

BASTE IN



FUTURE WORKSHOP: Our October speaker, DANITA RAFALOVICH agreed to come a second time to Santa Barbara to conduct a Saturday workshop, November 9, 1991 called RUBBER STAMPING ON FABRIC at the Goleta Valley Community Center 9:30 - 4:00. PLEASE NOTE THE LATER START TIME of 9:30 AM. Sign-ups begin at the September meeting.

- 1. Sign-ups are usually scheduled two months in advance. Do NOT sign up unless you have your check or money at the time of sign-up. Look for the workshop chair, Jan Inouye who should have the sign up sheet on a clipboard with her at the meetings.
- 2. When you sign up, pick up your supply list at the same time.
- 3. If you are NOT at the meeting to sign up, send the check and a SASE (self-addressed stamped envelop) in the mail to <u>Jan Inouye</u>, 124 N. Salinas, Santa Barbara, 93103. It is helpful to leave a message that a check is coming (962-3498), but until the check arrives, your name will NOT be added to the class list. When your check arrives, you will be sent a supply list via your SASE.
- 4. The first sign-up at the guild meeting is open to all members for the whole month until the next meeting. If there is more signed up than the class size limit (determined by the visiting teacher), we will have a lottery at the end of the next meeting. If you are not at the meeting, you will be notified by phone.
- 5. If, after the first month of sign-up, the class is NOT full, those students already on the list are automatically in the class and the remaining names will be added on a first come, first serve basis according to check/money arrival until we reach the class size limit.




