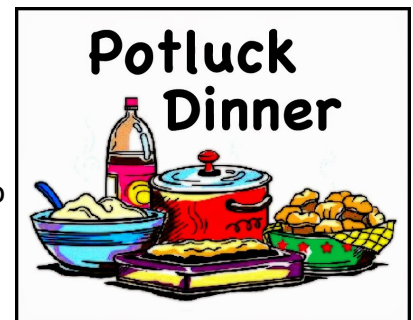
February Meeting

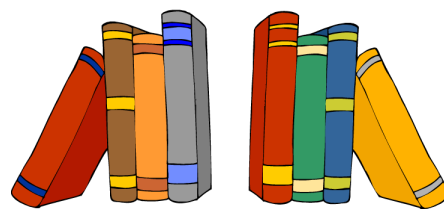

CHINESE LANTERN BLOCK

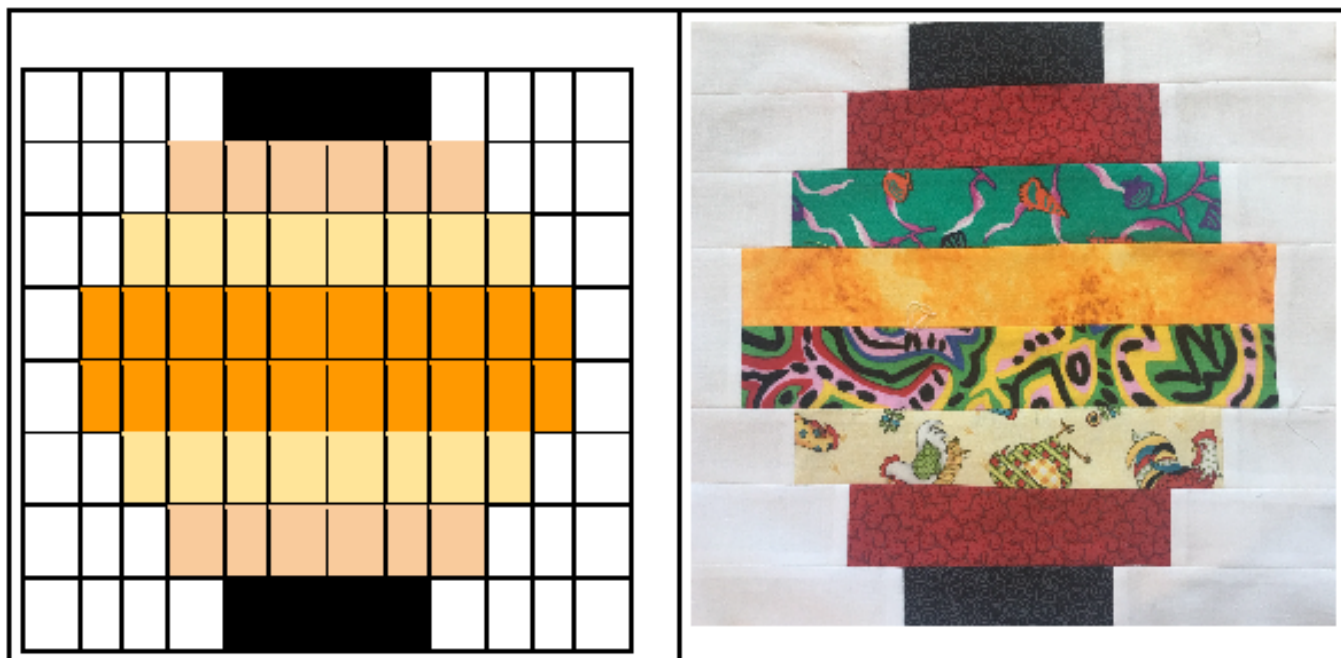
12" Block (12.5" Unfinished)

"The Chinese Lantern is the first-ever portable lighting. It is the unique traditional craftwork of China. Besides an illumination tool, the lantern also became a source of artistic expression. Calligraphic characters, historical figures, deities and landscapes would adorn their lanterns. At times, artistic contests would be held to crown the best lantern craftsmen. Though electricity has replaced the lantern, lantern festivals bring back the beauty of this illumination tool. Now with this little bit of history, let's begin to make fantastic Chinese lanterns!"

**Fabric and Cutting**

<u>White Fabric:</u> Cut 6 - $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 4\frac{1}{2}''$ Cut 4 - $2'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$ Cut 4 - $2'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$	<u>*Oriental/Bright Fabric</u> Cut 2 - $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 10\frac{1}{2}''$ Cut 2 - $2'' \times 6\frac{1}{2}''$ Cut 2 - $2'' \times 8\frac{1}{2}''$ *Can be six different prints or any combination of brights.	<u>Black</u> Cut 2 - $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 4\frac{1}{2}''$

Assembly

- Sew a White $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 4\frac{1}{2}''$ to Black $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 4\frac{1}{2}''$ to a White $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 4\frac{1}{2}''$ (make 2 of these)
- Sew a White $2'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$ to an Oriental/Bright $2'' \times 6\frac{1}{2}''$ to a White $2'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$ (make 2)
- Sew a White $2'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$ to an Oriental/Bright $2'' \times 8\frac{1}{2}''$ to a White $2'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$ (make 2)
- Sew two Oriental/Bright $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 10\frac{1}{2}''$ pieces together lengthwise
- Sew a White $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 4\frac{1}{2}''$ to either end of the Oriental/Bright $4\frac{1}{2}'' \times 10\frac{1}{2}''$ strip
- Sew the 8 resulting strips together as shown in the diagram.
