# A Retrospective Look at CQG Public Relations

In 2009, under the leadership of Darilyn Kisch, one of the challenges facing the board was how to revitalize our guild's ability to carry out our mission statement: "to educate our members about the history and preservation of the art form of quilt-making and related topics, to learn new techniques, improve skills and to inform the community-atlarge about our rich quilt-making heritage."

Through a brainstorming session between Darilyn, Jean MacMillan, Betty Kelley and Kathy Rose, the consensus was a need for a dedicated person to serve as a liaison not only with the media, but with the general membership as well. In addition, it was decided that a new infusion of interesting and more relevant articles in our newsletter would help that process. But how and where should we start?

The initial goal in the creation of a new "public relations" position, to be responsible for communicating with the media, included the establishment of some "press-ready" statements suitable for media release and use. These features came together, with technical assistance from Bonnie Barber, in the creation of the Media page, now found on our guild's website:

- About Us What the guild is all about and what its mission statement is.
- *History of the guild* When the guild was established and what it has accomplished
- *New Releases* Press releases regarding special projects and events, written by the public relations or other designated person.
- **Press Clippings** A collection of press clippings; this would secondarily assist in chronicling the guild's history, thereby eliminating the previous historian position.
- *Public Recognition* A collection of the guild's public recognition, currently chronicling the 20th-anniversary celebration in 2008

Considerable time, thoughtful consideration, and effort were put forth by all those involved to accomplish the stated goals reached by a consensus of opinion and agreement. Not only have these goals been realized, as evidenced by our Media page, but many additional articles were published in Coast Lines between January 2009 and June 2011, bringing relevant news items to you along with countless calendar items of related events in our local community. With Bonnie's expertise, we have also established a growing Gallery page of photographs on our website to further record our continuing history.

From its initial concept, the public relations position was never envisioned as a static board post, but rather one that would continue to evolve over time as the guild's needs and expectations grew. It is our hope that this work will continue through a network of guild members volunteering to bring programs and showings to groups and organizations within our local community. The foundation for those efforts has been established with information about our Community Outreach Programs, now available on the Contact Us page of the guild's website. There is much more to be done in furthering our mission statement.

As the guild's first public relations representative, it has been my pleasure to serve on the board in this founding capacity, and I have no doubt that my successor, Leslie Dodge, will continue in the tradition you have come to expect thus far.

# Block of the Month KEEP IT SCRAPPY: ROAD TO OKLAHOMA

The second "Keep It Scrappy" block is a very simple one composed of only squares and half square triangles.

### **FABRIC:**



Background: Background: You will need a variety of whites.



Scraps: You will need 10 different scraps of dark fabric.

#### **CUTTING:**

- From background fabric: Cut 6 squares 3 ½" and cut 4 squares 3 7/8"
- From scraps: Cut 6 squares 3 ½ "and 4 squares 3 7/8"



- Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the 3 7/8" background squares.
- Match these 4 background squares with

the 4 - 3 7/8" scrap squares right sides together.

- Stitch  $1\!\!4''$  from both sides of the diagonal line. Cut apart on the diagonal line. Press and trim to 3  $1\!\!/2$  ".
- Lay out the squares as shown in the diagram and piece together to form the block. The block should be 12 ½" square.

Following this method, you should have 4 extra half square triangles. You can either save them for a later block of the month OR you can cut more 3 ½" squares so that you can make two blocks. (Remember winner takes all!)

- The background fabrics will either be white or perhaps a combination of white and cream.
- 2. As last year, the scrap fabrics within each block must be different. If the pattern calls for 8 dark or medium pieces, you should use 8 different dark or medium scraps.
