Quilt Show News

We're nearing the end of our journey; the *Harvest of Colors* Quilt Show is just around the corner! The committee has been working hard to ensure that we have a fabulous show this year, but they can't do it alone. Remember that this is our only major fundraiser this year, and the proceeds support guild activities over the course of the next two years. At this stage all of the pieces are falling into place, but we still need quilt Entries, volunteers and attendees.

Quilt Entries

The entry form for all show items (Quilts, Wearables, Satellite Group Quilts and Challenge quilts) is **due August 9** — our next Guild meeting! As of our last planning meeting, there were only a few entries! Hopefully, like me, you will be turning in your forms and photos at the last minute. This is a "member's showcase" and we want entries from as many members as possible. It doesn't have to be your latest creation (if you can't get it done in time); the main rule is that it has not been in a previous Harvest of Colors show.

Volunteers

The volunteer sign-up sheets will be available at the next two guild meetings and we encourage you to sign up for more than one shift, if possible. Boutique participants have a separate sign-up sheet, and this does not count toward your free admission to the show. There are also many opportunities to help that are not listed on the sign-up sheets. We need people to set up displays around town, hang posters, deliver posters and postcards to distant quilt shops and a variety of other things. Please email me if you can help!

Attendees

Last, but certainly not least, we need people to come to our show. Please spread the word at every available opportunity. Now is the

time for people to begin marking their calendars. And so that they don't change their minds at the last minute and not show up, we are encouraging people to buy tickets in advance, and save \$2. Collect money from your friends and purchase their tickets for them at the next two guild meetings (August and September). And if your budget allows, please consider purchasing your own ticket in advance, even if you are volunteering to help with the show. Remember, the proceeds help the guild bring you all of the fun activities and amazing speakers we enjoy throughout the year. Be sure to print out our Car Window Advertisement from our website and put in a visible place in your car for people to see as you drive around town. We will try to have some of these available at the next guild meeting as well.

Once again, I'd like to thank my committee for doing a spectacular job of pulling this show together. Now, I've got to get back to finishing my quilts for the show!

Quilt Show Judging

Judging of quilts for Harvest of Colors will take place Wednesday, September 19 at the Goleta Valley Community Center. The guild would like to encourage you to have your quilt judged. The most valuable result of doing this is to receive the judge's comment. Andrea Perejda is a National Quilt Association certified judge with considerable experience in judging shows. Yes, she has her own style and friends in Santa Barbara, but she is a professional with experience in putting her own tastes aside in order to expertly judge the quality of fine quilts. So you do not think your quilt is "perfect" enough to compete with the most experienced and excellent quilters in our guild? How do you think they got started? They did it by showing their work, having their quilts evaluated by objective judges, taking the comments to heart and striving to do better next time. If you make a cake and it collapses, do you never make a cake again? I bet you learn from the experience and move on. As quilters, we strive to have a good time quilting, take pride in our work and do the best we can. We take classes when we can, learn the basics and then learn more. As with all of life, we capitalize on our strengths and have a good time doing it.

Now, more of the basics: The judging categories are on the quilt application. They are Traditional, Innovative, Art, Mixed, New Quilter and Wearable. The application briefly describes each category, so check it out. Choose the category that best describes your quilt.

The judging committee does reserve the right to change the category of your quilt. This is done infrequently but may be done to move a quilt from one category with a large number of quilts to another with fewer quilts to give you a better chance to receive a ribbon. Every effort will be made to contact you and explain the change.

Block of the Month for September

CROW'S NEST

This is really going to be scrappy. The dark triangles are the crows standing on the edge of the nest ready to fly away.

CUTTING:

- Cut 4: 2½" x 10½" medium light fabric
- Cut 13: 2½" squares
 - Cut 8 Another Dark Fabric
 - Cut 5 Light Fabric
- Cut 4: 4-7/8" squares
 - 2 Light Fabric
 - 2 Dark Fabric

FABRIC:



Light Fabric



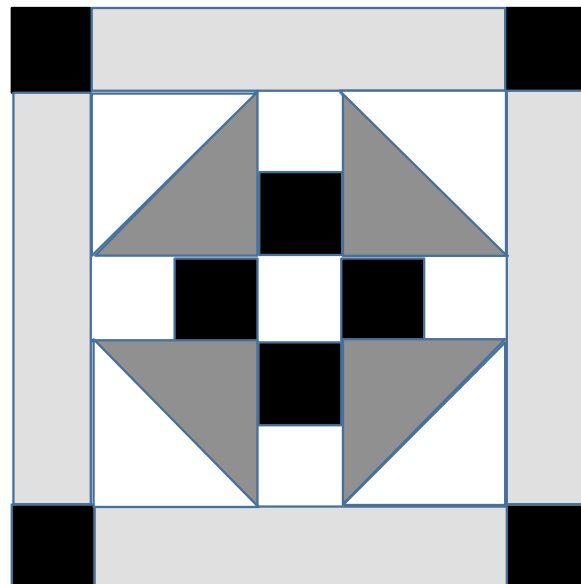
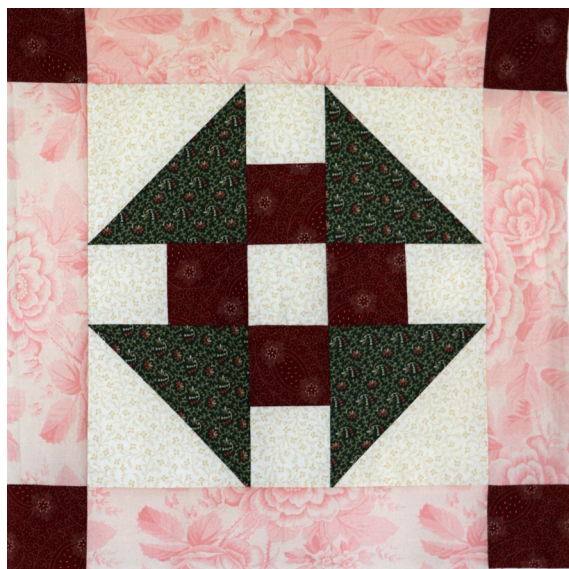
Medium Light Fabric

ASSEMBLY:

Put a light fabric 4-7/8" square and dark fabric 4-7/8" square right sides together. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the light fabric. Stitch ¼" on each side of the line. Cut on the diagonal line. Make two of these. You will have 4½" square triangles. Sew another dark fabric 2½" square on the ends of two medium light 2 ½" x 10 ½" rectangles. This will make the first and fifth rows. Sew together a light fabric 2½" square to another dark fabric 2½" square together. Sew these squares between two half-square triangles. Repeat, again. Sew the middle row together (five squares): light fabric 2½" square to dark fabric 2½" square to light fabric 2½" square to dark fabric 2½" square to light fabric 2½" square. Sew row two (half square triangles with light and another dark squares) to row three (five light/dark squares) to row four (half square triangles with light and another dark squares). Sew on each side a medium light fabric 2½" x 10½" rectangles. Sew the first and fifth rows on last to finish the 14½" square.
