

Please bring your quilt to the October meeting in a plain bag – by 7pm. Include filled—out entry form. (Entry forms will be distributed at the September meeting. If you don't get one in September, forms will be available when you bring your quilt in October.) If your quilt is signed on the back, please pin a blank piece of paper over the signature to guarantee anonymity. The Challenge committee will meet you by the meeting room door to accept your quilt

If you haven't started your entry quilt, you still have **four weeks!** Don't miss out on the fun.

The Rules

- 1. Quilt size: the length of the perimeter may range from 120" to 144" e.g. from 24" x 36" to 36" x 36", or any combination that equals the above perimeter.
- 2. At least 30% of the quilt front must be in colors of yellow, yellow-orange, and/or orange. This does not include tints such as cream or peach, nor does it include tones such as khaki or brown in other words, recognizable yellow, yellow-orange, and/or orange.

Archival Storage — Have you been searching for ways to store your valuable textiles? Archival supplies offer the most lasting way to make sure that your precious fabrics do not age or discolor from contact with acids found in papers and cardboard. Light Impressions, a photographic supply catalog (phone 800–828–6216, fax 800–828–5539) offers these products:

Textile Storage Box. Corrugated boxes with covers. Dimensions 18"x30"x6¼" and 18"x40"x6¼".

Artifact Carton/Records Storage Box. Corrugated, hold legal or letter-size file folders, with compartment dividers or trays. Dimensions 13 1/8"x16 5/8"x10"/4".


Heirloom Fabric Box Kits. Corrugated box, archival tissue, polyethylene bag, reusable desiccant.


Garment Size 17"x29"x6" and Quilt Size 17"x39"x6".

PolyCorrugated Cartons. Made of chemically stable polypropylene, water-resistant.


Document Box 16"x11"x6" Letter/Legal Box 16½"x12"x10" Letter Stor Box 24½"x13"x11"




