



Here are the submission guidelines:

A song from your high school years—Must represent the *title* of one song (any genre – rock 'n roll; ballad; theme from TV, musical, or movie, etc.)

**Must be a quilt only** – no dolls, aprons, vests, bags, etc.

**Debut quilts only** – not previously exhibited

Any shape – **maximum perimeter is 96**" One entry only per person

Add a sleeve (2"- 4") and a covered label To be finished and submitted in March To be submitted in a labeled pillowcase with entry form

Exhibit and voting will be at the April Guild meeting

These entries will fit nicely with the "Memories" theme of the next quilt show in September 2018, so please plan on showing your entry then.

Come for a couple hours or all day—we'll be working in assembly-line fashion on Days for Girls items. Picture yourself making new friends while working on beautiful fabric in bright colors, making dignity-enhancing items that will empower women and girls around the world.

#### How It All Began

Days for Girls began in 2008 when Founder and CEO Celeste Mergens was working with a family foundation in Kenya when she began assisting an orphanage in the outskirts of Nairobi. In the wake of historic post-election violence, the population at the orphanage had swelled from 400 children to 1400.

As she was getting prepared to return to Nairobi, Celeste went to bed with the devastating situation weighing heavy on her mind. In the middle of the night she woke up with a nagging question: "What are girls doing for feminine hygiene?" She ran to the computer and sent an email to the Assistant Director of the orphanage.

He replied right away. "Nothing. They wait in their rooms."

Celeste learned that girls were sitting on cardboard for several days each month, often going without food unless someone would bring it to them. This set into motion her first intervention - disposable pads. But Celeste and her team quickly discovered a major problem - without any place to dispose of the pads, this was not a viable or sustainable solution. It was time for plan B: a washable, long- lasting pad.

The first Days for Girls Kits were quite different from the design in use today. Each of the 28 iterations that followed would be informed by extensive feedback, and designed to meet unique cultural and environmental conditions in communities throughout the world. What would eventually become clear in the years following Days for Girls' beginning was just how much of a difference hygiene solutions would make in assisting women and girls to break the cycle of poverty and live lives of dignity.



Today, Days for Girls has reached over 640,000 women and girls in 100+ countries with Kits, each of which will last a girl or woman 2 - 3 years. This translates into over 115 million days of education and opportunity that would otherwise be lost without sustainable hygiene solutions.

Size: Girls' size 12-14 and Women's sizes 5-7. Bikini, hipsters or briefs. No boy shorts.


Any brand.Content: Absorbent - Cotton or cotton/poly. No silky/slinky/sexy.

Color: Medium and dark colors are preferable. (If package includes white or pastel panties that's okay because we can dye them.)

Motif: Florals and geometrics are okay. No animals, bugs, insects, faces or eyes. Butterflies okay if no eyes. No animal skin prints, guns, hunting or camouflage. No glitz, glitter or glam. No cartoon, TV, pop culture, flags, food or words.

#### Bright Hopes 12" Finished Block



January 2018 Coastal Quilters Guild Block of the Month

Cutting

White solid or white on white: Cut 8 (2" x 5") rectangles.

Light green:

Cut 4 (2" x 5") rectangles.

Medium green:

Cut 4 (2"x 5") rectangles.

Purple:

Cut 4 (3-1/2") squares.

Assembly


Match first rectangle to center square. Start stitching from matched edges.
 Stop stitching at the center of the square and backstitch. Press seam away from square.

2. Add the next three rectangles. Match ends and stitch the length of the rectangle.


Press seams away from square.

Complete stitching on first rectangle. Match ends. Stitch from end toward center and backstitch at center.

4. Make four units. Units should measure 6-1/2".



Join units to make the block. Note pressing arrows. Block should measure 12-1/2".
