The 2013 Challenge is HERE! We have almost three dozen quilts for you to see and appreciate! Our meeting this month will begin promptly at 6:30 with a parade of the Challenge quilts. The quilts will be paraded by volunteers, not the quilt makers to keep that part anonymous until the end. After the parade, there will be a long break for you to view the quilts more closely. Be sure to pick up your ballot at the front desk as you enter and sign in.



We will try to have enough pencils on hand, but it wouldn't hurt to bring one along with you. Please note that guests are free and will be allowed to vote along with our general membership.

We will be asking our voters to look at the quilts and judge them according to the following criteria. Prizes will be awarded in each of these categories:

- Overall Favorite – Your personal favorite
- Best Overall Interpretation of Challenge Theme – based on the color and design of the quilt and in comparison to the Challenge inspiration book (and not necessarily a replica of the cover)
- Best Interpretation Based on Graphics – based on the graphics shown on the Challenge inspiration book
- Best Interpretation Based on Color – based on the colors shown on the Challenge inspiration book

- Best Use of Challenge Fabric
- Most Humorous

We will explain these categories more at the June meeting, but please contact us if you have any questions. We hope you are all ready for a great Challenge show!

We are looking for six to eight volunteers to help with parading and hanging the quilts as well as tallying votes that evening. Please contact us if you are interested in helping. Otherwise, we might be calling you!

## From the President's Desk

As I write, there are still several open positions in the quilt guild leadership. Each of these jobs takes less than a couple of hours per month outside of the guild meeting and helps us to maintain existing services. We are looking for a **Recording Secretary**, **Refreshments Coordinator**, and **Satellite Group Coordinator**. Please read these job descriptions and see if you would be willing to take on this position to help your guild function.

The **Recording Secretary** takes minutes at the guild and board meetings, emails them to the board, corrects them, and submits final copies which are published on the website.

The **Refreshments Coordinator** solicits satellite groups or individual members to bring refreshments to the guild meetings. Paper products such as cups, napkins, and plates are purchased on the guild's behalf and assistance is rendered to members bring refreshments.

The **Satellite Group Coordinator** organizes new satellite groups for interested members and has occasional meetings with satellite group representatives to get updates on the groups' status and coordinate activities.

If there are no volunteers for the position of Recording Secretary, then board members will each take a turn filling the position for a month. If the Refreshments Coordinator is not filled, then we will assume that this is not a priority for members and refreshments will not be served at the meetings.

## Coastal Quilters August Craft & Fabric Sale

On Saturday, August 10, the Coastal Quilters will be holding a sale at the side parking lot of the Goleta Valley Community Center. This sale will be open to the public. This is a fundraiser for the guild in place of the auction that we have had several times in the last few years.

This sale will give members of our guild the opportunity to sell their overstock or unwanted fabric and craft items in an environment that will be promoted to the public and like-minded sewers, quilters and crafters. Those members will purchase for a space for \$25 (and \$10 table if desired) and will keep the proceeds of their sale for themselves.

For those members who don't want to have their own space but have items they no longer have use for, the guild will accept donated items to sell in the guild space as a fundraiser. Our community projects committee will be bundling some of the overflow fabric in the Community Projects closet for sale in the guild space as well.

The best part is that it gives our guild and members of the community an opportunity to come and shop for craft and sewing items at bargain prices! The auction has always been a place to purchase additional fabric for new projects and this sale will offer the same opportunity!

Signups for space will start at the June meeting near the library area. More information will also be available at the signup table and Irelle will be available to answer questions. We will also have a signup sheet for volunteers to help with the guild space. We will need LOTS of help!

If you have donations ready, they will be accepted at the June and July guild meetings. Please bring your donation items "ready for sale." This includes marking the number of yards or size of the piece if it is fabric or bundling smaller items in Ziploc bags. We appreciate your assistance in this preparation.

This should be a great event for the guild. We hope to see you there!

## Opportunity at the International Quilt Festival

**International Quilt Festival/Long Beach, CA will be August 2-4, 2013, with preview on the 1st at the Long Beach Convention Center**

The show promoters are looking for workers to help hang the special exhibit quilts before Festival, guardians to watch over the quilts during Festival, door persons to take tickets, and workers to help with take down of special exhibit quilts after the show is closed. These are paid positions (\$8 an hour). We also pay for parking (up to \$10) and you receive free entry for each day you work (a \$10 value). If your guild does not have an opportunity quilt, members can work to earn money for the guild and still receive free entry and parking. The money will be combined and one check will be written to the guild.

