START with a 7 inch muslin square as a foundation. The block will be 6 1/2 inches square (to finish at 6 inches).


USE your most beautiful silks and satins, velvets and laces - CHOOSE the DARK COLORS

Recipe Corner Jeanna ThunderHawk

Baking and quilting seem to go together, they are both so warm and cozy. This seemed like the perfect recipe to start this column with as friendship is also important to us quilters. Tip: Never use anything metal when making this.

Friendship Starter

Day 1 Mix 1 cup milk, 1 cup flour and 1 cup sugar in a large ceramic or glass bowl. Use a wooden spoon. Cover loosely with plastic wrap. Leave on counter at room temp.

Days 2-5 Leave it alone to bubble.

Day 6 Stir once with wooden spoon.

Day 7 Feed with 1 cup sugar, 1 cup flour and 1 cup milk. Mix first, then add.

Days 8-9 Stir once each day.

Day 10 Feed with 1 cup sugar, 1 cup Flour and 1 cup milk. Mix first, then add.

Baking: Today you can take out 1 cup of starter for baking and 1 cup to give to a friend. Continue maintaining the starter you have left.

Here is a recipes that is sure to please the whole family!!!

Friendship Bread

Place 1 cup starter in large bowl. Add % cup oil and 3 eggs. Mix well.

Add: 2 cups flour 1 cup sugar 1 tsp baking powder ½ tsp baking soda

½ tsp salt

2 tsp cinnamon

Pour into 2 greased and cinnamon sugar coated loaf pans. Sprinkle to with more cinnamon and sugar.

Bake 350 for 40 to 50 minutes.

Information

This exhibit is a members' showcase, providing an opportunity for everyone to display their newest, best, or favorite quilt(s) at a large show. The committee urges each and every member of the Guild to submit one or more entries to this event.

Submit your written entry(ies) as soon as possible. It's not too early to reserve your place on the wall. Your quilt(s) can be currently unfinished or in process but must be completed by collection time. Every member of Coastal Quilters Guild is assured of the display of at least one quilt. Exhibit space permitting, additional quilts will be selected by lottery according to size. Please indicate the priority of the submitted entry; every effort will be made to honor your priority.

For purposes of this show, a quilt is defined as a fabric construction consisting of a front, filler layer, and back held together with stitching and made by the member-exhibitor. Cheater panels, tied quilts, and entries made from kits will not be accepted. Quilts may not have been hung at a previous CQG exhibit.

Security Arrangements: Every effort will be made to protect all quilts. Accounting and surveillance will be strictly planned and maintained. Eating and smoking are prohibited in the exhibit hall. Responsible white-gloved hostesses will try to keep all quilts in view at all times and will discourage touching by viewers. However, CQG show insurance does not cover the quilts. Each owner is responsible for insuring her own quilt(s) for loss and damage.

Label: An identifying label should be sewn securely to the quilt on the back of the lower right side stating the quilter's name, address, telephone number, and name of quilt.

Sleeve: A 4" sleeve must be attached to the back top. This provides a safe and secure means of hanging the quilt. Quilts without sleeves will not be exhibited. Sleeve construction: Cut fabric 9" by the width of the quilt less 2". Stitch a narrow hem on each end of the strip. Fold the strip in half lengthwise and stitch a 1/2" seam on the right side of the fabric, creating a long tube. Press the tube flat. Hand-stitch the top and bottom of the sleeve across the entire width of the quilt. Be sure the sleeve ends remain open for insertion of the hanging rod. Your finished tube will be approximately 4" to 4-1/2" wide.

Packaging: Each quilt should be delivered in its own pillow case with the maker's name marked in indelible ink in large letters on the hem. This will help keep the quilt clean and facilitate transport.

Details on quilt collection centers will be provided by September 1st.
