## June Speaker: Virginia Walton

### *Creative Curves Quilting System*

Virginia Walton, quilt designer, author and inventor of the *Creative Curves Quilting System and Rulers*, is an international teacher, who regularly teaches in the United States, Europe, the United Kingdom and Australia. She is known for her easy "no pins" curved piecing techniques. Virginia recently finished her 10th book and has written numerous articles for both national and international magazines, including *The Quilter Magazine*.



Virginia's quilting journey began over 25 years ago. She didn't want to quilt by hand. In 1976 the sewing machine became a popular way to both piece and quilt, thus began her lifelong addiction, avocation and business. She is the inventor of the *Creative Curves Rulers* (circular curves), the *Creative Curves Ellipse Rulers* (oval curves) and the *Creative Curves Kaleidoscope Ruler*. Her specialties include easy sewing machine techniques and color or fabric selection (how to combine fabric to create the effect desired in a quilt).

Her television appearances include Kaye Woods' *Quilting With Friends* and the PBS Show *Creative Woman*. In addition, her quilts can be seen on Georgia Bonsteel's *Lap Quilting with Georgia Bonsteel* television show.



### June 15 Workshop: *Curved Circular Whirlpool*

This workshop will use Virginia's special ruler, which makes the curves easy to complete. She has a new "multi-angle" wedge ruler. The Unity Shoppe has become the "Central Distribution Facility" for more than 300 agencies, churches, schools, non-profit organizations, clubs and businesses to avoid duplication of services.

## Quilt Show News

It's hard to believe, but we are only a few months away from the 2012 Harvest of Colors Quilt Show. In this final period leading up to the show, plans move into full gear and there is much to be done. Please join our team by volunteering to fill the various roles needed.

In this month's newsletter, you will find the entry form for the Quilt Show. In the interest of saving paper and postage, this will be the only newsletter in which we publish the form. However, it will be available on the website and at the check-in table at guild meetings. Each entry requires a separate form, and forms for wearables can be obtained from Joann Conklin.

### Volunteers

At the June Meeting, Cathe Hedrick will begin taking sign-ups for the volunteer positions needed at the show and in the weeks leading up to the show. Remember that members who volunteer to work at the show (or before) receive free entrance for the entire show. And remember the saying "Many hands make small work." If you are not attending the guild meeting, you may also contact Cathe by email to sign up for your desired position.

### Tickets

Pre-sale tickets are available at the guild meeting or through our website. Please encourage your friends to purchase tickets early to receive a discount of \$2 per ticket. Pre-sale tickets are \$8 – at the door, they will be \$10.

### Photography

We have opted not to have DVDs for sale at our 2012 show, but would like to have photos taken to be included on our website soon after the show is over. If you know of a photographer who would be willing to help with this task, please contact me so that this can be arranged. We would like the quality of the photos to be as professional as possible. Members will have the option of not having their quilts photographed for the website.

### Sponsors

We still have a need for an individual or small team to help with procuring sponsorships and advertising for our program. One idea is to contact local restaurants to advertise in the program, giving attendees an idea of where to eat in the area. Another idea is to contact businesses that might be interested in becoming sponsors at the show – and listed as such in our program and in certain areas of the show. These could be quilt-related businesses, members who wish to act as a sponsor or any local business.

### Special Displays

We have reserved the library display cases at both Santa Barbara Central and Goleta libraries for the month of September and need a small team who would be willing to set up the displays at the beginning of September. This would include gathering small quilts (could also use some of the Community Quilts), making signs and creating an attractive display at each of these sites. We would also like to find shop windows that would display small quilts along with our posters. In 2010, we were able to display quilts at Chaucer's and at Front Page, but would like to expand to a few more this year.

## Quilt Judging Course Returns!

A course on Judging Quilts and Wearable Art will be offered at Pacific International Quilt Festival (PIQF) 2012. Experienced quilt judges Helen Powell, Jody Ohrt and Dawn Licker have teamed up to form the West Coast Quilt Judging Academy. The goals of the West Coast Quilt Judging Academy are to train qualified quilt judges and to expand the numbers of knowledgeable judges on the west coast.

The course will include three days of instruction by experienced judges and quilters, including Elizabeth Marrs and Diane Perin Hock. Students will learn through lectures, demonstrations and multiple "hands-on" mock judging exercises. They will emerge from the course with the skills to enter the judging arena with knowledge, professionalism and confidence. Each student completing the course will be added to WCQJA's published list of trained quilt judges. The course will be taught at PIQF from October 10 to 13, 2012.




## Block of the Month for July

### OLD GLORY STAR

Heart and Flag combine to express our patriotism in this red, white and blue July Block of the Month. Try to think "American Flag" when you choose the colors for your block.



### FABRIC:



White fabric



Red fabric



Blue fabric

### CUTTING:

- Cut 2 red and 2 blue  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.
- Cut 1 red and 1 white  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles.
- Cut 1 blue and 1 white  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles.
- Cut 4 blue, 1 red and 5 white  $2\frac{7}{8}$ " squares.
- Cut 1 white  $6\frac{7}{8}$ " square.
- Cut 1 red  $9\frac{1}{4}$ " square.

### ASSEMBLY:

Place 3 blue and white  $2\frac{7}{8}$ " squares right sides together. Draw a diagonal line across the wrong side of the white squares. Stitch  $\frac{1}{4}$ " on each side of the diagonal line. Cut on the diagonal line. Place 1 red and white square right sides together. Draw a diagonal line across the white square. Stitch  $\frac{1}{4}$ " on each side of the diagonal line. 8 half square triangles made. Press them open.

Draw a diagonal line across the wrong side of a white and blue  $2\frac{7}{8}$ " square. Cut on the line. Discard  $\frac{1}{2}$  of each. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the white  $6\frac{7}{8}$ " square. Cut on the diagonal line. Draw 2 diagonal lines (an X) on the red  $9\frac{1}{4}$ " square. Cut on the diagonal lines. Keep one triangle. Discard the other 3.

Following the diagram, stitch the first 4 rows of pieces together. Sew the red triangle onto the fourth row. Sew the white triangles on last. You should now have a  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " block.
