

Maple Leaf

10 1/2" Unfinished

Since Nature doesn't provide us with lovely Autumn leaves to see in Southern California, let's make our own! Make the **leaf and stem in a print fabric** in the colors of Fall - reds, oranges, golds, etc. The stem can be in the same or a different fabric. Use a **solid color for the background** around leaf in colors of the sky - from dawn to midnight.

For the leaf -

Cut 3 - 3 3/4" squares of the print or 3 of A


Cut 2 - 4 1/8" squares of print, cut in half diagonally or 4 of B


Cut 1 - 1 1/4" x 4" strip for stem or 1 of C


For the background -


Cut 2 - 3-3/4" squares of solid color or 2 of A

Cut 2 - 4 1/8" squares of solid color, cut in half diagonally or 4 of B
