How to use bottle screw tops to seal a plastic bag

Zip-top bags are great, but sometimes you buy something in bulk and you're stuck with an un-sealable bag. Here's an easy way to give these bags an airtight seal with a clean, used plastic water or soda bottle:

Cut the top off the plastic bottle, leaving the threaded neck and part of the shoulder, and take off the cap. Push the bag up through the bottom of the bottleneck, fold the bag over the top edge, and twist the cap back on.

Now, your bag has an air and water-tight seal, and you didn't have to waste the bag!

"Comfort" Quilts for Earthquake Victims

Please consider donating a small (lap or crib-sized) quilt to be sent to comfort victims of the Christchurch, New Zealand earthquake of February 22. You may also donate an unfinished quilt top, which Ranell Hansen, Nancy King, and Susan Italo are willing to quilt. In my absence, Ranell Hansen (h: 684-7042) will accept quilts from those in Carpinteria and points south, while Tone Steiro (h: 682-2152, c: 284-7849) will receive quilts from Santa Barbara quilters, and Suzanne Zanesco (h: 967-4005) will collect from Goleta folks. The label should have the quilter's name, city and country; no need to name your quilt if you don't want to.

Quilts will be shipped at the end of August. Qantas Airways Cargo has graciously offered some assistance with shipping costs, but collection boxes are located at Craft Essentials (Turnpike & Hollister) and at the door at guild meetings should you also wish to help. (International shipping is obscenely expensive.)

Lastly, I will continue to reiterate the message I voiced at the March CQG meeting:

PLEASE MAKE SURE THAT YOUR DISASTER PREPAREDNESS PLAN IS UP-TO-DATE.

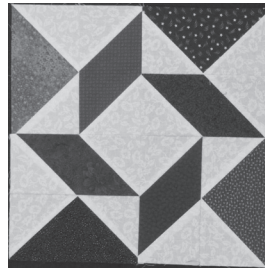

Block of the Month for June

SCRAP INSANITY: BALKAN PUZZLE

The Balkan Puzzle block is also known as Windblown Square and Zigzag Tile. This is traditionally a three-color block and we have chosen to make ours red, white, and blue. This block can also be made using half square triangles but we have opted for a more traditional assembly method.



There are 24 pieces to this block and it will finish to a 12½" square.

FABRIC:



Background: white. Cut 16 – 3½" squares. TIP: Lightly mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of your background squares.



Red scraps. Cut 4 rectangles 3½" x 6½".



Blue scraps. Cut 4 rectangles 3½" x 6½".

ASSEMBLY:

Make 4 Flying Geese:



Using your blue scraps, place a background square on top of a rectangle with right sides together. Sew on the diagonal line.



Trim seam to ¼" and press toward the background fabric.



Place another background square on the opposite side of the rectangle with right sides together. Sew on the diagonal line.



Trim seam to ¼" and press toward the background fabric. Flying Geese should measure 3½" x 6½".

Make 4 Parallelograms:



Using your red scraps, place a background square on top of a rectangle with right sides together. Sew on the diagonal line.



Trim seam to ¼" and press toward the background fabric.



Place another background square on the opposite side of the rectangle with right sides together. Sew on the diagonal line.



Trim seam to ¼" and press toward the background fabric. Parallelogram should measure 3½" x 6½".

Final Assembly:



Sew a Flying Geese unit and a Parallelogram unit together to form one quarter of the block. Repeat 4 times. Press the seam toward the parallelogram.

Assemble the quarter blocks as shown in the photo above.
