She will share her "Appliqué Journey" and entertain us with a trunk show of beautiful appliquéd quilts. Please join us to hear descriptions of several different appliqué techniques used in her quilting.

Becky's workshop on "The Orange Peel Pillow" will be held on Friday, June 15 from 9 am to 3 pm at Goleta Valley Community Center. She will teach a machine appliqué foundation method which causes stitches to disappear making the pieces appear as if it were hand appliquéd.

Kits for the workshop will be available for \$25 but attendees may bring their own fabrics if they wish. The quick project should easily be completed in the workshop. Harvest of Colors: Quilt Show Chair's News

Quilt Show planning continues; all members are welcome to attend our meetings. If you would like to help with the planning, come to our next meeting (5:30 p.m. before the June 14 guild meeting).

Pre-sale Ticket Order Forms are now available in the "Quilt Show" section of the website, coastalquilters.org. Pre-sale tickets are \$8, tickets at the door are \$10. Ticket chair Bee Saunders encourages members to sell as many tickets as possible - to family, neighbors, work colleagues and friends: "Make sure your name is recorded when buying tickets as there will be a very desirable prize for the highest seller!"

Quilt Show Entry Guidelines will be on the website in June, together with **Entry Forms** and **Judging Forms**. This year, members are asked to fill out their Entry and Judging Forms online, if able to do so; our new online registration program will help improve accuracy and simplify data-management tasks. Guidelines and Forms will also be available in print form at the meeting or by download from the website. Please review the **Entry Guidelines** right away to become familiar with due dates and details – including requirements for photos, hanging sleeves, quilt labels, etc.

Volunteer sign-ups will begin in earnest at the June meeting; Nancy Butterfield will be at a table in the rear. We need EVERYONE to participate in some way, so please sign up for the positions that best suit your time availability. Please be generous with your time as the show needs you.

This show is a Member's Showcase and we would like ALL members to participate. While you are working on your quilt, think about your artist statement and your inspiration. It is always fun to read your words describing your process. I hope you are all busy quilting those beautiful show quilts!

Harvest of Colors: Quilts to Be Judged

The Judging Committee would like to encourage you to submit your quilt(s) to be judged in the Quilt Show. This is a great opportunity to receive an unbiased written evaluation of your quilt(s). The judge will give you several positive comments as well as one or two suggestions for improvement. Your critique will be completely confidential and can be a positive experience; you will receive your written evaluation after the show on Sunday.

We are happy to have Andi Perejda as our judge this year. Andi is a long-time quilter, quilt teacher and an NQA certified quilt judge. There will be limits of two judged quilts per person and a total of 80 judged quilts. To have pieces judged:

- complete our Judging Form (available in June at guild meetings and on website)
- attach a 4x6" photo of each piece
- cover the quilt label with a piece of cloth
- pay a \$15.00 fee for each quilt to be judged
- choose a category for your quilt: traditional, modern, art or innovative/contemporary (category definitions will be on the back of the form)

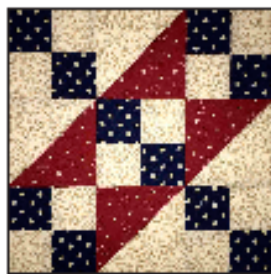
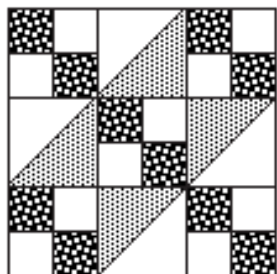

JACOB'S LADDER

12" Finished block

Block of the Month



Cutting

Use patriotic prints if you have them.

Light: *Off white or light beige/tan*

1 strip 2-1/2" wide x 30".

Two 5-1/4" squares.

Red:

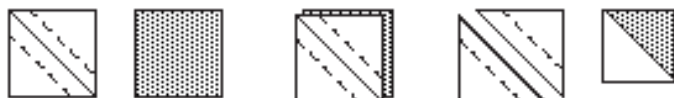
Two 5-1/4" squares.

Dark Blue:

1 strip 2-1/2" wide x 30".

Assembly

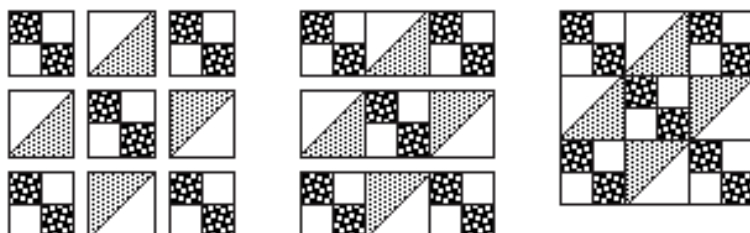
1. Draw a line corner to corner on the two light squares. This is the cutting line. Draw a line 1/4" from the cutting line and on each side of the cutting line. These are the sewing lines. Pin light squares and red squares right sides together. Stitch on the two sewing lines. Cut on the cutting line. Press seams to the red. Trim units to 4-1/2".



2. Sew the light strip to the blue strip. Press seam to blue. Sewn strips should measure 4-1/2" across. Cut into 2-1/2" units. Sew units together to make 4 patch units. 4 patch units should measure 4-1/2".



3. Arrange triangle and 4 patch units to make the Jacob's Ladder block. Sew units into rows. Press seams to 4-patch units. Sew rows together. Press seams to outside rows. Block should measure 12-1/2".
