Boost your appliqué IQ with Linda's workshop, "Appliqué Stitch Lab - Tips, Tricks & Decorative Stitches for Machine Appliqué." Loaded with super-practical tips and tricks, this class is a great way to learn or brush up on easy machine appliqué. While making the Splendor wall hanging,



you will learn a variety of different methods to prepare shapes for raw-edge and turned-edge machine appliqué, as well as to perfect your own "unique appliqué stitch." You'll also learn how to use a variety of fun decorative stitches to texturize appliqués and gain the confidence you need to appliqué the day away! The

2019 Challenge: "Don't Touch"

Let's add a classy touch to our next quilt show. How? Make a Public Awareness sign with a reminder: "Just Look, Don't Touch." With one of the Guild's stated aims as our guide, "to inform the community about the history and preservation of quilts", select an era, trend, or technique from vintage to modern, simple to intricate, sweet to silly. Make your own words, use provided laser cut words (limited number), or let your entry speak for itself (wordless). Laser letters and rule handout will be available at the Guild library.

CHALLENGE REQUIREMENTS: Remind the public not to touch. Make no political statements. Finished size must be 12" x 12". Provide a back label with, at minimum, maker's name (other info as desired.) No hanging sleeve needed. Due March 2019. All challenge entrants will be encouraged to donate their entries to the Guild for use in future quilts shows.

Daysies Update

Daysies, a Guild satellite, makes reusable feminine hygiene kits, using Days for Girls guidelines. At a recent Direct Relief event to compile postpartum kits, our speaker was Teresa "Tet" Maniego, a warm and inspiring "doula" (non-medical birth coach) from the Bumi Wadah clinic in the Philippines where, we hope, 320 kits soon will be shipped.

Since joining efforts with Days for Girls and Direct Relief, the Daysies have helped to sew and compile 1725 menses and postpartum kits, for delivery to clinics and hospitals in Rwanda, Nepal, Niger, Fiji, Uganda, Bangladesh and the Philippines.

What's in a kit?

The drawstring bag contains: 2 shields, 8-10 liners, 2 panties, 1 washcloth, 1 soap, 2 ziploc bags and 1 information sheet. So, the Daysies have helped to sew lots of bags, shields and liners!

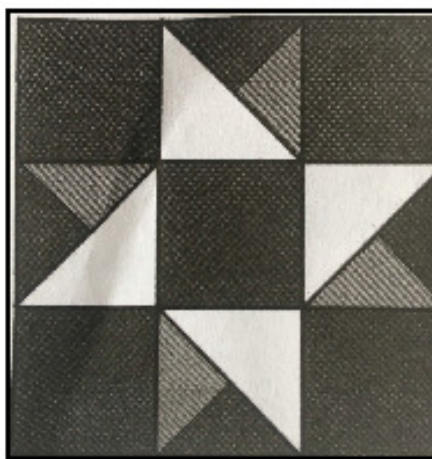
SCRAP INSANITY: Starry Holiday Sky

12" Block (12.5" Unfinished)

"December skies on a clear night in Santa Barbara are often the most beautiful of the year, setting the scene for our holiday celebrations! Since this is such a busy time of year, we've planned a simple block of squares, triangles and quarter-square triangles. To make it even easier you will only need two scrap fabrics and one background fabric. Have fun creating blocks for this starry, starry night quilt. Hope you win!"

*****Magical Option***** In honor of our Christmas Party, please consider adding something special to your block this month by making the center square *magical* using creative piecing, zingy fabric or a sparkly technique of your choice. Example above has a silky, shiny pocket for surprises!

FabricLight Yellow or Gold Scraps:Cut 2 pieces, 4 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squareDarker Yellow or Darker Gold Scraps:Cut 1 piece, 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ " squareDark Blue Background fabric:Cut 5 pieces 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square and 1 piece 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ " square

(If you choose the *****Magical Option***** for your center block, you will replace ONE of the 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares with 1 piece sparkly*magical 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square)

Assembly

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the 4 $\frac{7}{8}$ " light yellow or gold scrap squares. Cut apart on the diagonal lines to form 4 triangles.

Draw 2 diagonal lines on the back of **both** of the 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ " squares. (looks like an X) Cut apart on the lines. You should now have 4 small dark blue and 4 small dark gold scrap triangles.

Stitch one dark scrap triangle to each background blue triangle on the short side. Press. Sew each pair of small triangles to the long side of a light yellow or gold scrap triangle, forming 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. Press and trim to 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ "

Assemble the squares as shown in the diagram (minding the 'spin' of the triangles)
