### A Message from the Board

Several Coastal Quilters members have asked Board members if the Guild has to shut down due to lack of a president. We have looked into this and have been told that whether we continue as an organization or not is totally dependent on our By-Laws and not on state or federal organizations.

At a special meeting of the elected Board of the Coastal Quilters Guild of Santa Barbara & Goleta on June 28, 2010, it was voted that the nine elected officers would act as copresidents sharing the responsibilities and duties of the presidency until such time as a president is elected. This is in accordance with Section 41 of the By-Laws of the Guild which state that "In the absence or disability of the president, the vice president(s) ... shall perform all duties of the president..."

For the last five months, your elected officers have been sharing the president's duties. In addition, some of these tasks have been permanently assigned to officers and committee chair positions, where appropriate, in an attempt to simplify the president's responsibilities. We do not, however, plan to do this forever and have recently heard that there is at least one member, possibly more, who would like to become president. To this end, we are taking nominations up until the November meeting and will be holding a special election at the December meeting. ### March 2011 Challenge "All Creatures Great and Small"

- Whether or not an animal is depicted, at least ONE
   IDENTIFIABLE (non-human) ANIMAL amphibians, birds,
   fish, insects, invertebrates, or mammals, etc.) OR ANIMAL
   FEATURE PRINT (animal fur, reptile skin, animal paw,
   etc.) FABRIC must be included in the entry. This fabric may
   be used dominantly or with subtlety.
- ANY HANDMADE CREATION which includes SOME QUILTING is acceptable. Some suggestions:
  - Wall hangings: restricted to a circumference of 120"
  - Garments: Wearable or Halloween costumes
  - Toys: stuffed animal or doll, even a toy which you've made prior to the announcement of Challenge 2011 is acceptable as long as the toy sports a new handmade creation adhering to Challenge 2011's rules.
  - Home Dec: pillows, dresser scarves, etc.
  - Utilitarian: something for the kitchen, dining room, RV, etc.
- **SOME QUILTING** The entry must have enough quilting to identify the creation as having been quilted.
- **ONE ENTRY** per member. Entry may be a unit: apron & pot holder, dressed handmade toy, etc.

(Challenge rules are also posted on the guild website.)



## Block of the Month for December **SCRAP INSANITY:**

### **CHRISTMAS WREATH**

Christmas is coming and every door needs a new Wreath.

You don't need to worry about getting your hands sticky from pine sap when you assemble this block. Once again we will be working with half-square triangles. This will be a two color block in white and green.



There are 32 pieces to this block and it will finish to 12 1/2" square.

### **FABRIC:**



Background: white or cream. Cut 16 squares



Scraps: you will need 16 different fabrics all green. This block will look best using medium and dark greens. Cut 16 squares 4".

### **ASSEMBLY:**

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of all the background pieces.

Match a background piece and a scrap with right sides together. Stitch ¼" from both sides of the diagonal line. Cut apart on the drawn line. Press seams toward the scrap. Trim to 3 1/2". Layout the half square triangle (HST) units as shown in the diagram and complete your block.

Note: If you follow this method, you will be able to make two blocks. Or, save the leftover HST units for a future Block of the Month.


