

## March 2007 Program-Judy Sisneros (www.judysisneros.com)

Judy Sisnero's lecture will be "Imagination and Inspiration," an always-changing trunk show of 40-50 of her quilts. Judy lives in Rocklin, California (east of Sacramento), so she can drive down to Santa Barbara with a car full of her beautiful quilts! She loves making quilts that are fun and easy and creative. Her book, 9 Patch Pizzazz, published by C & T Publishing in April of 2006, has been so successful that she has been asked to write another one using rectangles. It will come out in early 2008.

Judy has been sewing a long time, making quilts since 1987, and teaching since 1993.

She emphasizes originality and creativity and enjoys showing students how much they have — even when they don't think so! Her colorful easy-to-make quilts are beautiful. Check them out on her website, and don't miss this wonderful lecture.

Workshop - Nine-Patch Pizzazz Friday, March 9, 2007

This workshop is based on Judy's book, 9 Patch Pizzazz: Fast, Fun, and Finished in a Day. Using one large-scale fabric and 3 complementary fabrics, she will show us how to make a quilt top (at least!) in a day. The large-scale print is

cut into six- and twelve-inch squares, and the rest of the fabric is made up into 9-patches. The techniques used are wonderful for beginners and great fun for experienced quilters. She calls these her potato chip quilts, because you won't be satisfied with just one!

## Supply List: Workshop—Nine-Patch Pizzazz, March 9, 2007

(The Potato Chip Class - you can't make just one!)

Sewing Machine

Basic Supplies - scissors, pins, neutral thread, full bobbin, etc.

Rotary Cutter (with SHARP blade)

Cutting mat at least 24"

Rulers: 6-1/2" square, 12-1/2" square, 24" ruler

VERY Important! WHITE fleece or flannel for design surface, attached to foam core board large enough for your design. Size: AT LEAST 32" x 40"

FABRIC: 1-1/2 yards large-scale print (landscape, floral, etc.)

1/2 yard each of 2 or 3 coordinating fabrics (not solids)

Bring one fabric to highlight one of the colors in the large-scale print.

OPTIONAL: Judy has lots of kits available in various themes for \$30, including 2-1/2 yards fabric. To pre-order, visit her website, and she'll put your name on it and set it aside. She will bring a good assortment to the workshop.

# Santa Barbara Connection Block-of-the-Month

## April


Block of the Month - April Palm Leaf

#### Palm Leaf

Finished 6" x 6" Make in two paper pieced sections.

Use a light blue sky fabric in the background and a darker green texture for the palm leaves.

Trace the pattern and trace one pattern in reverse onto tracing paper. Complete two paper-pieced sections for one palm leaf. Press seams in one direction on one side and in the other direction on the other half. Sew the two halves together down the center, matching seams. Press center seam open. Carefully remove paper. Make an extra one for your own Santa Barbara sampler.




