

Thank You From the quilting ladies at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Goleta

Suzanne Zanesco, another member of our Good Shepherd Lutheran Church quilting group

— and also a CQG member— took a photo at our latest quilting session at the church. The lady standing to MY right (left looking at the photo; I'm the one with "dark" hair) does a lot of our top piecing, and the lady to MY left (right looking at the photo) does the edge finishing and puts on the labels — they are in their 80's! I hope that I'm still so active when I'm their age!

It just so happened that we were working on a quilt where the top was pieced from fabric donated to us from a Coastal Quilters Guild member, so I thought I'd let you see what we do with all of your donations. This top turned out particularly

colorful and was so nice working with better quality fabric for a change!



On top of the cabinets behind us is our collection of backings (often sheets or pieced fabric), where we can usually find one that complements the finished top. Inside the cabinets we store out middles (blankets, mattress pads and flannel sheets) and also work in progress (matched tops with backings.) We always try to have some ready to be worked on for the monthlyFriday group (I join them on Saturdays.) Off to the left on the shelving is just "some" of the donated fabric to be washed and cut -- we try to keep it organized by colors or themes to make it easy to do our "laundry". I will often take a box or bag of fabric home each month to wash, iron & cut, then I put packets of squares together to be sewed.

Thank you SO MUCH for assisting us, particularly with your donations of middles and sheets for backings! I know the recipients are always so happy to receive a new quilt!

It may be a tiny little element of the quilt or the whole quilt. You may twist it, distort it, elongate, curve it, or completely change the proportions or contrast of the traditional elements. You are only limited by your imagination.



Block of the Month 2013-14: EVERYBODY IS A STAR

January's Block: Crystal Star

This pattern was originally published in the Kansas City Star on June 16, 1934. We've chosen blue and white so that the finished block evokes a snowflake. The blue can be dark or medium or even light as long as it is dark enough to contrast with the white. Be sure to choose a true blue rather than a purple blue, teal or turquoise. This square is quite easy as it consists largely of half-square triangles.

Cut the following:






Diagram A

ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

Half-square triangles: Draw a diagonal line on the back of each of the six 4" squares.

Place a light square atop a dark square, rights sides facing. Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " on both side of the diagonal line. Cut on the line.

Unfold each until and press toward the dark fabric. You will have 12 units. Square and trim each pressed unit to 3½" square.

Assemble the units in rows as shown in Diagram A.

The finished block should look like Diagram B.
