patterns: The Lety bag, The Little Lety and the Easy Peasy Grommet Bag. One pattern is included in the registration fee and students may purchase the other two if they wish to make (or have time for) all three bags.

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Library Renovation

The Library Committee has been working hard to make the guild's book resources more accessible to members. It was difficult to find anything in our book crates because they were so densely packed, while some of our more vertically challenged members found it difficult to see into the crates at all. Yet moving the crates to the table was beyond the physical capacity of the people volunteering to be librarians.

If you visited the library during the February meeting, you might have noticed that these problems have been remedied. The committee took a multi-pronged approach: First, we firmly pruned our library to weed out double copies and books we considered to be out-of-date while maintaining an array of books for all the various aspects of guilting. Secondly, we pulled some books together in categories such as appliqué, hand and machine guilting, art guilts, children's guilts and wearables. And third, we invested in new boxes that are lower. They are also narrower, so that the whole alphabet of our general quilting books fit across the two carts. The books in categories are lighter and easy to move from the lower shelves of the carts to the table. Thus we also doubled the linear space available to access the library. All of this should make using the library more pleasant for everyone. Very soon we will also have the entire contents of our library listed on the guild's website so that you can come to meetings prepared with a list of books to borrow.

We continue to welcome donations to the library. We select a few books from donations to become part of the library; the rest - along with those books removed from the library provide the opportunity to offer great books at low prices during our book sales, which help us to buy the latest and best books as library additions.

However, none of us are well versed (yet) on what the latest and best might be, so we really need your guidance. If there are books you would like to see in our library, please tell us! We aim to please, so come see come see us in the back of the meeting room.

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2013 Challenge: Judging a Book by Its Cover

The 2013 Challenge event is scheduled for June 13, 2013. Quilt entries will need to be turned in at the May Guild meeting, which means you only have two more months to construct your masterpiece.

Please read the following; some of the guidelines have been modified.

- Quilt design must be **inspired by the cover of a book** (quilt books excluded) but not be an exact replica of the book. You could be inspired by the color, graphics, title or anything else you find on the cover. Remember that if you recreate the cover of the book exactly, you may be required to obtain permission from the artist.
- The quilt **must be three layers and quilted** by hand or machine.
- The quilt must include a recognizable amount of the selected fabric (see photo), which features a navy blue background with colorful book spines forming circular designs. The exact amount of fabric that must be used is up to you, but must meet the recognizable requirement. Due to limitations of availability, the maximum amount of fabric sold to each applicant will be one fat quarter.
 - The qualifying fabric must be used in the body of the quilt – using as the binding or backing do not count as meeting the fabric challenge.
 - Fat quarters of the fabric will be available for sale at the guild meetings for \$2. If you need to have the fabric mailed to you, please add \$1 and send your request to me at 980 Via Regina, SB, CA 93111.



You will need to submit a full-size (book size), color copy or photo of the book cover that inspires your quilt, to be displayed alongside your quilt on the night of the Challenge.

Note change in size requirement!

- The quilt size cannot exceed 140" perimeter (for example, 30" x 40" or 25" x 35"). It cannot be smaller than 36" perimeter (9" x 9" or 8" x 10"). For those who haven't studied geometry in a while, perimeter is the entire measurement of the outside edge of the quilt on all sides.
- The quilt, application form and photocopy of book will need to be submitted prior to the guild meeting on or before June 13, 2013. The exact date and location of drop-off will be announced at a later time.

Stay tuned for more updates as some of these rules may be clarified and modified as we determine the *need*. For now head to the bookstore or library and start getting inspired!

Block of the Month for March **SHADOW BLOCK**

The shamrock is a three-leaved old white clover. It's the symbol of Ireland with St. Patrick using it as a metaphor of the Christian trinity when christianizing Ireland in the 5th century. Since the 18th century the shamrock has been used as the symbol of Ireland. On St. Patricks' Day, the shamrock is worn on the lapels in Ireland as well as other countries. In our stash, lucky scraps of green are there to be plucked and assembled into your shamrock block.

FA	BRIC	

CUTTING

Scrap – Any color	 Cut 1 – 7¹/₂" – Scrap square (A)
White fabric	 Cut 2 – 1½" – White squares (B) Cut 1 – 2½" x 8½" – White rectangle (E) Cut 1 – 2½" x 10½" – White rectangle (F)
Black	 Cut 1- 6½" x 1½"- Black rectangle (C) Cut 1 - 7½" x 1½" - Black rectangle (D)

ASSEMBLY:

- Sew B to C 1.
- 2. Sew B to D
- 3. Sew B/C to A – See diagram
- 4. Sew B/D to A – See diagram
- Sew E to B/C side See diagram 5.
- 6. Sew F to B/D side – See diagram


