The Doorway Challenge 2012 Coastal Quilters Challenge

Still undecided on a theme for the 2012 Doorway Challenge quilt? Let us suggest another option: **A FOCUS FABRIC**

Wander through all those fabulous fabrics in your stash and let one come to you. It could be that fabric so beautiful that you cannot take your eyes off it, or it could be that quirky, fun fabric you picked up on a whim. It could also be that fabric that's really not you, but something said, "Buy me." It could be batik, Asian, reproduction, ethnic, or...

Ok, you have the basis for your challenge. So what do you do now?

- How about going scrappy?
- How about doing a color blend?
- How about going mostly or all monochromatic?

Come see our new monochromatic quilt sample this month! (An added hint: your framework does not have to be the same fabric.)

The Doorway Challenge Requirements

1. The entry must be a quilt of 3 layers and quilted by hand or machine.

2. Entry must hang in the vertical orientation. The perimeter of the quilt is limited to 134" or less.

3. Entry must be readily recognizable as a derivative of the door pattern presented:

- The quilt may represent a door itself or depict areas within or outside of a door
- Units and framework may be made larger or smaller. Units within the frames may be added or deleted.

• Borders may be added, as long as the perimeter does not exceed 134".(Pattern + 2" borders = 134".)

4. The door pattern must be used on the front of the quilt.

5. Appliqué and embellishments are encouraged.

6. Only 1 entry per member. A 4" hanging sleeve must be sewn to the back of each entry. Please cover any identifying quilt label. Quilts must be submitted in a labeled pillow case and accompanied by a completed entry form.

In fairness to all participants, only entries that meet the challenge requirements will be accepted. Although we encourage visiting guests at the presentation, voting will be restricted to members only.

1 yard total of one or more fabrics for background.

1 yard total of one or more fabrics for framework.

1 yard for backing 1/4 yard for binding




Amazon rewards are back!

Block of the Month for January **KEEP IT SCRAPPY: WINTER SNOWFLAKES**

January's "not guite so scrappy" block portrays the cold days of

winter. It brings to mind a quiet blanket of snowflakes covering the ground after the busy holiday season. You will only use two fabrics....a pale blue (think of ice or a pale winter sky) and a white background (think freshly fallen snow).



FABRIC:



Background: One white fabric



Scraps: One pale blue fabric

CUTTING:

From background fabric: Cut 5 squares 3" and cut 8 squares 3 3/8" From pale blue fabric: Cut 5 squares 3" and cut 8 squares 3 3/8"

ASSEMBLY:

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the 3 3/8" background squares. Match these 8 background squares with the 8 – 3 3/8" pale blue squares right sides together. Stitch 1/4" from both sides of the diagonal line. Cut apart on the diagonal line. Press and trim to 3″.

Lay out the squares as shown in the diagram and piece together to form the block. The block should be 13" square.

Following this method, you will not have any leftover half squaretriangles but you may still want to make multiple blocks to increase your chance to win! (Just please remember to submit an entry slip for each block you make!)

Challenge Requirements

- 1. The entry must be a quilt of 3 layers and quilted by the participant by hand or machine.
- 2. Entry must hang in the vertical orientation. The perimeter of the quilt is limited to 134" or less.
- 3. Entry must be readily recognizable as a derivative of the doorway pattern presented. The quilt may represent a door itself or depict areas within or outside of a door. Units and framework may be made larger or smaller. Units within the frames may be added or deleted. Borders may be added, as long as the perimeter does not exceed 134". (Pattern + 2" borders = 134")
- 4. The door pattern must be used on the front of the quilt.
- 5. Appliqué and embellishments are encouraged.
- 6. Only 1 entry per member.

A 4" hanging sleeve must be sewn to the back of each entry.

Please cover any identifying quilt label.

Quilts must be submitted in a labeled pillow case and accompanied by a completed entry form.

In fairness to all participants, only entries that meet the challenge requirements will be accepted. Although we encourage visiting guests at the presentation, voting will be restricted to memers only.
