

Time MARCHes on: the "Challenge"

By now many of us have either completed our entries for September's Harvest of Colors Show or are nearly done. Before you pick up a UFO or dig into your stash pondering what quilt project to work on next, keep a time slot open because the March 2011 Challenge will be announced at August's meeting! Past "Challenges" have been sponsored by an individual or two. This year the Sew It All's satellite group will host. We feel that our defining criteria will inspire wide participation for a fun and imaginative show on Challenge Night.

New members may wonder what the "Challenge" is. For many years it has been an annual tradition to dedicate one of our monthly meetings to exhibit the talents of our members in the stimulating format of a challenge. A theme with certain parameters is presented that challenges members to adhere to the "rules" while creating their entry. The variety of techniques and clever interpretations revealed in the Show make this evening, when guests are invited for free, very popular. Challenge entry signage is anonymous. All attending members receive a ballot to choose their favorites. The votes are tallied during the meeting. Quilters identities are revealed when they parade before us, entry in hand, concluding with the awards presentation. Two public displays follow. The first venue is usually at one of our dedicated local quilting resources where the Challenge entries are shown for the next month, and returned at the following guild meeting. Also the biannual Harvest of Colors hangs the last two years of Challenges as a special attraction at the show.

Subsequent guild newsletters will list the guidelines. The Sew It All's will be available at meetings to answer any questions. Seven months from now your unique inspirations will kick off another Coastal Quilters Challenge. Until then, happy quilting!

Ouilt Show News

We're nearing the end of our journey – the Quilt Show is just around the corner! The Quilt Show committee has been working hard to ensure that we have a fabulous show this year, but they can't do it alone. Remember that this is our only major fund raiser this year, and the proceeds support Guild activities over the course of the next two years. At this stage all of the pieces are falling into place, but we still need **Quilt Entries**, **Volunteers**, and **Attendees**.

Quilt Entries

The Entry form for all show items (quilts, wearables, home décor, and Challenge quilts) is due August 12th – our next Guild meeting. As of our last planning meeting, there were only 30+ entries! Hopefully, like me, you will be turning in your forms and photos at the last minute. This is a "Member's Showcase" and we want entries from as many members as possible. It doesn't have to be your latest creation (if you can't get it done in time) – the main rule is that it has not been in a previous Harvest of Colors show.

Volunteers

The volunteer sign-up sheets will be available at the next two Guild meetings and we encourage you to sign up for more than one shift, if possible. Boutique participants have a separate sign-up sheet, and this does not count toward your free admission to the show. There are also many opportunities to help that are not listed on the sign-up sheets. We need people to set up displays around town, hang posters, deliver posters and bookmarks to distant quilt shops (especially north county and SLO county) and a variety of other things. Please email me if you can help!

Attendees

Last, but certainly not least, we need people to come to our show. Please spread the word at every available opportunity. Now is the time for people to begin marking their calendars. And so that they don't change their minds at the last minute and not show up, we are encouraging people to buy tickets in advance, and save \$2. Collect money from your friends and purchase their tickets for them at the next two Guild meetings (August and September). And if your budget allows, please consider purchasing your own ticket in advance, even if you are volunteering to help with the show. Remember, the proceeds help the Guild bring you all of the fun activities and amazing speakers we enjoy throughout the year.

Once again, I'd like to thank my committee for doing a spectacular job of pulling this show together. Now, I've got to get back to finishing my quilts for the show!

Around the Block: With "The Sew Whats"

A guild satellite group calling themselves "The Sew Whats" formed in the mid 1990's, mostly from members attending one of Marty Frolli's adult education classes in Santa Barbara. Many of the students would go for coffee after class at Howard Johnson's, and the group formed as a result of those friendly coffee klatches. Over the years the group has steadily maintained a membership of 10 to 15 members.

While the group does not have a specific joint interest or focus, they will gather up their energy and work on a specific project, then relax and recuperate with each member working at their own pace. This year they have made pillowcases and quilts for the Guild's community projects and currently are working on table runners to be sold through the gift boutique at our September quilt show, with all proceeds being donated to the Guild. And when you admire the beautifully crafted fabric prize ribbons awarded to the winning quilts at the 2010 show, you can thank group member Joann Conklin for her wonderful talents!

