

She creates modern art quilts saturated with color, stitched texture, and beaded embellishment. Check out her web site at www.chameleonquilts.com and you'll see her glorious creations. Her workshop on the Friday following the guild meeting is *The Need to Bead* and covers all beading techniques; this is hand beading, no machine is required.



Community Quilts

This diagram shows the layout and measurements of the Sudoku quilt that was shown at the September meeting. Check back next month when we will share some more ideas for blocks that fit into these dimensions.

Sudoku finishes to 60" wide x 78" long (drawing NOT to scale)



December Block of the Month: Winter Butterfly

Directions

Winner will trim the blocks as desired.

Using your preferred appliqué technique, appliqué the "wings" to your background (in any arrangement you desire, as long as you leave a margin around the edges for trimming and seaming).


For our block this month, we want you to be creative. You may choose to use the "spots" shown on the pattern, but feel free to make up your own butterfly design and appliqué your own spots. Or you may find a fabric that does most of the work for you. Your butterfly can be realistic or fanciful, subtle or colorful.

Add the center body and embroider the antennae and your block is complete.

Fabric

Cut a 12" square of background fabric.

- If the main part of your butterfly will be dark, use a light blue fabric (think of the butterfly in the sky)
- If the main part of your butterfly will be light, use a medium to dark green (think of the butterfly on a bush)
