May Speaker: Rami Kim “Asian Designs in a Modern World”

Rami Kim is a DNA scientist-turned fabric artist/quilter/instructor known nationally and internationally. She is a 19-time Best of Show winner who is distinguished for her innovative art-to-wear. Her passion lies in contemporary art-to-wear (which will be modeled by adults during the presentation), quilts, cloth dolls and bags with special interest in 3-dimensional textures. She is known for her own distinctive colors and techniques.



Rami’s presentation on May 9 is based on her 3rd book, *Elegant Cotton, Wool, Silk Quilts*, which features a fusion of brand-new Asian designs and techniques. The lecture and trunk show will demonstrate many designs and concepts that are more than a few thousand years old from Korea, the “Land of Morning Calm.” Quilts, wearable arts, traditional costumes called “Hanbok”, bags, wrapping cloth called “Bojahgy”, and many more items will be shown and discussed. Please join us for an evening that promises to be entertaining as well as educational.

Workshop: May 10, 2019

On May 10, Rami will conduct a workshop entitled “Folded Square & Hexagon for Cross-stitched & Pieced quilts.” Participants will learn how to fold squares to make a unit pixel and how to fold hexagons to make another unit pixel to create the art-pixel-quilts. She will be teaching this new and innovative technique to make a table runner in the class. Because the pieces include built-in backing for quilts, your quilts will already be backed and quilted once all the “Hexies” are pieced together. This class is for beginners to advanced quilters. 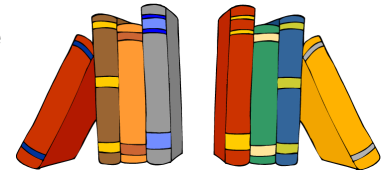
Librarians Needed/Please Return Books

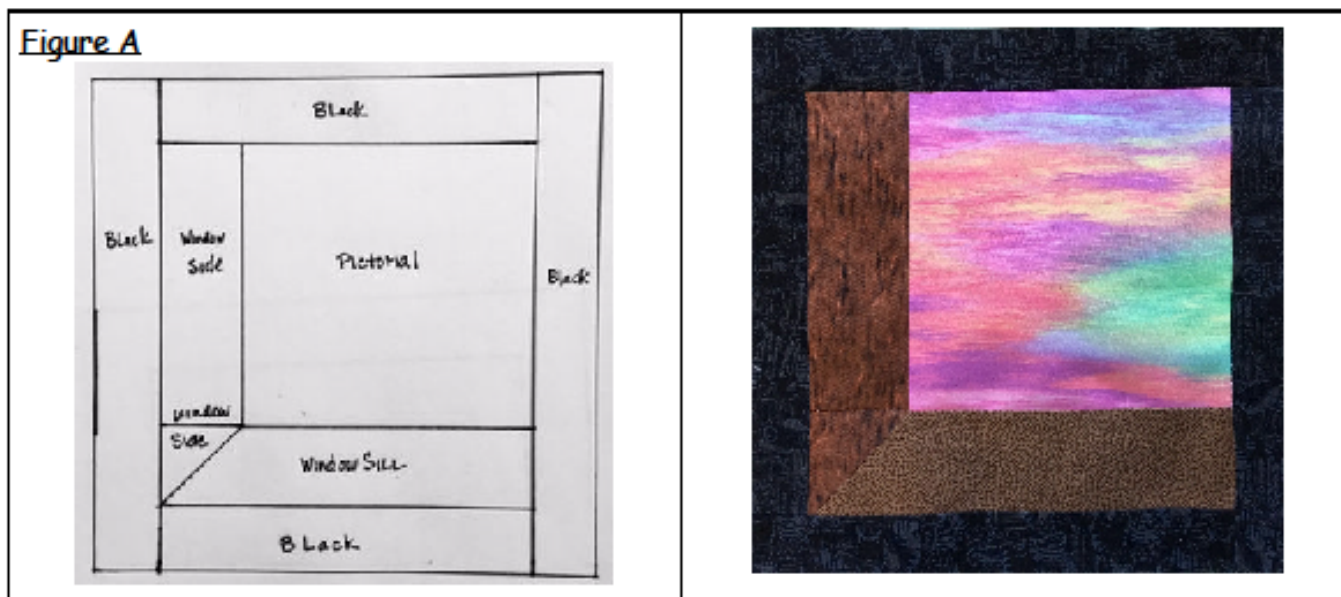

Coastal Quilters Guild Block of the Month

Summer is coming, let's enjoy the view...houses, cities, beach scenes, sailboats, your choice!

"Here's an opportunity to use some of those lovely pictorial fabrics that you have but just can't bear to cut up into little pieces" This block was the June 2002 Block of the Month designed by Marcia Moore. I encourage you to create your own view if you are inspired.

**Fabric and Cutting**

<u>Pictorial Fabric:</u> Cut 1 - 8" x 8" Note: viewable area is 7 1/2" sq.	<u>Border - Black (solid, marbled, black on black, anything that reads as black)</u> Cut 2 - 2" x 13" (top) Cut 2 - 2" x 10 1/2" (sides) <u>Window Side (darker color)</u> Cut 1 - 3" x 3" Cut 1 - 2 3/4" x 8"	
<u>Window Sill (lighter color)</u> Cut 1 - 2 3/4" x 10 1/2"		

Assembly (use 1/4" seam allowances)

1. Sew the 2 3/4" x 8" strip of the darker 'Window Side' strip to the left side of the 8" square pictorial piece, forming the Pictorial Square unit.
2. Place the the 3" square right sides together on the left end of the 2 3/4" x 10 1/2" Window Sill strip. Starting at lower left corner, sew a diagonal seam through the center of the 3" square. Press the darker color toward the top of strip, forming the Window Sill unit. Trim the seam to eliminate bulk.
3. Sew the Window Sill unit to the Pictorial Square unit, as shown in figure A (above) Take care to place the strip so that the bottom corner of the window is distinct.
4. Add the black border around the block. Sew on sides first, then the top and bottom.
5. Press and then trim the finished block to 12 1/2" x 12 1/2". Enjoy the view!
