Sherry Werum: *Mosaics and the Quilts They Inspire*

The lecture will take you on a journey from the early American Indian basket patterns in mosaics through the rule of the Moors in Andalusia and the mosaics of the Alhambra palace and on to Italy with the marble mosaics of Pisa and Venice. The similarities of these mosaics to popular quilting patterns are displayed through quilt replicas of these early mosaics and antique and modern-day adaptations. We continue on to the first-century mosaics of Ephesus, Turkey. You won't want to miss Sherry's reproduction of the wall paintings of Thera dating back to 1650 B.C. www.mosaicque.com



November 9 Workshop

This class includes instruction using C&T's new washaway fusible applique sheets, woven tumbling block pattern, monofilament thread machine applique, stencil machine quilting and use of decorative machine stitches. There may be a kit fee.

SBCC Continuing Education Quilters Workshop Charity Quilts Class

Quilters Workshop – Charity Quilts is a class offered by SBCC Continuing Education Quilting Instructor, Marty Frolli. In this class, quilters work only on quilted items that will be donated to designated local charities. Items may include lap and bed quilts for Hospice patients, doll bedding for cradles for the Unity Shoppe and Christmas stockings for Hillside House.

This section of Quilters Workshop is offered to the student free of charge. Tuition fees are covered by individual and corporate contributions. There are no materials fees. Fabrics and supplies are furnished by individuals, local businesses and by the Coastal Quilters Guild.

The next scheduled class begins Monday, January 14, 2013. Class will be held 9 a.m. to noon, in Room 18 at the Wake Center. Class limit is set at 30, although additional students will be considered. Students register for the class online through SBCC Continuing Education beginning Monday, December 17, 2012.

Individuals and corporations are asked to support this endeavor with contributions. Funds of \$1,800 to \$2,500 are needed each quarter to support the class. Costs variance reflects the number of weeks in the quarter.

2013 Challenge: Judging a Book by Its Cover

The 2013 Challenge event has been scheduled for June 2013. As stated above, the Challenge theme is: Judging a Book By Its Cover. If you are like me, you need plenty of time to percolate an idea, so this announcement is coming to you seven months in advance!

Here are some of the important criteria:

- Quilt design must be inspired by the cover of a book (quilt books excluded) but not be an exact replica of the book. You could be inspired by the color, graphics, title or anything else you find on the cover. We hope to NOT have 50 quilts in "shades of grey."
- The quilt must include a "recognizable amount" of the selected fabric (see photo), which features a navy blue background with colorful book spines forming circular designs. The exact amount of fabric that must be used will be determined and announced later. Fat quarters of the fabric will be available for sale at the guild meetings for \$2. If you need to have the fabric mailed to you, please add \$1 and send your request to me at 980 Via Regina, SB, CA 93111.
- You will need to submit a full-size (book size), color copy or photo of the book cover that inspires your quilt, to be displayed alongside your quilt on the night of the Challenge.
- The quilt size cannot exceed 120" perimeter (for example, 30" x 30" or 20" x 40"). It cannot be smaller than 36" perimeter (9" x 9" or 8" x 10"). For those who haven't studied geometry in a while, perimeter is the entire measurement of the outside edge of the quilt – all sides.



Stay tuned for more updates as some of these rules may be clarified and modified as we determine the *need*. For now head to the bookstore or library and start getting inspired!

Tammie has developed software that will take your photo, change it into a pattern using a variety of geometric shapes and provide coloration for each shape. She will share how to follow her pattern and make beautiful quilts. Tammie's lecture is funny, entertaining, informative and inspiring. This quilt is based on that art form. It is an easy, fun and highly successful way to create a beautiful and unique art quilt. Even if you are not interested in art quilts, taking classes expands your skills, provides new experiences in fabric and gives you an appreciation for the media. Besides, it is a lot of fun.

From the President's Desk

I was recently asked by a friend, "Why do you quilt?" While the question seems simple, the answer is multi-layered. I love fabric and am attracted to the many colors, patterns and textures manufactured, it would seem, for my visual and tactile pleasure.

When I sew clothing, my focus is on constructing a nicely fitted garment. Quilting, however, satisfies a desire to explore color and design with fabric as the medium, where visual impact is my main concern. This way of thinking about quilting applies whether the quilt will hang on the wall or be used for warmth.

