

February 7, 1990

There was a meeting at Maggie Godwin's house to discuss guild matters. Those present were Susan Harter, Carol Ludwick, Carol Boyce, Zetta Hanna, Marge Hall, Harriet Berk, Jan Inouye, Colby Kline, Judy Gorrindo, Sandi Globus, Marty Frolli, Maggie Godwin, Laurie Ball, and Norah McMeeking.

Carol B. and Jan attended the recent SCCQG meeting in Redlands, where they learned of more of the speakers available in southern California. Carol brought back some of their fundraiser guides which she has available for sale.

Carol has researched some microphone packages and showed us a picture of Radio Shack's Anywhere P.A. system which is available for under \$300. Zetta moved that we go ahead with the purchase and Marge seconded the motion; we'll get it as soon as possible. It was mentioned that one of our members has offered \$100 to be applied to the purchase price.

Susan Harter told us that she has left messages at the Goleta Valley Community Center concerning our involvement with Goleta Valley Days but has not yet heard back from them. No one knows the date yet. The idea of charging admission was discussed - it was decided that in the interest of making the exhibit available to any who wish to see it, we will not charge admission; we will instead look to make money on the sale of raffle quilt tickets and possibly Block-of-the-Month pattern sales.

Sandi presented a proposed budget, which was discussed and changed, then accepted as follows:

Since our current balance is \$1534, to meet the planned expenses for 1990, projected income is \$2286.

Carol brought up the issue of requesting \$3.00 from non-members at all meetings instead of just those meetings with speakers; it was decided to mention this policy change at the February meeting and to enact it in March.

Harriet spoke of February's Auction, which she seems to have well in hand. Zetta, Marty, and Sandi will arrive early with tables; Sandi

and Judy will collect the money. The phone call committee will suggest that people bring anything even loosely related to quilting.

Marge announced that they have chosen the Shelter for Women as the community project this year. The shelter has 6 single beds that they will accept quilts for to keep; they would also appreciate small quilts that they can give to the children that pass through. Marge will set up a table at the February meeting with fabric that was donated but not used for last year's Hospice quilts; this will be available to people wanting to participate in this year's project.

Jan spoke of programs: the Hoffman Challenge trunk show is scheduled for March. There are changes for later in the year: our Round Robin has been rescheduled for May so that we can have Margaret Miller in June (there is talk of sharing travel expenses - Jan will let us know when details are ironed out), and Rosalind Perry will speak on Marie Webster's quilts in November. She asked if we'd like another slide retrospective for January 1991; we decided to take slides throughout the year and then see what we have to work with.

Colby, who is the liaison for the Museum Quilt project, will announce the block contest and the bank's donation at the February meeting.

Norah spoke of the introductory meeting between the Museum and the guild which was held a few weeks ago. So that she would be able to have contest fliers printed up in time for the February guild meeting, the guild advanced her \$100 which will be paid back when the funds from Maggie's bank come through. There will be a steering committee meeting at Jan's house at 7:30 p.m. on February 21 for anyone who is interested in the project.

Laurie passed copies of the survey to be given to the membership at the next meeting; it was approved. When people return the survey, they will be given raffle tickets so as to be eligible for a See's candy drawing. Carol Ludwick will give Laurie some tickets and will also pick up the candy since she's getting a box as door prize.

Harriet, who is also doing the Opportunity quilts, showed us a sample of the Hidden Wells she's doing for the first quilt. She will aim for 72" X 90" since there were some complaints about the size of the last one. It was decided that the first quilt should be done by May and the second should be ready for Goleta Valley Days.

Incentive prizes for this year's Challenge were discussed: in addition to hanging at the Museum show, other ideas were CQ logo mugs, ribbons, thimbles and pins.

Norah mentioned that she'd like to have any black and white quilts as decoration for the Marymount auction at the Red Lion on March 31.

Jan informed us of a Caryl Fallert and a Virginia Avery workshop being held in Encino in March.

Carol passed on the information that there will be a meeting on February 24 for any guilds who are interested in forming a Central California Council.

The next board meeting will be on March 7 at Colby Kline's house.