The Sew Whats have always been active participants in the Guild when help was needed. Many of its members have held Board positions, including Betty Kelley and Diane Eardley serving as Guild Presidents, as well as committee leadership roles, such as our current 2010 Quilt Show Chairperson, Karen Pickford.

Last year the group assisted co-chairs Jean MacMillan and Judith Nybakken with details for the Challenge night program "Pockets and Postage Stamps", as well as the April 1st presentation of challenge quilts at the "First Thursday" showing at Grant House Sewing Machines in Santa Barbara. Member Jean MacMillan quipped "In January we tried to make everyone healthy and thin with our lighter Guild meeting refreshments, but it went over like a bomb – it caused later groups to make even MORE good treats for their refreshments, much to everyone's delight!"

The Sew Whats have made THREE guild opportunity quilts, under the direction of Karen Pickford and Joann Conklin, and for many years volunteered their time selling tickets at various venues where the opportunity quilts were displayed. Their most recent opportunity quilt creation was the 2008 "Tuscan Gold" (who can forget those beautiful feathered designs quilted into the alternate blocks?). Another was the 2002 "Freedom" quilt with red, white and blue stars and stripes.

Over the past year the group has presented two wearable art shows in Carpinteria, chaired by Nola Ferguson, and they are planning another showing in Santa Barbara.

When asked what she finds special about her satellite group, Jean MacMillan said: "Our real blessing has been the friendship and fellowship we have shared with one another over the years. Whether celebrating or recuperating, filled with energy or overwhelmed by circumstance, joyful or sad, we have been there for each other like patches in a giant quilt. And THAT is priceless!"

Fabric strips needed for Education Booth at Quilt Show

We are looking for donations for the upcoming Quilt Show in September. At the Show, we will provide fabric strips so children and adults may design a quilt block that will be a finished size 9 ½. It will then be sewn and put on a display "hall of fame" wall during the show. After the show the blocks will be assembled into twin quilts that will be auctioned off at our annual Live Auction in August of 2011. The proceeds from those quilts will be donated to a charity.

We would appreciate:

- 1. Strips pre cut to 2 ½" x 4 ½" size from any BRIGHT COLOR scraps you have, i.e. polka dots, stripes, children's bright prints, batiks, etc. Please package them in bundles of the same print with a safety pin. If you do not have time to cut them into this size just bring your BRIGHT SCRAPS.
- 2. White and Black fabric prints cut into 2"x11" strips or 2"x44" strips will be especially appreciated. (Small motifs if possible)
- 3. 10 inch squares of batting any kind!
- 4. Thread of any color.



Block of the Month for September

SCRAP INSANITY: LOG CABIN

The third installment of Scrap Insanity is a version of the Log Cabin. This is a very simple block of squares and strips with several wonderful secondary patterns. Check out the photos on the website for a few ideas.

There are 16 pieces in the block. The block will finish to 12 1/2" square.



FABRIC:



Background: white and/or cream, you will need 5 different fabrics.



Scraps: you will need 5 different fabrics. This block will look best using a variety of medium and dark fabrics.



Black: Please use solid black or black tone-ontone fabrics (not black and white).

CUTTING:

From the background fabrics AND your scraps, cut 1 of each of the following: $2 \frac{1}{2}$ square, $2 \frac{1}{2}$ x $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle, $2 \frac{1}{2}$ x $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle, $2 \frac{1}{2}$ x $8 \frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle, and $2 \frac{1}{2}$ x $10 \frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle.

From the black fabric, cut 6 - 2 1/2" squares.

ASSEMBLY:

The rows go together as follows:

	Background	Black	Scrap
Row 1:	10 ½"	2 ½"	
Row 2:	8 ½"	2 ½"	2 ½"
Row 3:	6 ½"	2 ½"	4 1/2"
Row 4:	4 1/2"	2 ½"	6 ½"
Row 5:	2 ½"	2 ½"	8 ½"
Row 6:		2 ½"	10 ½"

Connect the rows together horizontally as shown in the picture above.

If you have any problems with the block, we are here to help.