The utility of quilts and their place in our lives is another draw for me. While constructing a quilt I imagine the pleasure it will bring to the intended recipients who will hang it on their wall, throw it over their sofa or sleep under it.

The most truthful answer to this question, however, is that I like the way I feel when I am working on a quilt. The process of designing, cutting and sewing is exciting, joyful and, at times, challenging. I revel in the emotions I experience during the act of creation that is quiltmaking, and finishing a quilt is profoundly satisfying. When I am piecing, appliquéing, quilting or binding a quilt I feel; and for me, feeling is everything.

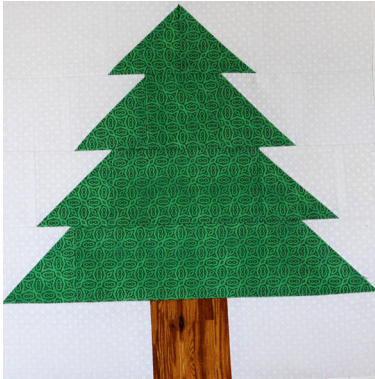

Block of the Month for December

CHRISTMAS TREE BLOCK

"Jingle bells, jingle bells, jingle all the way!" Let's make snow with white fabric, the boughs of the tree in fabulous green(s), and sturdy trunk in a dark brown. Once your tree is standing tall, you can decorate your beautiful Christmas tree with bells, beads, buttons, or ribbons. Don't forget the special ornament on top or Santa's presents underneath.



FABRIC



White fabric (Background)



Green(s) (tree)



Brown (trunk)

CUTTING

- Cut 4 – 2⁷/₈" squares – White
- Cut 4 – 2⁷/₈" squares – Green
- Cut 2 – 2¹/₂" x 1¹/₂" rectangle - White
- Cut 1 – 2¹/₂" square - Green & Brown
- Cut 2 – 2¹/₂" squares – White
- Cut 2 – 2¹/₂" x 3¹/₂" rectangle – White
- Cut 1 – 2¹/₂" x 4¹/₂" rectangle – Green
- Cut 2 – 2¹/₂" x 4¹/₂" rectangle – White
- Cut 1 – 2¹/₂" x 6¹/₂" rectangle – Green

ASSEMBLY:

Place green & white 2⁷/₈" squares together. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the white fabric. Stitch ¼" on each side of the diagonal line. Cut on the diagonal line. Trim the 8 half squares to 2¹/₂" squares.

First row: Stitch a 2¹/₂" x 3¹/₂" White rectangle – 2 half squares & a 2¹/₂" x 3¹/₂" White rectangle together.

Second row: Stitch a 2¹/₂" square-White -1 half square – a 2¹/₂" square-Green – 1 half square - a 2¹/₂" square-White together.

Third row: Stitch a 2¹/₂" x 1¹/₂" rectangle-White – 1 half square – a 2¹/₂" x 4¹/₂" rectangle-Green – 1 half square - a 2¹/₂" x 1¹/₂" rectangle-White together.

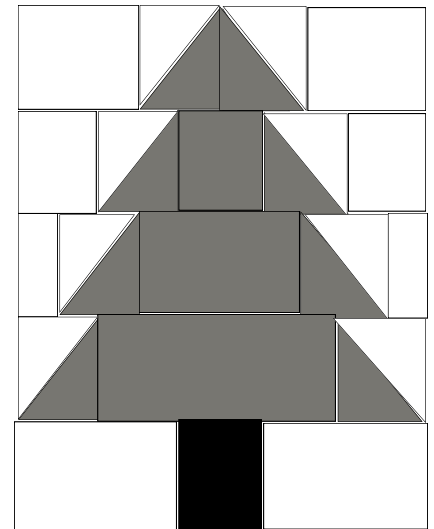
Fourth row: Stitch 1 half square – a 2¹/₂" x 6¹/₂" rectangle-Green - 1 half square together.

Fifth row: Stitch a 2¹/₂" x 4¹/₂" rectangle-White – a 2¹/₂" square-Brown - a 2¹/₂" x 4¹/₂" rectangle-White together.

Stitch rows 1 thru Row 5, making a 10¹/₂" unfinished square.

Please, go to the BOM tab on our CQG website to view the block for placement.
