Quilt Show NEWS: Good Jobs Still Open

The quilt show planning took a major detour in February when Bonnie Epperson needed to resign due to health issues and I stepped in to head the show. Bonnie had filled many of the show committee chair positions but these still need to be filled:

<u>Co-chair</u> – will work with me to oversee the 2018 show, and will learn the ropes of the chair's position with the hope they will take over for the 2020 show.

<u>Boutique</u> – the boutique is a great opportunity for guild members to sell handcrafted items with a share of sales going to the guild; some items are also donated to the guild to sell. This position could be filled by a committee of 3 or 4 people to spread the work around.

<u>Quilt Acquisitions</u> – this position has been pared down significantly, as the Data Management chair will now handle computer input. Key duties include organizing the quilt collectors and managing delivery of quilts at the show.

Tickets – managing pre-sales and tickets at the show.

May Speaker: Velda Newman

At the May 10 Guild meeting, Velda Newman will speak on "A Painter's Approach to Quilt Design." Velda is a contemporary fiber Artist from Nevada City, California. She will discuss the evolution of her career in quilt making since the mid-1980's and demonstrate how certain artistic principles have contributed to her personal style.



Velda's large-scale designs, portraying subjects from nature, have been exhibited throughout the U.S., Europe, Australia and Japan. She uses textiles and threads the way other artists use paints and brushes. Her primary source of inspiration is the natural world and

Her work is included in public and private collections and has appeared in national and international publications, including MASTERS Art Quilts, published in 2008. Her quilt ZINNIA received the Quilts Japan Prize. Her books include *Velda Newman: A Painter's Approach to Quilt Design* (Fiber Studio Press) and *A Workshop With Velda Newman* (C & T Publishing, also an e-book on Amazon).



On Friday, May 11, 2018, Velda will conduct the workshop

"Texture & Form." Nature is an endless source of beauty and inspiration. With this in mind, Velda will teach a technique to eliminate the "flat" look and make fabric very interesting. These easy machine stitching techniques can be used for quilts or clothing. So much to learn....so little time! 

May 2018 Coastal Quilters Guild Block of the Month

Cutting

White print with small black motif. Two 5-1/4" squares.

Black

Five 4-1/2" squares.

Red

Two 5-1/4" squares.

Assembly

Draw a line corner to corner on the two white squares. This is the cutting line.
 Draw a line 1/4" from the cutting line and on each side of the cutting line. These are the sewing lines.



Pin white squares and red squares right sides together. Stitch on the two sewing lines. Cut on the cutting line. Press seam to the red. Trim units to 4-1/2".














Arrange the triangle units with the black squares to make the Contrary Wife block. Sew into rows. Press to black squares. Sew rows together. Block should measure 12-1/2".
