

Linda will bring quilts made

Basically this is just a way to show people what can be done with 'scrap squares,' whether it's squares or cut into smaller pieces. Along with the quilts that Linda will bring, she will have a 'treat' for everyone, so everyone will go home with something!

Don't wait to cut your fabrics—if you do it at the last minute, you won't want to participate because it's too much work. Bring the kind of fabric squares you would like to receive: nice quality cottons, and no dawgs! Be thinking about your ten fabric squares


HARVEST OF COLORS - 2008







Around the Block...News from Block-of-the-Month

April's Palm Leaf pattern inspired 22 blocks by 21 participants. Francine Smith was the lucky winner. There is still time to make the May Mountains Block for the next meeting, so check out your scrap stash and get sewing!

The June Solstice Sun block is really fun to make. In fact it was so much fun for Karen Pickford that she was inspired to do an entire quilt! It is a Dresden Plate pattern and is somewhat more complicated than our previous blocks, but is not really hard if you carefully follow the directions. The display board at the meeting will have step-by-step examples and explanation, so be sure to stop by and take a look. Hint for July: This ocean mammal is practically the Santa Barbara mascot.

Supply List: Linda Ballard's May Workshop - "Autumn Stars"

The Linda Ballard workshop on May 11th is called "Autumn Stars." You can hand select the fabric for this quilt, making a scrap quilt, a multi-colored quilt, or a quilt with a color theme or line of fabrics. Yardage needed is minimal: one size is being offered in the class, but it can easily be adapted to a larger size. When you sign up for the workshop, you will be given a detailed list of supplies and yardage needed. Linda will share loads of super techniques with you for making this and other quilts. The skill level for the workshop is beginner-plus to advanced.

Supply List: Rob Appell's June Workshop— "Under Watercolor Quilts" (805) 772-2646 ext. 11, rob@thecottonball.com

This class will focus on the creation of a watercolor style background in the theme of the coral reefs. We will then have the option of applique and/or trapunto work on top of our background. We will be using 2" fusible grid interfacing as our base.

To determine how much grid is needed, figure the finished size of the quilt. Subtract the borders, then divide the size by 1.5. This will give the amount of squares you be using in your layout. If the number has a remainder, either round the number of squares needed up or down.

Supplies Needed:

2" Fusible grid interfacing – Enough for your background layout. (See formula above). 1/4 yards of the following fabrics, all pre-cut into 2" squares.

Please choose multiple fabrics of the following for color variation.

Outer space

Stars

Sky

Water

Waves

Underwater

Several Reef/rocks

Any thing that has good color variation

Please pre-cut all your background fabrics into 2" squares

Fabrics for applique, NOT pre-cut into 2" squares. Please use your judgment for yardage

Fish

Waves

Rocks

Corals

Batiks- large color range

A few yards fusible web, I recommend "Heat and Bond Lite"

Basic sewing supplies: Rotary cutter, ruler and matt, Sewing machine is optional.

Santa Barbara Connection Block-of-the-Month

Instructions for "Solstice Sun"

Fabrics:

- 1 background square of light to medium blue fabric, cut 11" to 12" square
- 12 "wedge" shapes cut from 5 or more "scraps" of yellow fabrics, ranging from light yellow, to bright yellow, to gold (batiks work beautifully think sun shine!)
- 1 Circle shape cut from a different bright yellow or gold



Cutting:

Make freezer paper templates of each pattern piece. (You will only need one template of each, as you can use them over again.) On the "wedge," mark the inside stitching lines also, as shown on the pattern. Press wedge template to fabric (up to 4 layers stacked.) Align the ¼" mark on ruler with stitching line on pattern and cut. This is more accurate than lining up with the edge, since the edge can be trimmed away with subsequent cuttings. Press circle template to wrong side of fabric and cut out, leaving a ¼" margin around the edge to turn under when appliqueing.

Machine stitching:


Fold right sides of wedge together and stitch across the top, taking a backstitch or two at the fold. Trim a notch in seam at the folded edge. Carefully press seam open with tip of iron. Turn point inside out and use pointed object (not too sharp) to pop out the tip. Center the seam in back and press, using a bit of sizing, to form an evenly angled point.

Arrange wedges in any way that pleases you. Stitch sides together starting at the fold (taking a back-stitch or two) and going toward the small end. Stitch sets of 3 to form quarter blocks, then quarters together to form halves, and halves to form wholes. Press seams open. Turn block face up and add sizing to entire block. Trim out bulk in points, leaving at least 1/4" turned under.

Appliqué to background block:


Fold 11-12" square background block in half and crease, then fold in quarters and crease, to form registration lines. Center the "sun" on the background block, with the seams of the sun block lining up with the creases of the background block. Pin in place, then hand appliqué the outer edge. Hand appliqué the center circle over the hole in the middle, being sure it is centered. If you would prefer to machine appliqué, use invisible thread and a hemming stitch on your machine.

Press, but do not trim the block when finished. The winner can then trim the blocks as needed.
