COASTAL QUILTERS GUILD MEETING MINUTES

Nov.12, 1990

Carol Boyce opened the meeting at General Research Corp. meeting room at 7:40 p.m. She reminded all the members that the December meeting will resume at the Goleta library. She invited the members to look at the bulletin board for more notices on upcoming events. The quilts for the Battered Women's Shelter are due next month, Marge Hall passed out labels to all who could use them. Sherrie Collins volunteered to sew up some flannel squares that were donated by another member.

All members are encouraged to stop in the library to view the window display put together by Jan Erb and Irene Mason. It will be in the glass case until the end of November,

Colby Kline thanked all who brought refreshments and asked to have the entire membership bring things to the December meeting, Colby also said the borders for the Museum quilt are now ready to be quilted and passed sign-up sheets for volunteer quilters, Colby also called attention to the newsletter for a description of the various aspects of the Museum show put together by Norah. There is also a form if members wish to have their quilt photographed by a professional before Nov. 19th at Norah's house,

Additional small satellite groups were formed and doing exciting things, Jane Manasse's daytime group is going to Paducah and Rebecca Mealy's group can accomodate new members for evening.

Judy Gorrindo displayed the two angel quilts made and donated for a doorprize through her efforts and the donation of 23 angel squares. Raffle tickets were sold at this meeting and will be available at the Dec. meeting also.

Rebecca Mealy thanked those who participated in the Goleta Valley Days show and reminded all who had quilts remaining with Zetta to please pick them up.

Zetta Hanna announced the slate of officers for the coming year and opened the floor to additional nominations. Since none were forthcoming the slate was voted on and approved by the membership

Norah McMeeking thaked Sharon Doyle for sponsoring the two welcoming coffees in her home. Sharn has graciously consented to do this again in the spring.

Sandi Globus told the Guild about the Simi Valley Quilt show. She located an auctioneer at the show and passed pictures of the types of quilts auctioned and those which sold best. It took two hours to auction off 50 quilts.

Jan Inouye spoke about the Wrapped in Glory exhibit at the Los Angeles County Museum. She also gave a rundown of the upcoming programs

Jan presented a special badge to Harriet for her acceptance into the touring Hoffman quilts made from the challenge fabric.

Jan also showed the signature quilt she is making to raffle made from the charm squares, signatures of our speakers, Mary Ellen's hearts and some marbelized fabric.

Marty announced that Zetta Hanna had three quilts pictured in Quilting Today (vol.#22) for which she received \$50.00 for each of the charm triangle, Christmas tree hearts and Christmas Ohio star quilts.

Susan Cochran passed signup sheets to subscribe to Traditional Quiltworks and Quilting Today. This will be a half price rate if ten or more members sign up to obtain the magazine for quilters.

Carol conducted the door prize raffle. Sherrie Collins won the book, Barbara Maxwell won the nuts and Rae Rigby won the material.

For the Flying Geese strips 28 people made 56 strips which were won by Laura Alarid. Maggie Godwin announced that those people who did blocks for 9 out of 11 months are in the running for GRAND BLOCK OF THE MONTH drawing. So far, 6 and possibly 2 more people are eligible.
