March Speaker: "Value of Value"

Fiber artist, designer, guilter, and author Grace Errea will join us in March to teach us how *value* affects the presentation of your quilt. Whether you are a beginner and want to understand how the elements of art influence design or are advanced and want to take your skills to the next level, this presentation will give you tools to create beautiful quilts. Grace will teach us how design is influenced by one extremely important art element: value. Value is what makes beautiful things glow even though color might get all the credit. Grace

will provide an overview of color harmony, color theory, the psychology of color and the expressive

aspects of color and *value*. She will show where and how to use it to create and emphasize a focal point, set a mood in an art piece, and create 3-dimensionality.

WORKSHOP: "HEAT SET" MACHINE APPLIQUÉ

On March 9, Grace will conduct a workshop in which she will introduce us to the new technique of "Heat Set" appliqué. In this class you will learn to use an appliqué technique so new and revolutionary that you will use nothing else. It is easy and foolproof, and the results are always amazing. This technique leaves the fabric soft and manageable and you can do raw edge appliqué without any fraying edges. There will be 5 different kits (\$20 each) to choose from. 

April 2018 Coastal Quilters Guild Block of the Month



Cutting Cream:


Cut four 4-1/2" squares. Cut eight 2-1/2" squares. Light to medium 1930's green print or other pastel print: Cut eight 2-1/2" squares. Any 1930's print or pastel print: Cut four 4-1/2" squares. Any 1930's print or pastel print: Cut one 4-1/2" squares for center square.

Assembly

Note the pressing directions so seams will nest.

1. Draw a line from corner to corner on the wrong side of all the small squares


 Align straight edges of small green square and large cream square. Pin. Sew on the line. Trim seam to 1/4". Press seam toward cream. Repeat at the opposite corner of the large square.



3. Align straight edges of small cream square and large 1930's or pastel square. Pin. Sew on the line. Trim seam to 1/4". Press seam toward cream. Repeat on the other side of the large square.



 Arrange units and sew together to make the Prairie Flower block. Note pressing arrows. Block should measure 12-1/2".


Donations Needed for Quilt Show Raffle Baskets
