- Photo-Inspired Art Quilts: From Composition to Finished Piece (Wiener/Zieman w/DVD) Long Beach had gorgeous sliced-photo group quilts! This book covers how to identify a good photo for a quilt, translate it into a fabric collage, and embellish it with thread painting, machine appliqué and fabric collage.
- · Viva Venezia!: Timeless Quilts Inspired by Italian Mosaic Floors (Porter) Until Norah Mc-Meeking writes another book. . .

Halloween is the first of many holidays between October and March that can give your challenge quilt an extra spark. Your quilt might wind up a cherished decoration for your favorite holiday. Who knows?

Halloween jack o'lanterns, trick or treat bags, ghosts with pockets in their sheets, or witches carrying sacks of goodies as they swoop across the night sky can all be part of a quilt adorned with black and orange postage stamp garlands.

Veterans' Day gives a chance to do a patriotic quilt, while Thanksgiving abounds with pilgrims, Indians, turkeys and cornucopias.

Hanukkah menorahs and dreidels come first this year, and then Christmas with trees and stockings galore. And then theres Kwanzaa with its gorgeous African fabrics, bountiful food items, and its celebration of family with gratitude for the harvest.

New Year's celebrations, football games, and resolutions would sparkle with silvery and blue postage stamps, pigskin pockets and your resolution to guilt more, clean less in 2010. The New Year also brings Valentine's Day, Lincoln's and Washington's birthdays, St. Patrick's Day, and Easter. Some of these are after your challenge quilt is due--but, hey, if you love one of these holidays go for it.

Postage stamps can ramble through any of these holidays, especially in colors we associate with them. Community Quilts Project

This year the Community Quilts Project will be working with two agencies. Hospice, as we know, works to bring support to individuals who are nearing the end of their life and assists their family members through their loss. Hospice is appreciative of quilts of all sizes as they service every age group. If you might be thinking about a wheelchair lap quilt, suggested ize is 36" x 60". For a smaller project, consider creating a narrower quilt to be used as a shawl.

We are also working with the Assistance League of Santa Barbara's Fostering Friends Project. These quilts are being requested for teenagers who are in the process of leaving foster care as emancipated adults. The Assistance League works to provide them some very basic items which are presented at an annual June ceremony, acknowledging this life change. Our donation will be part of a package to get them started in independent living. The Fostering Friends Project coordinators shared that the quilts are treasured by the teenagers and make their way to the top of their bed. For this Guild donation, we are using 50" x 70" as a large lap quilt quide.

At our September meeting, it was exciting to have such a warm, enthusiastic response to the Community Quilts Project. Thank you for providing fabric, offering to donate quilts and taking kits that will challenge your creativity. Based on your requests, we will do our best to provide batting and some backing fabric. If you don't have time to make a quilt from beginning to end, look through your UFOs. You might find the perfect piece begging to find a home through our Community Quilts Project.

Both Hospice and the Assistance League are working with individuals who are in major life transitions. Again, thank you for supporting these agencies' work and please come visit us at the next Guild meeting.

Quilt Show 2010

Believe it or not, we are a year away from our next Harvest of Colors Quilt Show. That means that you have a few things to add to your "to do" list, namely 1) make a quilt, 2) sign up to help with the planning committee and 3) start thinking about where you would like to volunteer if you are not on the planning committee.

There are a few spots remaining to be filled on the committee.

Graphic Artist – we are looking for someone with graphic experience for the design and production of our Quilt Show poster. We have some great ideas – and a wonderful featured artist – to inspire your creativity! (This is not a committee position, but a job that needs to be done quite soon.)

Public Relations (local) – this person, or group, will be responsible for distribution of bookmarks and posters to California quilt shows, local stores and venues, as well as setting up special displays (library) or events (1st Thursday) to publicize our show to a local audience.

Sponsor Coordinator – this person, or group, will seek vendors, stores, or individuals who would like to advertise in our program.

Hanging – this person, or group, is responsible for making sure the quilts are displayed properly at the show (for full description, please contact me). There are a few things that need to be arranged soon, but most of this work will be done during the last month and day before the show.

Vice-Chair – I would like to have a "right hand person" to assist me in keeping organized and handling details that need to be done during the work week (when I'm otherwise employed).

We had a very productive budget planning meeting on September 12th. However, we came to the realization that with costs going up and the uncertainty of the economy we have our work cut out for us to make this a truly successful and profitable endeavor. We will be putting our heads together to come up with creative ways to increase the attendance at our show.

