? Playing the vocabulary game can have huge benefits. For example, it can help you formulate your ideas better, write better papers, emails and business letters, speak more precisely and persuasively, comprehend more of what you read, read faster, perform better and be more effective and successful at your job.

Do you have children or grandchildren? This can be a great boon for students who are struggling with their studies in school. They will not only gain increased confidence in their abilities, but also have fun doing it... and at the same time know they are helping many people in need, too. They can also "keep score" to see how much their donations have accumulated over time.

A word of caution: These games can be very addictive.... But in a VERY good way!





## FABRIC:



WHITE -Cut two 4" squares (A) Cut twelve 1 3/4" squares (E) Cut three 3" squares (F)

RED, PINK or LAVENDER Cut three 4" x 6 1/2" rectangles (C) Cut three 3" x 4" rectangles (D)

## FLUTTERING HEARTS

## Block of the Month - February 2010

Hearts are a flutter in the eighth installment of our "Quilted Calendar" Block of the Month. The pinwheel is white and a color of your choice. For the hearts, choose a variety of red, pink or lavender from your stash and make each heart unique or make them all the same - it's whatever your heart's desire is this month! Bring one to Guild but don't forget to make a spare for your own quilted Calendar.

## COLOR OF YOUR CHOICE -Cut two 4" squares (B)

## ASSEMBLY:

PINWHEEL (make one) -

Create four (A-B) half-square triangle ("HST") units by drawing a diagonal line on the wrong side of the (B) squares. With (A-B) squares right sides together, stitch 1/4" from both sides of diagonal line. Cut apart on drawn line, press open. Trim to 3 1/2" square.

Complete the pinwheel as indicated, block should measure 6 1/2" square.

HEART (make three) -

Draw drawing diagonal lines on the wrong side of each (E) square.

To make the (C-E) units, position two (E) squares on one 4" side of each (C) rectangle, right sides together and stitch on diagonal line. Trim 1/4" away from stitching line, press open.

Repeat for the (D-E) units by positioning two (E) squares on one 4" side of each (D) rectangle, right sides together and stitch on diagonal line. Trim 1/4" away from stitching line, press open.

With remaining (F) squares, join (C-E) and (D-E) units together as indicated. Heart blocks should measure 6 1/2" square.

Complete entire block as indicated, block should measure 12 1/2" square.
