The time is here! All the planning is now falling into place and the nuts & bolts work has to be done.


HOW CAN YOU HELP? Glad that you asked. If you have not yet become involved, we need:

- 4) display hangers we need lots of help hanging and setting up the show We will be setting up Tuesday thru Thursday. (Husbands & significant others help welcomed!)







1990 NATURE CHALLENGE PARTICIPANTS


If you participated in the challenge and have not yet received forms for the quilt show, please contact Jan Inouye (962-3498). In order to prepare your quilt, you need to :


BRAIDED BORDERS by John Flynn or other books on interesting borders that I might borrow? Thanks Rebecca Mealey (966-1429).
