

Sewing supplies: pins, needles, thread, seam ripper, scissors, marking pen, etc.


Fabrics, any washable types: cottons, polys, blends, cheater cloth

Quilts must be 54 in. wide and 96 in. long to fit oversized bunkbeds.


BLOCK OF THE MONTH




When I saw this wonderful little frog in the Fall 1991 issue of Quiltmaker, I was certain he would be fun for block of the month.


Select two fabrics - frog green and water blue. From the green fabric cut 2 B's, 2 C's, one F, and two G's. From the blue fabric cut one A, two C's, two D's, two G's, 3 E's and 3 E-reversed. Refer to the diagram for placement


Since blue and green are close on the color wheel, use fabrics with different values (such as light blue, with dark green). Also vary the visual texture of your fabrics.






