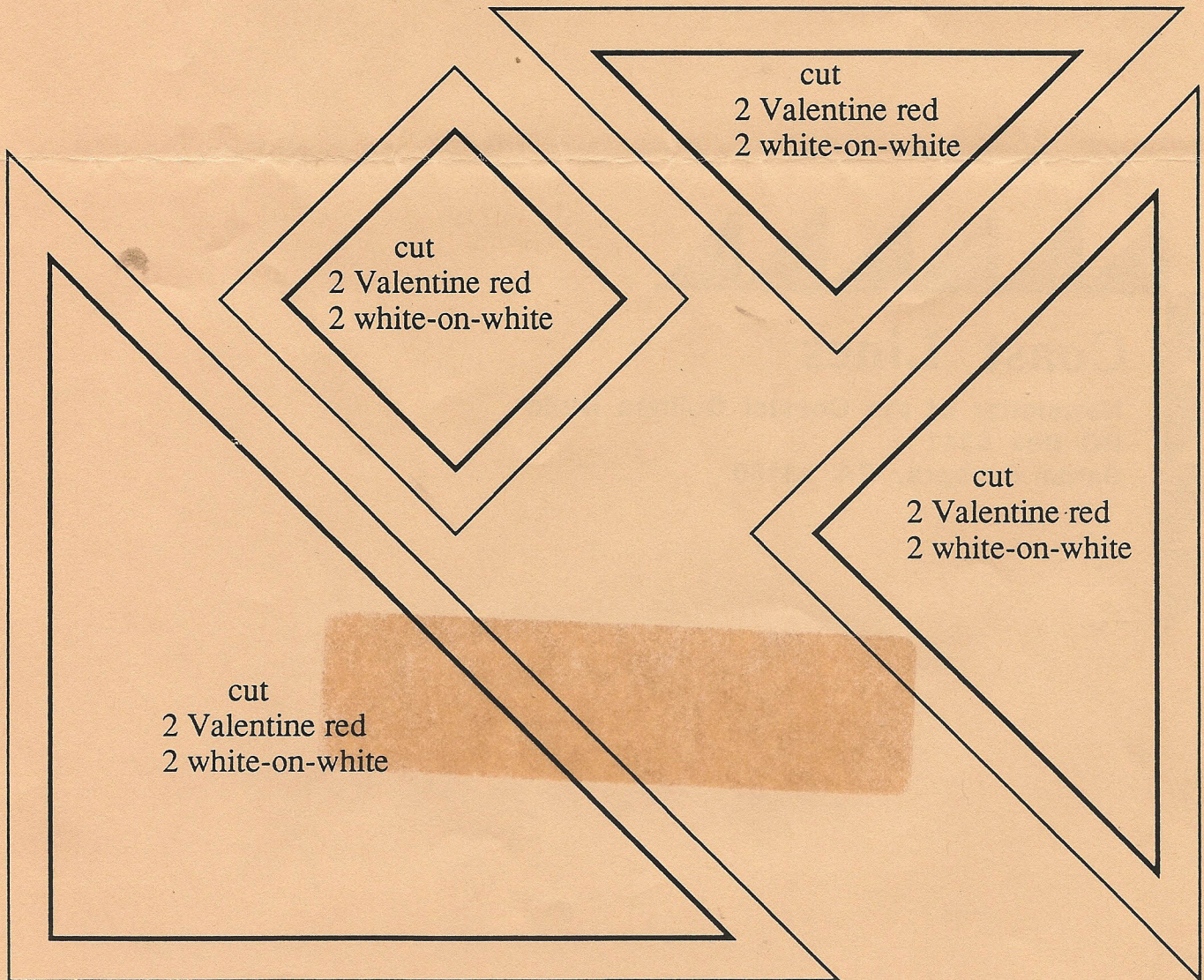
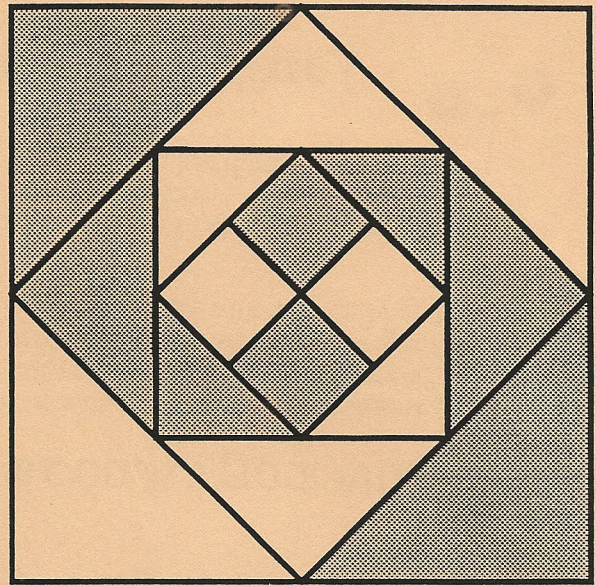

to Traditional American Quilt Patterns

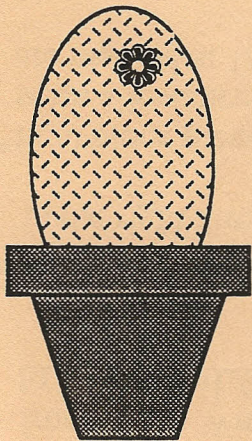
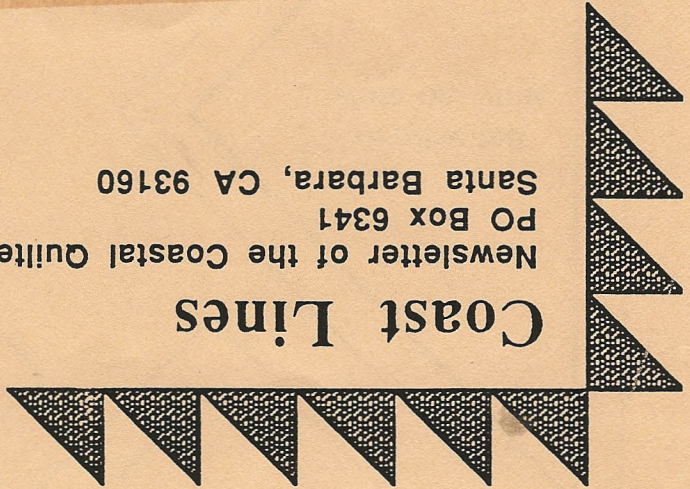
\* Make sure your block "spirals"