We also planned our future Quilt Show meetings, which will be held on the Saturday after the Guild meeting in all except a couple of months. If you would like a full listing of meeting dates, please contact me at kjpickford@cox.net.

Since our show is a "Members Showcase," we have asked our very own Norah McMeeking to be our Featured Artist at the 2010 show – and she said YES! We are currently working on some fun ideas to feature her talent, and that of her students, at the show.

A Brief History of Our Guild

Coastal Quilters Guild of Santa Barbara and Goleta is a California non-profit, educational and charitable organization. It was officially organized in 1988 after two years of informal monthly gatherings of women interested in quilts and quiltmaking. Marty Frolli, one of the original six members, became its first president in 1988.

As its membership increased, the Guild rapidly outgrew its original meeting place at the Goleta Public Library, moving first to Samarkand Retirement Home in the San Roque area of Santa Barbara, and then to its present meeting location at St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church on Auhay Drive in Santa Barbara.

In 1989 the Guild was asked to participate in the Goleta Valley Days Celebration, now called the Lemon Festival. As a result, the Guild's first quilt show was held at the Goleta Valley Community Center. The show was such a success that it was repeated in 1990 and 1991, along with an exhibit of quilts at the July 4th celebrations at the historic Stow House in Goleta in 1988 through 1990.

Numerous other local quilt exhibits sponsored by the Guild were held, including "Fantaseas" in 1991 at the Santa Barbara Sea Center, "From Traditional to Contemporary" in 1991 at the Santa Barbara Public Library, and "Quilts and Quilt Stories" in 1992 at the Goleta Public Library.

The Guild's first large juried show, "Natural Impressions I," was held in 1991 at the Santa Barbara Museum of Natural History, coinciding with the Museum's 75th Anniversary Celebration. The Guild made a quilt depicting the history and exhibits of the museum, which hung there during and after the show. "Natural Impressions II" followed in 1995, also hanging at the Santa Barbara Museum of Natural History. Beginning in the fall of 1998, the Guild has held biennial members' showcases under the name "Harvest of Colors" at the Earl Warren Showgrounds in Santa Barbara. These are juried shows and also feature an array of vendors, as well as a Gift Boutique with items made exclusively by Guild members. More recent shows have also featured a selected Guest Artist who enjoys national acclaim.

We are very dedicated in our commitment to philanthropic support for our community. Each year the Community Quilts Committee selects one or more local charitable organizations to receive quilts or other specialty items made by CQG members. In past years, quilts have been donated to the Women's Shelter, Transition House, Hospice, The Linus Project, Santa Barbara Cottage Hospital's Neo-Natal Center, The Unity Shop, The Teddy Bear Cancer Foundation and many other community organizations.

To commemorate our 20th anniversary in 2008, the Guild received a "Certificate of Special Congressional Recognition" for outstanding public service to the community signed by 23rd Congressional District Representative Lois Capps, U.S. House of Representatives-D. The Guild also received a "Letter of Recognition" from the City of Santa Barbara signed by Mayor Marty Blum, honoring our service to the community through the donation of quilts and other items to local nonprofit organizations, as well as providing historical information and education on quilting through monthly meetings and monetary support to Santa Barbara City College/Adult Education Quilting Classes.

The Guild's fiscal year originally followed the calendar year, but in 2008 was changed to run from July 1 through June 30 of the following year. Our past presidents are:



Block of the Month for November




TURKEY TRACKS

Block of the Month - November 2009

Time to make tracks... turkey tracks that is! The fifth installment in our "Quilted Calendar" Block of the Month is a Fall inspired block with Thanksgiving in mind. Make one of these quick and easy blocks for Guild and maybe a few extra for a Thanksgiving table runner - but don't forget a spare for your own Quilted Calender!

FABRIC:



ASSEMBLY:

CORNER SQUARES UNITS (make four) -

Draw a diagonal line on wrong side of (C) squares. Place right sides together with (D) squares and stitch 1/4" from both sides of diagonal line. Cut apart on drawn line, press to the dark. Cut once again on a diagonal but this time perpendicular to the stitched line. This becomes your (C-D) component. Sew these to the two sides of each (E) square as indicated, pressing toward the (C-D) side.

Cut the (F) squares in half on the diagonal. Now attach this to the (C-D-E) component to complete the 4 1/2" corner square unit.

Complete the remainder of the block as shown, block should measure 12 1/2" square.
