2013 Challenge: Judging a Book by Its Cover

The 2013 Challenge is just around the corner on June 13. **Quilt entries will need to be turned in at the May 9th guild meeting**, which means you only have one more month to construct your masterpiece. The entry form is included in this month's newsletter and will also be available on our website at www.coastalquilters.org

Please read the following; some of the guidelines have been modified.

- Quilt design must be inspired by the cover of a book (quilt books excluded) but not be an exact replica of the book. You could be inspired by the color, graphics, title or anything else you find on the cover. Remember that if you recreate the cover of the book exactly, you may be required to obtain permission from the artist.
- The quilt must be three layers and quilted by hand or machine.
- The guilt must include a "recognizable amount" of the selected fabric (see photo), which features a navy blue background with colorful book spines forming circular designs. The qualifying fabric must be used in the body of the quilt; using it as the binding or backing does not meet the fabric challenge. Fat quarters of the fabric will be available for sale at the April guild meetings for \$2.



 You will need to submit a full-size (book size), color copy or photo of the book cover that inspires your quilt, to be displayed alongside your quilt on the night of the Challenge.

Note change in size requirement!

- The quilt size cannot exceed 140" perimeter (for example, 30" x 40" or 25" x 35"). It cannot be smaller than 36" perimeter (9" x 9" or 8" x 10"). For those who haven't studied geometry in a while, perimeter is the entire measurement of the outside edge of the quilt on all sides.
- The quilt, application form and photocopy of book will need to be submitted prior to or at the guild meeting on May 9th. If you need to make special arrangements to deliver your quilt, please contact us (contact numbers on entry form.)

In addition, we will be asking our voters to look at the quilts and judge them according to the following criteria. Prizes will be awarded in each of the these categories:

- Overall Favorite Your personal favorite
- Best Overall Interpretation of Challenge Theme based on the color and design of the quilt and in comparison to the inspiration book (and not necessarily a replica of the cover)
- Best Interpretation Based on Graphics based on the graphics shown on the inspiration book
- Best Interpretation Based on Color based on the colors shown on the inspiration book
- Best Use of Challenge Fabric
- Most Humorous

We will explain these categories more at the June meeting, but please contact us if you have any questions. We hope you are all ready for a great Challenge show!

We are looking for two to four volunteers to help with set up on June 13, and six to eight volunteers to help with displaying the quilts and tallying votes that evening. Please contact us if you are interested in helping.

Block of the Month for May BASKET BLOCK

With April showers, come May flowers. You'll need a pretty basket to collect all your lovely picked flowers. Let's make a beautiful collection of spring flowers.

FABRIC



ASSEMBLY:

- 1. Cut a 21/8" square from the basket fabric (A)
- 2. Cut four 3¼" square pieces from the basket fabric, and three from the background fabric. Cut each square in half diagonally to make two triangles, a total of 8 (B) pieces from the basket fabric and six (B) pieces from the background fabric. Use six of each color to make half square triangle units. The two remaining B pieces will form the base of the basket.
- 3. Cut 2 (C) pieces 7¾" 'x 2½" from the background fabric.
- 4. Cut one (D) piece 57/8" square from the background fabric. Cut in half once diagonally to get two triangles. You will use only one.
- 5. Cut 2 (E) pieces 8" square, one from the flower fabric and one from the basket fabric. Cut each square in half diagonally to get two triangles. You will use only one of each.


Assemble as shown. Makes one 121/2" block.
