County Fair has categories for quilts etc. Should the Guild sponsor a prize? Members will check with Earl Warren officials about this possibility.


Judy Stanton will audit the books this year.

The Coastal Quilters Guild began in 1988 with eight founding members. The Guild has now grown to over 300 members. We are grateful to Santa Barbara City College for offering such an excellent selection of quilting classes through the SBCC Adult Education programs. It is largely due to participation in these classes that our membership has continued to grow and our love of quilting has spread.

The skills learned in the adult education quilting classes benefit the community-at-large in interesting ways. Each year our Guild adopts various philanthropic organizations.