For those of you who may have intended, but have simply forgotten, to bring items to guild meetings, don't despair of having them languish in your linen closet forever: OUR NEED FOR THESE ITEMS IS ONGOING, so simply bring them to me at any regular guild meeting and I will gladly ensure that they are delivered.

*For those of you have asked, these are the items we can definitely use:*

- Blankets (used as middles)
- Electric blankets (used as middles after wiring is removed; second-hand stores will NOT take them from you)
- Mattress pads (used as middles)
- Flannel sheets (used as middles or backings, depending upon weight)
- Regular sheets (used as backings)

# Block of the Month 2013-14: EVERYBODY IS A STAR

For next year, Block of the Month will feature different star patterns. If you make two blocks each month and turn one in, you'll have 12 blocks at the end of the year to fashion a star sampler quilt of your own. For July we start with a simple block in patriotic colors: red, white and blue.

## July's Block: Party Hats

### FABRIC

 White (or Light) Background Fabric

 Red Fabric

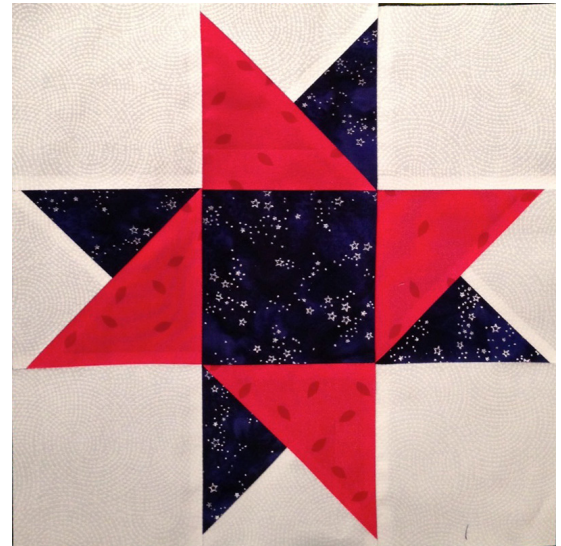
 Blue Fabric

### CUTTING

A - Four squares 4 1/2" x 4 1/2"  
 B - One square 5 1/4" x 5 1/4" cut twice diagonally

C - Two squares 4 7/8" x 4 7/8" cut once diagonally

A - One square 4 1/2" x 4 1/2"  
 B - One square 5 1/4" x 5 1/4" cut twice diagonally



### ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS:

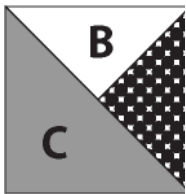
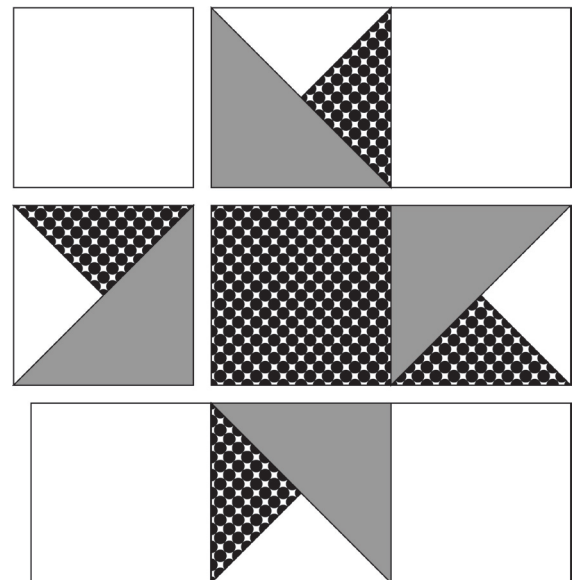


Diagram 1  
 Make 4

**Step 1.** Sew blue triangle to white triangle as show in Diagram 1, then sew red triangle to blue-and-white piece to form a pieced-square sub unit. Make four of these.

**Step 2.** Referring to Assembly Diagram, turn pieced-square sub units to form star. Layout pieced-square sub units, background squares, and blue square to form rows and sew together. Then sew rows together to form a block. Finish size: 12" x 12"
